## AYDIN gazete is no more!

During the span of over 40 years I have seen many newspapers closing down due to one reason or another. I did have a chance to write a column about quite a few of them.

But it is the first time that I have to write a column about the newspaper which I personally started publishing and now find it almost impossible to continue publishing.

**So my very dear AYDIN gazete is no more.**

I remember last year, when I got

crazy about publishing a newspaper of my own. Almost every day I was struggling to find a way to start it. It was never easy, particularly for a person like me who is already terribly busy in more than one field at the same time. But I was determined to start it.

With a very very meagre amount to invest, I made it a one man show. I have always been a "one man show" in almost every field that I am in, and so was this newspaper adventure too. Indeed it was not easy. But I was everything in this newspaper, from collection of news to designing and page making to distribution.

It was an unforgettable day of my life, when I got the first issue of AYDIN gazete printed in Turkish in my hand. It was 1st April 2018. It was a remarkable moment indeed, that I will never forget

Almost all of my friends in the news media had advised me to go for an online newspaper instead of getting it printed because of the high cost involved. But I belong to that generation who were brought up with smelling that peculiar aroma of the paper and ink, while reading a newspaper. For me, even today, a newspaper which you cannot hold in your hand is not a newspaper.

But the reality of time has changed.

More and more newspapers are now being published online. The new generation is getting used to the online newspapers.

But I continued publishing the printed newspaper for a few weeks, only to find myself losing all of the finance that I had. So there was no more choice for me but to stop. It was a difficult decision to take, but I had had to accept the reality.

At that moment Chris Elliott entered into picture and offered to publish the AYDIN gazete online, with the CyprusScene.com online E.newspaper and start publishing Aydin gazete online.

But the old man inside me, did not want me to do that. The old man inside me still wanted to smell the ink and the paper. The old man inside me did not like the online newspaper. I tried to convince him, but failed. In the end, I accepted what the old man inside me knew I needed to do.

The result is that the AYDIN gazete is now no more.

You friends will not find it anymore and also in future it will not be found alongside the CyprusScene.com e-newspaper.

I am still attached to CyprusScene as before and will continue writing for it and hope you dear readers will continue supporting me.

## Özersay speaks on CNN Türk

Stating that the Turkish Cypriot side would never take steps to warm up the waters in the Eastern Mediterranean Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay said that our intention is “not to warm up the water but rather to cool down the water”.

Indicating that they are taking into account other developments in the region with the Republic of Turkey, Özersay took part in a televised program on CNN Türk.

Özersay said that as long as the Greek Cypriot side continues to take unilateral steps in the Eastern Mediterranean region on the natural gas issue, the Turkish Cypriot side would take steps that would balance this.

Explaining that it seemed highly likely that the Greek Cypriot side will try and carry out drilling in block 10 before the end of this year, Özersay said that if drilling efforts are conducted then the Turkish Cypriot side, in line with its agreement with the Turkish Petroleum Corporation, will start drilling in similar areas.

Özersay said: “The Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus will carry out this excavation through a company. What we do is not much different to what they do. What we will do is to be active in the field and protect our rights”.

Also touching upon the Cyprus issue, Özersay evaluated the UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres’ Cyprus Report.

Özersay said that although there are six chapters of the talks, the Greek Cypriot side is trying to create a perception that the talks failed because of security and guarantees issues.

Touching upon the content of the thesis, which the Greek Cypriots presented as a loose federation, Özersay said that what the Greek

Cypriot side is actually trying to say is that they are not ready to share power with us within the framework of political equality, and it bothers them as Greek Cypriots. ‘So let’s share less power. Let there be more power in the wings, and less power in the Central Federal Government. This can be described as a loose federation’ the Greek Cypriots say.



## G.C. side in black list of OECD



The Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development stated there are 21 countries which have created obstacles for the work of the Organisation, to prevent tax evasion, by giving citizenship or permanent residence. It was stated that the Greek Cypriot side has been included in the black list.

The Paris based Organisation stated that 21 countries are included in the black list for taking less tax from the financial assets

abroad and giving permanent residence to some people.

