Prime Minister Tufan Erhürman spoke to CNN Türk

Erhürman: “If the Greek Cypriot leader continues his current stance, solution is not possible”

Within the framework of his Ankara contacts, Prime Minister Tufan Erhürman spoke to CNN Türk and explained the latest developments of the Cyprus problem, relations with Turkey and the view of the Turkish Cypriot side regarding the negotiation process.

Stressing that the Turkish Cypriot side has no toleration for loss of time any more, Erhürman said that if the sides sit at the negotiation table, the process should be under the UN umbrella, on the basis of political equality, within a timeframe and result oriented.

Erhürman added that as long as the Greek Cypriot side plays with time, this passes to the advantage of the Greek Cypriots therefore the Greek Cypriot side continues playing with time.

Erhürman stressed that the Turkish Cypriot side can sit at the negotiation table for a result oriented solution process which is not open ended.

The Turkish Cypriot side has a very clear stance on the issue of political equality. The same views have been reflected in the UN reports as well.

Active participation is very important. No decision can be taken by excluding the Turkish Cypriot people, the will of the Turkish Cypriots will be reflected on the decisions.

Political equality is to share the authorities, responsibilities and wealth. The way to a solution passes from sharing.

A functional state is to reflect the decisions of both people with the will. Greek Cypriot leader Anastasiades should internalise political equality and sharing.

Özersay met with Irish and German Ambassadors



Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay met with Irish Ambassador Deirdre Ni Fhalluin and German Ambassador Franz Josef Krempt yesterday (13th February).

Minister Özersay said 'we will continue to work and make our voice heard by the international

actors on every possible platform'.

Özersay made a statement from his personal social media account after the two separate meetings and pointed out that they discussed the current situation regarding the Cyprus issue and had the chance to evaluate the problems faced by the European Union due to Brexit.

Özersay sends a condolence message to Iranian Foreign Minister

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay sent a sympathy message to the Foreign Minister of the Islamic Republic of Iran in respect of the terrorist attack in Sistan-Belucistan province.

Özersay expressed his sorrow for

the loss of several Iranian soldiers and wished mercy to those who lost their lives, quick recovery to the injured and heartfelt condolences to the Iranian people on behalf of his Ministry and the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus Government.

Greek Cypriot Leadership's staggering is most serious impediment

President Mustafa Akıncı recorded that the Greek Cypriot Leadership's staggering and stepping back from what they accepted previously and denying the basic parameters of political equality are the most serious impediments in front of a solution.

"There is a problem in Cyprus which has not been solved for many years and the search for a solution will continue because the status quo reserves dangers. The status quo is the main factor which keeps the Turkish Cypriots out of

the international law and results in our youngsters living in uncertainty for the future. Turkish Cypriot existence and identity are being eroded as the years pass and they face the risk of not being the subject in their own country. On the other hand the 'Republic of Cyprus', from which they have been excluded, is in the ownership of only the Greek Cypriot community and unjustly benefiting from being included in the UN and the EU with its internationally recognised identity. This situation cannot continue forever."



Erhürman met with Turkish Cypriots living in Ankara

Prime Minister Tufan Erhürman met with the Turkish Cypriots living in Ankara. During the meeting held at the Grand Ankara Hotel, Prime Minister Erhürman

informed the Turkish Cypriots living in Ankara about the latest developments of the Cyprus problem and also the developments in the TRNC.

Erhürman wanted the support of the Turkish Cypriots living abroad for investment and lobbying.

Erhürman said that as the government, they will work to reach a fair settlement which protects the rights of the Turkish Cypriots, for the social and economic development of the country and to make the TRNC visible in the international arena. Adding that the Turkish Cypriot side is against the resumption of

the negotiations from scratch, Erhürman said "If there is will, we can sit at the negotiation table for a result oriented solution process which is not open ended."

Stressing that the Turkish Cypriot side has no toleration for loss of time any more, Erhürman said that if the sides sit at the negotiation table, the process should be under the UN umbrella, on the basis of political equality, within a timeframe and result oriented.



Necessary steps in Eastern Mediterranean natural gas issue"

The Minister of Economy and Energy Özdil Nami said "We will protect the rights and interests of the Turkish Cypriots on the natural gas issue as in the other issues and we will take the necessary steps".