In the report, it was noted that citizenship has turned into a bargaining condition which costs 3 billion dollars. According to the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development, second citizenship can be abused by the ones who want to conceal their properties abroad, and causes concern between politicians, security organisations and intelligence units.

## Political equality is sine-qua-non

“It does not matter if the federation has a strong centre or strong wings in Cyprus, political equality is our sine-qua-non “said Prime Minister Tufan Erhürman.

Erhürman stated that they want the Cyprus problem to be solved with a fair and permanent formula based on political equality because such a solution will contribute to the national economy and open the way for business people and the public.

Erhürman who went to the Mersin Province of Turkey as a guest of the Silifke Chamber of Commerce and Industry made a speech at the "Leadership Academy and Strategy Workshop".

Erhürman indicated that nowadays there is a dynamism in the Cyprus issue, yet where are they going to reach is not known and he continued:

“Recently, Anastasiades' new proposal is not a strong centred federation but a federation which has strong wings, in other words strong constituent states. Why? Because he cannot explain to his people about the issue of political equality. We say that political equality is essential whether there is a federation with a strong centre or strong wings in Cyprus. You should explain this to your people Mr. Anastasiades.”

Prime Minister Erhürman made a statement to the press and said that "as soon as the two leaders say ok, the transition begins," at the political level, we are ready to start the transition at both border crossing points.



## Akinci received Talat

President Mustafa Akinci met with 2nd President Mehmet Ali Talat. According to the information given by the Presidency, Akinci and Talat exchanged views about the latest developments in the Cyprus issue. The Cyprus report which was delivered by the United Nations Secretary-General Guterres to the Security Council was also discussed at the meeting at 11.00 yesterday (17th October) at the Presidency.



## Foreign Affairs Commission

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay has informed the Foreign Affairs Commission of the Turkish Grand National Assembly regarding "TRNC and Regional Developments".

Minister Özersay stated that Cyprus issues being discussed at the first meeting of the Foreign Affairs Commission has great importance. Noting that the members of the Commission will have meetings on very different platforms in the following process, Özersay said that Turkish Cypriots have been

excluded from the world therefore it is very important to convey our messages, demands and sensitivities through the members of the Commission.

Özersay said "As the TRNC, we want to look at the future confidently. I want to stress sincerely once more that the relation between Turkey and the TRNC will continue as two seriously allied countries and we will shape our foreign policy with Turkey which is always a strategic partner and supporter of the TRNC".

## Akinci evaluates Guterres report

President Mustafa Akinci stated that he will be glad to listen if Anastasiades has any new opinions at the meeting which he hopes may be held soon but added that if the solution is a federal partnership state, the active participation of the parties will be unavoidable in the jointly used authorities.

In his statement yesterday, Akinci shared his views concerning the report

on Cyprus which has been delivered to the Security Council by the UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres.

Stating that he discussed the report in detail with the negotiating team, Akinci said: "The Secretary-General said in his report that the status quo in Cyprus is not sustainable and that a permanent solution is needed. In addition, it is important to underline that he said the negotiations, which

cannot reach any conclusion and never come to an end, failed and that a solution can only be achieved with a result-oriented approach and in a visible future."

Indicating that re-assignment of Lute by the Secretary-General also took place as an important issue in the report, Akinci said that his views on the modalities are also widely reflected in the report.



## Özersay: "Natural wealth should be used in cooperation"



Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay attended a symposium entitled "Law and Policy in the Eastern Mediterranean" at Ankara University with his counterpart Çavuşoğlu within the framework of his working visit to Ankara.

In his speech at the symposium, expressing that the issue of natural gas

in the Eastern Mediterranean has been referred to in the Cyprus report of Guterres, Özersay said that the following process will show the sincerity of the international community and whether they desire cooperation in the Eastern Mediterranean or not.

Adding that they wish for the ending of refugee problems and humanitarian crisis in the Eastern Mediterranean,

Özersay stressed that natural wealth should be used in cooperation.

Furthermore, stressing that economic cooperation and mutual dependence can decrease the risk of conflict in the region, Özersay said "Definitely, there is need for dialogue and vision. I believe that, in the following period, we will succeed in this together and especially with the Republic of Turkey".

## Özersay and Çavuşoğlu held joint press conference

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay held a joint press conference with Turkish Foreign Minister Mevlüt Çavuşoğlu.

In his speech at the press conference, Özersay said that they have had consultations regarding the future of the

Cyprus Island and the hydrocarbon wealth in the Eastern Mediterranean.

Referring to the report by Guterres, Özersay underlined that the Secretary-General "had made realistic evaluations." He also pointed to the necessity of maintaining dialogue. Both

sides need to have common vision and aim for the future. We always stress this.

In his speech Turkish Foreign Minister Cavusoğlu said that they evaluated the latest situation related to the negotiations after Crans-Montana and what they have to do about the exploration of natural gas reserves in the island and what can be done against unilateral steps being taken.

Pointing out that recently some countries have established triple and quadruple contacts with the Greek Cypriot side, Cavusoğlu said that they evaluated how they can protect the rights and interests of Turkey and the TRNC against these.

Stressing that it was important that the UN Secretary General did not insist on any state or solution model in his report Cavusoğlu said that they will

respond to the unilateral steps taken related to hydrocarbon issue in the Eastern Mediterranean and the timing of this was also discussed at the meeting.

Cavusoglu said: "Turkey has been repeatedly stressing that Turkish Cypriots have rights to the resources around the area and rejecting the Greek Cypriot Administration's unilateral drilling activity in the Eastern Mediterranean. We shall never regret to take steps in order to protect the rights and interests of Turkey and the Turkish Cypriot side. We want a permanent solution and peace.

Turkey has shown this to the whole world from the beginning not only with her statements but with her steps as well. We shall do whatever is necessary for the solution in the following process as well."

## We should not be trapped in negotiation process with word games

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay made a statement to Turkish News Agency regarding the concept of a loose federation which was brought to the agenda by the Greek Cypriot leadership.

In his statement, Özersay mentioned that the Greek Cypriot leadership might be trying to imprison the Turkish Cypriot side and the United Nations in the same vicious and fruitless negotiation process, with a loose federation concept that will essentially not change much at all.

“Any idea could be unofficially discussed however if we were deceived by a loose federation or similar wordplay in the presence of the UN we might fall into the trap of resuming the negotiations from

where they left off. Therefore, the Turkish Cypriot side should be careful on this” he said.

“If the Greek Cypriot side try to ignore the effective participation of Turkish Cypriots in decisions and the rotating presidency then its efforts are useless. It is a waste of time to negotiate a share-based partnership without a mentality change” Özersay added.

“The origin of the problem is the Greek Cypriot leadership’s denial to share the governance and richness with us. In fact, the federation is a model which is based on the sharing of governance and richness.

If they cannot overcome their problem of not sharing, in other words if they cannot make a

change in their mentality then there is no meaning in insisting on a share-based model. The Greek Cypriot leadership first used the concept of loose federation and then stressed that through this model less participation of the Turkish Cypriots in the decision making process will be possible. In

summary, it’s been said that “let’s give less authority to the federal state and you should compromise on effective participation in the decision making which is a sine qua non for the political equality of the Turkish Cypriot people. Of course this is not possible and it is trickery” Özersay said.



## Çavuşoğlu: "We will continue our drilling in Cyprus"

Turkish Foreign Minister Mevlüt Çavuşoğlu and Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay spoke at the symposium organized in the Faculty of Political Sciences at

Ankara University entitled “Law and Politics in the Eastern Mediterranean”.

Stating that Turkey will continue drilling around the island of

Cyprus, Turkish Foreign Minister Mevlüt Çavuşoğlu said: "Our concern is not to fight with anyone, rather we want rightful sharing of the wealth.

negotiated within the scope of the negotiations on the Cyprus issue, Çavuşoğlu said: “There might be bi-zonal or any other federal solution.

Indicating that they would not allow unilateral work on the Cyprus issue, Çavuşoğlu emphasized that they had to protect the rights of the Turkish Cypriot people with their active steps.

We are open to all kinds of ideas. As a result, we need to reach a political settlement with diplomacy and peaceful negotiations.

"On one hand, we will do our drilling in the exclusive economic zone of Turkey, on the other hand, upon the invitation of TRNC, we will also continue this drilling in TRNC's maritime jurisdiction areas and the exclusive economic zone around the island” Çavuşoğlu said.