In his statement to the Anadolu Agency correspondent regarding the agenda, Nami said that the Greek Cypriot Administration continues natural gas exploration around the island unilaterally and, according to the agreement made with Turkey, Turkey's exploration vessel 'Fatih' will start drilling off the coast of the island in the

middle of February. Underlining that the Turkish Cypriot side made calls to the Greek Cypriot side many times to cooperate on the issue of energy, Nami said that the Greek Cypriot side has never

given a positive response so far.

Expressing the desire of the Turkish Cypriot side for cooperation with the Greek Cypriot side on the energy issue,

Nami said that it realises or not, that we as the Turkish Cypriot side will apply the strategic policies within the framework of the calendar agreed with Turkey.

Stressing that the whole world acknowledges that the Turkish Cypriot people also have rights on the natural gas explored around the island of Cyprus, Nami said that UN Secretary General Antonio Guterres' report and the statements of the USA also stressed that the natural resources to be found around the island belong to both communities."

Council of Ministers updated on Cyprus problem

President Akıncı informed the Council of Ministers on the latest developments in the Cyprus problem.

The meeting of the Council of Ministers under the presidency of President Akıncı lasted for 2 hours.

In his statement after the meeting, Akıncı indicated that they made evaluations with the

government following his contacts with the UN Secretary General's Temporary Envoy Jane Holl Lute and before the meeting he will have with the Greek Cypriot leader Anastasiades on 26 February, 2019.

Akıncı said that it was a very fruitful meeting and added that he will inform the Assembly on Tuesday 19 February, 2019 within the same framework.



Özersay : “How can Anastasiades say this more clearly?”



In his written statement, Özersay evaluated the statements of Anastasiades made last Sunday (10th February, 2019). Özersay said: “An understanding that tries to explain the political equality as

an inequality according to themselves does not pertain only to Mr. Anastasiades but it is the understanding of all previous Greek Cypriot leaders. Up to today, I have been at the same negotiation table with 5 different Greek Cypriot leaders and I have not seen any different approach.

Therefore, if someone says that we should wait for another Greek Cypriot President for a federal partnership, this will not be a realistic approach”.

Özersay added that he did not make this statement in the name of the government but indicated that this is his own observation and evaluation as a person who has taken place academically and actively in the Cyprus negotiation process for the last 20 years.

Erhürman visited Yildirim

Prime Minister Tufan Erhürman visited Speaker of the Turkish Grand National Assembly Binali Yıldırım.

Prime Minister Erhürman started his contacts with a visit to the Turkish Grand National Assembly where he met with the Speaker of

the Assembly Binali Yıldırım. Today Prime Minister will meet with Turkish Republic's Vice President Fuat Oktay and also will deliver a speech at the opening of the symposium entitled ‘The Past, Present and the Future of Ombudsman in the 6th Year’.



Özersay met with Mavroyannis

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay met with the Greek Cypriot Negotiator Andreas Mavroyannis.

Foreign Minister Özersay announced his meeting from his

personal social media accounts with a photograph and noted ‘I met with Greek Cypriot Negotiator Andreas Mavroyannis after a long time. We have to be in dialogue with all the parties with realistic approaches. We carry on working.’

Akinci and Anastasiades to meet on 26th February

President Mustafa Akıncı and Greek Cypriot leader Nikos Anastasiades will meet on Tuesday 26th February. The leaders will have an unofficial meeting at the residence of the UN Secretary General's Special Advisor on Cyprus Elizabeth Spehar in the buffer zone. President Akıncı and Greek Cypriot Leader Anastasiades last met on 26th October 2018.



Erhürman in Ankara

Prime Minister Tufan Erhürman went to Ankara as the guest of Grand National Assembly tomorrow (14th February). He will also meet with the Turkish Ombudsperson of the Republic Şeref Malkoç and will attend a symposium entitled 'The Past, Present and the Future of Ombudsman in the 6th Year'.

Erhürman will deliver a speech at the opening of the symposium which will take place at the Turkish Grand National Assembly tomorrow (14th February). He will also meet with the Turkish Ombudsperson of the Republic Şeref Malkoç and will attend a symposium entitled 'The Past, Present and the Future of Ombudsman in the 6th Year'.