Pointing out the need for a clear determination of what was to be

## No positive answer to call

Minister of Economy and Energy Özdil Nami said that he had called his counterparts on the Greek Cypriot side many times to make cooperation on the issue of energy but he never received a positive answer to his calls.

Answering the questions of a TAK correspondent regarding the economy and agenda, Minister Nami said that there are very important developments around the island of Cyprus which can affect the future of the country, and the issue of natural gas takes first place. Stressing that as the Ministry of Economy and Energy, they have been following the issue closely with their collocutors in Turkey, Nami said "We made calls to our contacts on the Greek

Cypriot side on the issue of both electricity and natural gas. Unfortunately, we have not had any positive answer up to now. The Greek Cypriot side preferred to take steps unilaterally so the Turkish Cypriot side had to take their own steps. The Greek Cypriot side has made agreements with American, French and Italian companies so we, as the Turkish Cypriot side, took the same step with Turkey".

Noting that there should be no doubts that they will continue to protect the rights and interests of the Turkish Cypriot people on the issue, Nami said that the necessary steps have been taken in cooperation with Turkey and will continue to be taken.



## Akinci meets with Özersay

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay was received by President Mustafa Akıncı prior to his Ankara visit between the dates 15-17 October 2018 as a guest of Turkish Foreign Minister Mevlüt Çavuşoğlu. During the meeting, Akıncı and Özersay discussed the latest developments in Cyprus and they exchanged views.

Within the framework of his Ankara visit, Özersay will discuss opportunities for further developing the close cooperation

with Turkey, and the latest developments in Cyprus.

Furthermore, Özersay will inform the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the Grand National Assembly of Turkey about "TRNC and Regional Developments". Özersay will also meet with Minister of National Defence, Hulusi Akar, and attend the opening of a symposium on the issue of "Law and Policy in the Eastern Mediterranean" at Ankara University with Turkish Minister Çavuşoğlu.



## Prospects of talks remain alive

The UN Secretary-General Antonio Guterres stressed in his Cyprus report to the UN Security Council that prospects for a comprehensive settlement on the Island are still alive.

Guterres delivered the report to the UN Security Council following an investigation by his special temporary envoy Jane Holl Lute on the prospects of re-launch of talks on the Cyprus problem. Guterres made an evaluation that he believes that prospects for a comprehensive settlement between the communities on the island remain alive.

He also added that all Cypriots deserve a common future that one thing alone can bring: a lasting agreement achieved within a clear horizon.

He also referred to natural resources found in and around Cyprus, which, he said, "should benefit both communities and should provide a strong incentive for all concerned parties to work in earnest towards a mutually acceptable and durable solution."

The report will be discussed at the UN Security Council on October 30th.

## Work insistently and persistently

In his speech, Erhürman pointed out the current stage of Cyprus and the importance of hosting more than 400 sportsmen in the country.

Erhürman stressed "We will continue to work insistently and persistently".



## Parliamentary delegation in Geneva

Three MPs who participated in the General Assembly of the Inter-Parliamentary Union in Geneva, representing the TRNC Assembly, attended the "Cyprus Facilitators Group" meeting.

Republican Turkish Party Lefkoşa Deputy Fikri Toros, National Unity Party Gazimağusa Deputy Oğuzhan Hasipoğlu and People's Party Girne Deputy Erek Çağatay participated in the

meeting held within the framework of the General Assembly.

It was stated that at the meeting they exchanged views and discussed how to overcome the deadlock on the Cyprus issue after the negotiations in Crans-Montana and they put forward their intention that the negotiations should aim to be result-oriented and to conclude in a short period of time.



## 13th General Conference ISESCO

The Minister of National Education and Culture Cemal Özyiğit participated in the 13th General Conference of the Islamic Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (ISESCO), organized by ISESCO, which operates under the Organization of Islamic Cooperation in which the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) is an observer member.

The conference, which was attended by representatives and Ministers of Education, Science, Culture and Communication and the authorities of international organizations from 54 member countries and 3 observer member countries, was held at the ISESCO headquarters in Rabat, Morocco.

In his speech at the conference, Özyiğit gave information about the fields of education and culture in the TRNC.

Stating that the international character

and diversity of higher education is clearly visible in the TRNC, which has approximately 100,000 students from 145 different countries and academicians from 65 different countries, Özyiğit said that the number of scholarships granted to the students from the member states who want to study in TRNC's universities under the "Education Exchange Program" has increased from 10 to 20 in 2018, and he also added that the relationship in the higher education field could be further developed.

Özyiğit also exchanged views especially with the Minister of Culture and Communication of the Kingdom of Morocco, Mohamed Laaraj, ISESCO Director General, Abdulaziz Othman Altwajiri; and Minister of Culture of Azerbaijan Garayev Abulfas Mursal Oglu as well as the education and culture ministers of some member countries regarding the international exchange programs and the opportunities of higher education in our country.

## 16th Theatre Festival in Cyprus September 2018

The month of September is the month for our theatre festival, now for the 16th year. People are back from holidays; schools and universities have reopened their doors for students thirsty for knowledge, the weather should be back to comfortable temperatures and society is eager and ready for cultural entertainment. An event many of us are waiting for, theatre lovers, young and old.

Lefkoşa Municipality and its theatre company have been working for months to offer us an exciting programme again which was presented to us at a very nice party at the new Bandabuliya Stage Downtown Nicosia. This new stage has now been included into the

Festival Programme with two plays, while the other plays of the festival were as usual at the Atatürk Culture and Congress Hall at the Near East University in Nicosia.

This year we were given nine performances by five theatre companies. The festival started with our own theatre, the LBT - Lefkoşa Belediye Tiyatrosu - at the Bandabuliya Stage in Downtown Nicosia with a play by Anton Chekhov, directed by Aliye Ummanel, on two days.

The festival continued with two plays by the Bakirköy Belediye Tiyatrolari from Turkey, one by the playwright Ahmet Sami Özbudak, and the other by Ceren Erkan; plays of two different eras and each with different actors.

The next play was with Altıdan Sonra Tiyatro from Turkey with 'HE-GO' by Halil Babür, a three person piece performed again at the Bandabuliya Stage.

Back again at AKM at the NEU we saw 'The Dinner' by Herman Koch, a weird story, with the Semaver Kumpanya from Turkey and finally on the last day, on September 27th the Dostlar

Tiyatrosu with 'Göçmenleer' by the playwright Matei Visniec, with famous Genco Erkal – I have seen him play on other occasions.

All performances were fully booked; it was again a big success. The themes of the plays very interesting, with questions that arise for us every day, especially the last play about refugees, migration and immigration. I found the stage setting, the décor, quite intriguing in all plays. No sofas, no living rooms, no utensils of social surroundings, but symbols .... Light was a big factor and new ways of décor to support the acting; minimalism; body language and mimicry were the tools of acting, although the plays were very text intensive.

Altogether a great pleasure in the month of September. After a performance I enjoyed driving back home in my car over the mountain pass to Girne, leaning back in my seat and thinking about the play I saw, feeling good, feeling fulfilled, smiling.

I have taken many photos but will publish only three of each play on my website. Thank you to all involved.

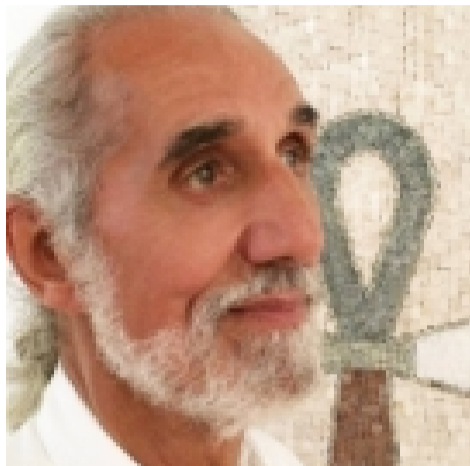
Since the restoration to become an art gallery, the building has been used on many occasions for exhibitions etc.

## The Idiot and the Odyssey – a 20 year MedTrek

In 2015 we met an extraordinary man, Joel Stratte-McClure, who has spent 20 years trekking around the Mediterranean and during this time he has written 3 books about his adventures, the last one being "The Idiot and the Odyssey III".