“Mediterranean explorations by Greek Cypriots illegal”

Turkish Energy and Natural Resources Minister Fatih Dönmez said that the Greek Cypriot side's proceedings to sign deals for oil and natural gas explorations at the sites that they claim belong to them are against the laws and the Turkish Republic will not consent a fait accompli in that issue.

Answering the questions regarding the agenda on TRT News Agency, Minister Dönmez said that the Turkish Petroleum Company

continues seismic explorations at their own licensed zones and the first results of the deep sea drilling which was started last October will be taken at the end of this month or at the beginning of next month latest. Adding that the drilling activities of the 'Fatih' vessel continue, Dönmez said that they bought the second vessel last year and it will enter into the Turkish territorial waters around 20th February and its first site of action will be the Mediterranean.

Why do I not like pets?



Right now we have a 7 year old male Pitbull in our house. This was brought when only a few days old by my son. For the last seven years it has been in our house. I did not take any interest in him for the first five years. However, back in 2016 when my whole family had gone to Pakistan, leaving me and the dog behind, there was no other choice for me but to take care of the dog.

I had written on the same topic last year, but this is the topic which has a direct relationship with my daily life. I do not like pets, like other people do. I keep a distance with pets. Why am I like this? I have tried to think over this, many times, but never got a convincing answer.

May it be a dog or a cat, or birds, for the whole of my life I remained away from them. I do not know why but there may be some reason, behind it. There might be some bad experience of my childhood regarding pets, which I do not remember, which might be the reason for my anti-pets opinion. I must not mention it as an anti-pets opinion. I am not against them. I personally, simply do not like them and I do not know the reason.

I remember, when I was just 5 or 6 years old, there used to be one pet dog, named Hercules, in the house of my grandparents. After it had died, I never saw any other dog in either the house of my grandparents or of my parents.

My father once developed a liking for fish. He had bought two aquariums, and had put some fish of different colours in them. He used to take care of them, but I was not interested in them. Later on he got a small parrot, which became accustomed to him. I remember, during the 1970s he used to carry him on his shoulder inside the house. He tried hard to teach him some words, but failed. That particular parrot remained part of our family for quite long time but I never developed

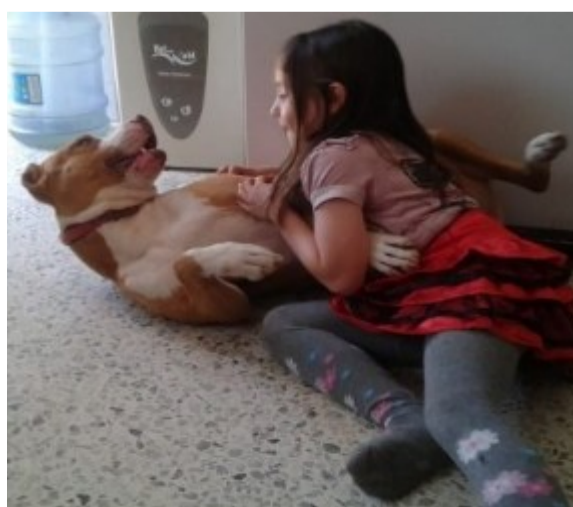
a liking. I remember I never held the parrot in my hand or gave food to him.

I never had anti-pets sentiments, but I simply never wanted to get involved with them.

In my post marriage period of life, I found out that my wife had a serious interest in birds. For the last 30 plus years of our married life, it is just herself who takes care of her birds, not me.

When our children started growing up, they showed an interest in dogs. There had been different types of dogs in our house (not inside). Most of them were raised by my wife and children. They took very good care of them, but I never became a part of that.

The dogs also, on their part, never expected anything from me, as they always knew that I was not the right person to display signs of love or whatever. I always remained a neutral person, rather a non-existent person for the pet dogs of our family.



My wife and children had trained me in advance, during the last few days, before leaving for Pakistan, about my duties. It was not just the dog, I was supposed to take care of the birds too. There were so many birds, in three cages. Even to date I do not know which bird is a lovebird or other species. I do not even know the types of the birds. I classified them as small birds and large birds.