This last book takes readers from Greece through Turkey, Cyprus, Lebanon, Israel and Egypt to Tunisia in the footsteps of Alexander the Great and includes his time in Cyprus and makes very interesting and humorous reading. It was published in September 2018 and is available, together with the first two books by Joel Stratte-McClure, from Amazon.

Although I haven't read the first two volumes, or indeed the whole of Volume III, I have read the Cyprus coverage which I thoroughly enjoyed, especially being able to relate to many places Joel passed through in Northern Cyprus.

Joel's long time partner of over 20 years, Liz Chapin, has accompanied him on some parts of

his MedTrek and we were pleased to meet her when Joel started his walk in North Cyprus and we joined them in Dipkarpaz and enjoyed a nice meal at a very friendly restaurant, where the family insisted on us seeing the kitchen and food being prepared and cooked in the traditional oven.

Prior to this Chris had joined Joel and Liz, together with Michael and Viola de Glanville and he also joined in for a short part of the MedTrek near Kyrenia Castle. I am giving below an excerpt from Joel's book which refers to the involvement of Chris for a short time.

*"I'm a little worried about the walk east of Girne because Chris Elliott, the co-founder and chief editor of the "cyprusscene" website, told me, after he interviewed me about all things MedTrek, about the obstacles I'd face on the walk. "You won't be able to get around the new harbor, there are lots of fenced military installations, the hotels have tight security, there's a mosque and there are cliffs," he said. "You'll have to walk most of the way on the main road." "Well, if*

*that's the case, we might make a diversion to Bellapais and see the home where Lawrence Durrell lived while accumulating information for his book Bitter Lemons," I said, just to show Chris that I knew Durrell had written a book about life in Cyprus.*

*When Chris arrives at Michael's home, where we have been invited to stay (Thanks again, guys!), the next morning at 7:30 he takes five of us – himself, Liz, Michael, Viola*

*and me – on a drive to check out his aforementioned MedTrekking hazards before accompanying us to the start of the hike near the castle. Indeed, he was right. There is a new harbor, as well as lots of fenced military installations, hotels with tight security, a mosque and cliffs. "Shouldn't be a problem," I tell a skeptical Chris, who MedTreks a couple of kilometers with us. 'The path is the goal and we're in absolutely no hurry.'*

Though he makes one misstep into the water, Chris has an opportunity to witness us walking close to the sea, on rocks, on a narrow board across a stream and over fences before he leaves us, taking Liz and Viola with him. Then Michael and I are able to MedTrek the next 23 kilometers without once diverting from the sea (except for when we cut up to Michael's home for a fish/vegetable/rice/pure health lunch)."

Joel has a brilliant sense of humour and it was inevitable he would from time to time find himself in all types of predicaments and situations. One such incident happened in South Cyprus :

" I'd heard about the UK's Sovereign Base Area in Akrotiri, just after the Lady's Mile Beach, but when I arrive, I find a fairly simple fence with a hard-to-read sign and, on the other side, see a beach club with sunbathers and someone giving windsurfing lessons.

*It looks so casual and loose that I walk around the fence in the sea, say "G'day'to the sunbathers and continue unperturbed for 400 meters – until I encounter gun-toting army guards who call the military police.*

*As I put it in my blog: The Idiot mistakenly entered the British Royal Air Force Akrotiri base, which blocks access to the end of a peninsula west of Limassol,*

*because he couldn't read the small print on the sign and didn't let the fence, which extends only a short distance into the sea, bother him.*

*When stopped by gun-toting guards after walking 400 meters onto the base, he feigned ignorance, apologized, suggested a larger sign and a more serious fence, and was pleasantly escorted back onto Cypriot soil to resume the MedTrek after the military analyzed his*

*passport, questioned him, asked what he wrote on a piece of paper (I simply put "RAF/US"because there were some US troops among the windsurfers and sunbathers at the Beach Club), and said they would like to follow The Idiot."*

The way in which Joel has put this wonderful journey into words is very interesting, educational, and extremely funny in a lot of instances. I am sure I will get around to reading the whole of The Idiot and the Odyssey III very soon.