After my family left for the month long tour, there was no other option for me but to get involved in all this. I personally tried to understand the feelings of the dog, when I tried to take him out for stroll, for the first time. Like me he was also feeling uneasy. However, a stroll twice a day, was enough to adjust both of us with each other. However, it never remained a bond of liking, but an understanding due to the circumstances.

Regarding the birds, unfortunately, I lost 5 birds the first day. I tried to be more cautious about their food and water, and the way to keep them covered under the sun, etc etc. But I could not do that successfully. In the

period of a month, most of the birds had died.

On return back after a month, I remember the facial expression of my wife, when she saw the bird cages almost vacant. I had tried to reduce her grief by showing that there were still some left (hahahahaha), but of no use. She went to the pet shop the next day, to replace the lost ones.

However, there is only one positive change in the situation since then. My family realised that I could manage taking the dog out. So it has become my duty to take the dog out early in the morning. Though still we are not friends, we are not enemies either. For the last two years me and our dog have been living a life of no love/no hate.

Right now my wife has brought home a parrot. Since it's inside the house, I have to bear all the sounds that he produces. I have to watch and listen to training sessions, in which my wife tries to teach the parrot some words. She repeats the same word again and again, with the hope that he will learn it. But so far no success.



Interestingly the parrot has learned to produce the sound of telephone bell. This is a big success, which has made my wife work harder in her teaching lessons, but as you can understand, frequently we hear the telephone and run to pick it up, just to find that it was he (the parrot) who was practicing the sound.

Well this is my life with pets. I still keep a neutral position. No love/no hate.

Fireballs was founded in 2008 and had established itself in the Classic Rock scene in Northern Cyprus. 2016 was the last concert for the time being. Reunited in 2019, the first concert of the "Reunited Fireballs" was on 23rd January in The QUOTA (Lefkosa).

Around 22:00 it started ---- with classics such as Thrill is Gone (B.B. King), Hoochie Coochie Man (Muddy Waters) and Crossroads by Eric Clapton. The journey through time had begun. A really good time to bow to the 60's, 70's and 80's of Classic Rock with some pieces of Blues/Rock following. A good memory of one of the best periods of this music genre.

It was the music of Deep Purple, Cream, Free, Jimi Hendrix, The Beatles, The Kinks, The Rolling Stones, Doors and Creedence Clearwater Revival To name just a few.

Convincing was simply the quality with which this great music of a great era was presented.

Smoke on the Water, Black Night (Deep Purple), Come Together (The Beatles), Roadhouse Blues (Doors), All right now (Free), Paint It black, Jumping Jack Flash, Satisfaction (The Rolling Stones), All day and all of the night (The Kinks), White Room (Cream) or Proud Mary and Fortunate Son (CCR). Everything just done well.....

Ulaş Barış - Vocals was the frontman, who enthralled the audience and was able to convince them vocally. The band around Çağrı Ersoy - Guitar & Back Vocals, Hakan Şonya - Bass & Back Vocals (BMT) and Mert Güçlü - Drums (BMT) wowed as a band and offered Ulaş the platform for the song presentations.

They were really good also some Blues/Rock songs were included.

A gig without break - 3 hours of great music. Great band, based on original songs.

The highlight for me was the finale, a finale for an amazing night and crowd on this music trip through the time of Classic and Blues/Rock - A Capella Ulaş, Çağrı, Hakan and Mert with "When the Children Cry" by White Lion.

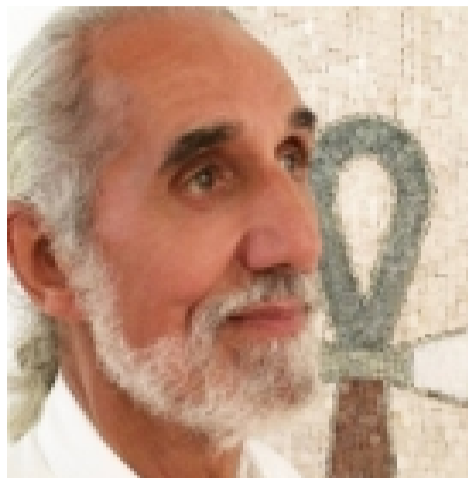

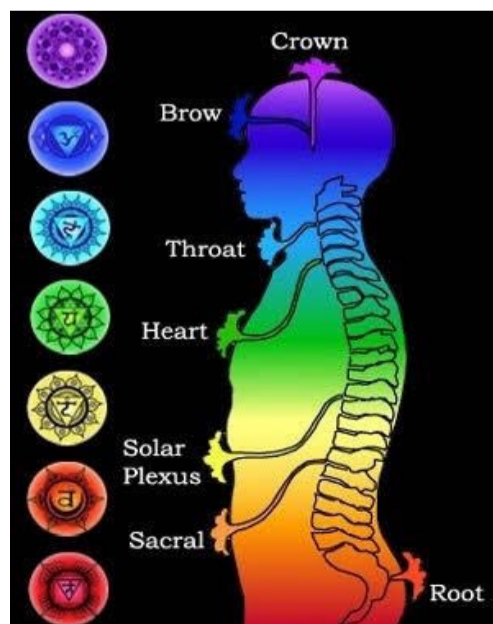

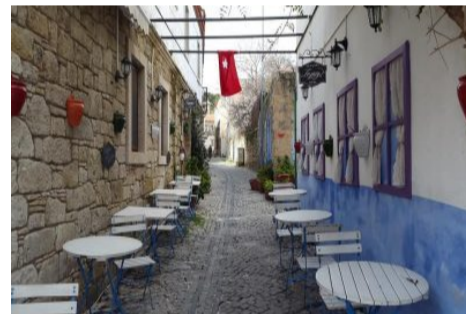
The local people, showed their interest, and invited him for tea and coffee at various stops.

He went to the ALAÇATI area of Çeşme, which is an historical area.

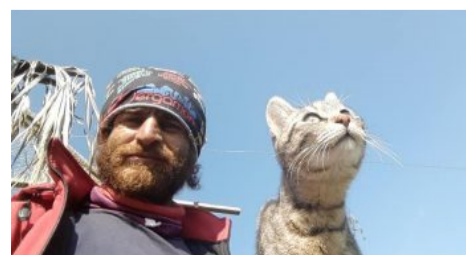
He toured the market, where people expressed their happiness to meet him.

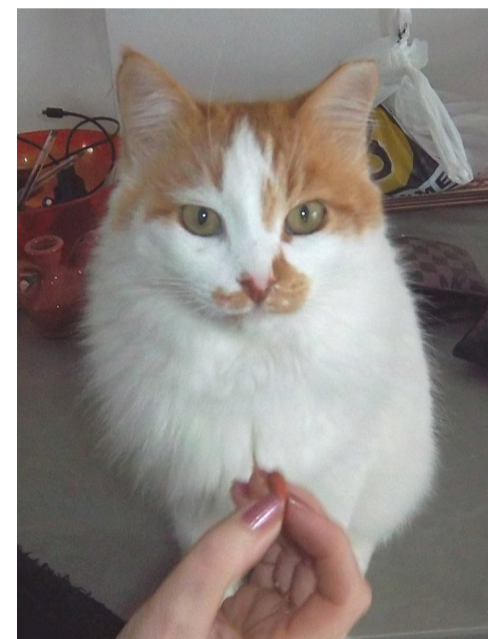


following day, to her final destination and to be reunited with Owen and Bev - in Belfast.

This week was a case of 2 out and 4 in!! 2 dogs left TRNC bound for Dubai and 4 pets came in from Dubai.

Part 1

Firstly we had young Bella and shaggy Wolfie leaving the TRNC on their way to their new home in Dubai. They had been chosen, from our Rescue Center, to go and live with Louise and Sheldene and their families in sunny Dubai.

Because Bella was only a young pup we felt that she needed a home environment to help her socialise and get used to the ways of living in a family environment during her preparation period (which is very similar to EU/UK but involves some different processes and paperwork). We asked our small group of foster carers if any of them had space - luckily for us Lynda did. So we arranged for Bella to go and stay with Lynda. During one of our chats about how Bella was doing, Lynda reported:

" She's either being a sod or she's asleep being cute !