*"Sadly I am letting all friends know that Roy died yesterday. He had been very poorly for a long time with several admissions to hospital. He died of acute kidney failure."*

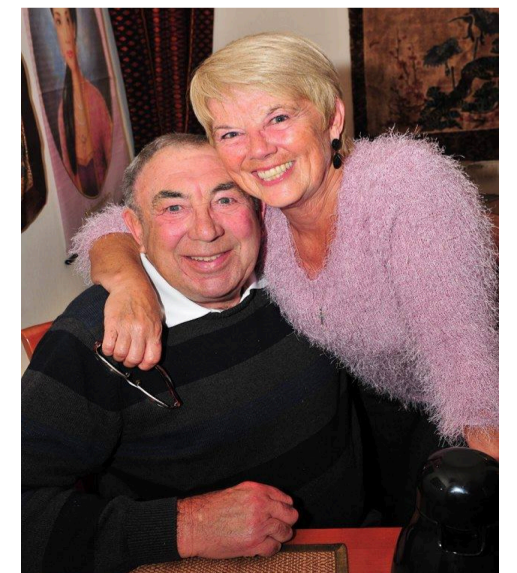
Roy was a big man in both stature and heart and was always wanting to help others where he could and this no doubt came from his

Despite a brave battling performance by Esentepe, they came away from Lefkoşa with nothing to show for it. For long periods of the second half the “Scorpions” had the Champions reeling on the ropes but they could not deliver that fatal “sting” in the end.

On paper and in the record books it will show that Yenicami won 3-1 a comfortable victory you would have thought. What it does not show is a fighting determined performance from Esentepe. It wasn't until injury time that the Champions and current League leaders could at least breathe more easily as they were given the fright of their lives. The match was broadcast live on local TV Esentepe, they were meant to be the “sacrificial lambs”, but they came out of this contest with their heads held high and pride intact.

The Atatürk Stadium has never been a happy hunting ground for Esentepe and again in the end it lived up to its reputation.

On a very warm afternoon a rather disappointing crowd were seeking what shelter there was from the hot sun.

The Champions took the lead in the 16th minute through a simple goal scored by MEHMET ALTIN, who was put through on the left, he ran on unchallenged to beat goalkeeper Ali at his near post with a low shot. **1-0.**

26 minutes and it was 2-0 and another goal given away by Esentepe that should have been prevented. Centre



defender Moses instead of clearing the ball tried to pass to fellow defender Salih, JOHN EBUKA OKOYE nipped in to intercept the pass carried on to beat Ali. **2-0.**

Okoye nearly scored again in the 31st minute holding off challenges from Uğurcan and Moses only to fire just over the Esentepe bar

I must admit I was fearing the worst for Esentepe that heads would drop and the floodgates would open?.

Out of the blue skies Esentepe pulled a goal back in the 32nd minute with a first goal for his club scored by ODI HENRY CHIBUEZE. Esentepe forced a corner on the left which was taken by Kaan met at the far post by Yakup whose shot which was deflected onto the Yenicami crossbar by goalkeeper Ercan the ball rebounded down to ODI who managed to prod the ball in. Odi celebrated his goal in “Lua Lua” style with two triple back somersaults! **2-1.**

Urged on by their vociferous supporters Esentepe were pouring forwards and the Champions were left reeling and punch drunk by Esentepe attacks.

It wasn't until four minutes of injury time that Yenicami made the game safe when from a Hüseyin cross from the left it was deflected to the unmarked JOHN EBUKA OKOYE to score easily. **FULL TIME SCORE : 3-1.**

**SUMMING UP:** A brilliant team performance and I know I am a little biased but a draw would have been a fairer result. Yenicami can breath a huge sigh of relief they knew they have been put through the mincer, but at the end of the day Esentepe have 0 points to show for their efforts and Yenicami have 3 points. Esentepe really gave away two soft goals.

With 4 matches played this season I see nothing to frighten Esentepe, providing we show the same effort and commitment in every match, only for a 10 minute spell against Gençlik Gücü have we looked out of our depth.

Man of the match for Esentepe for me was young YAKUP SEN who had another magnificent game in midfield, closely followed by striker Odi who chased everything and again was a handful to the Yenicami defence. Everybody contributed in their own way to a good team performance.