She's a shoe thief, branch chewing, laundry pinching, fidgeting, needs to be learning a new trick or grinding her baby teeth out on your prized possessions, mud digging monster. I'm forever chasing her to retrieve washing or shoes, the Hoover lives in the lounge as she's always chewing and dropping bits everywhere.

We love her a lot she deserves a long and happy family life god love her.

She needs toys tell them, she likes to have things in her mouth especially when she meets people. She runs to find a toy to hold in her mouth for greeting you.

She sleeps soundly, a good guard dog! She won't bark unless she hears something.

She has shown me a slight tendency to resource guarding with food which I've worked on everyday with her. Please tell them to watch her as she settles in with that, she is in my opinion a collie cross and likes to be stimulated. If you don't she will find her own jobs to do ... usually dig a

hole or fetch the laundry in for you. Her coat is shiny and she's grown, she adores fuss and cuddles and she's nosy. She meets strangers really well and walks well on her harness. She 'no like the vet ' She's no longer car sick, I thought I'd work on that so she travels well bless her as she was awful at first. She knows sit and down and can be left for a couple of hours without a drama."

Wolfie remained up at the Center, whilst he was being prepared, where he had been living happily with his bestie " Kiki" - Louise made several visits over to see him and staff and volunteers all commented on how much he adored Louises's children. No doubt they will soon come to be his new "besties" !

Tuesday night at 1 am saw KAR Pet Travel up out getting the dogs ready for their journey to Dubai. The dogs took their last TRNC walk by torchlight, in the pitch black, being serenaded by the sounds of frogs - and the Catalkoy bin men !!



Then it was time to get off to Ercan. Check in at Ercan went as smoothly as possible and it made such a change to see the Customs dept (who had opened up especially for us) relatively quiet and without the usual hustle and bustle that we have during usual working hours.

As most of you are aware last year we suffered devastating losses when we were hit by an outbreak of Distemper. We had a wonderful response from you all with both financial and verbal support for which we are forever grateful. As a result new quarantine areas and strict procedures are now in place and appear to be working well. It is now that time when the next phase of vaccinations (boosters) are due to be given to all our dogs at our shelter. This is a huge outlay as we currently have 265 dogs and puppies under our care. The costs of these vaccinations are:-

CATS & KITTENS

Earlier this year we put out a warning to the public to look out for any cats and kittens that showed signs of being unwell as we became aware of an outbreak of Panleucopenia which is the feline version of Distemper. Luckily the cats and kittens in our care at our rescue centre had all been previously vaccinated and were all up to date but now are also due their boosters. We have currently 48 cats and kittens under our care. The costs of these vaccinations are:-

Statement issued on World Cancer Day by EMU

The Dr. Fazıl Küçük Faculty of Medicine of Eastern Mediterranean University, recently issued a statement, providing valuable information and guidance to the general public. The statement was issued on the occasion of World Cancer Day. The statement included the following: "As the Dr. Fazıl Küçük Faculty of Medicine on this year's February 4th World Cancer Day, with the theme "I am and I will", we consider it our duty to raise awareness about the illness of our era; cancer. 9.6 million people worldwide die of cancer. We know that 1/3 of the frequently encountered cancer types can be prevented. With early diagnosis and the right treatment strategies, 3.7 million lives can be saved."

"Cancer is when a normal group of cells start multiplying uncontrollably and start to damage the body by first spreading to surrounding tissue, then to the entire body itself. Cancer can form due to various reasons: Advanced age, genetic tendency, some immune system diseases etc. Some

other known agents are alcohol, being overweight, excessive consumption of red meat, processed meat, burnt meat, synthetic sweetening agents, salted nutrients, conserved food, hydrogenated fats, insufficient consumption of fruits and vegetables, and extremely hot or cold food. Smoking can cause numerous types of cancer; lung, lips, mouth, inner mouth, and throat cancer being at the top of the list. Gamma, X and radon rays are among high energy radiation cancer agents. Also, the ultraviolet rays emanating from the sun can cause skin cancer. We also know that agents such as chemical paint and asbestos also cause cancer. It is also known that the HPV virus causes cervical cancer, the hepatitis viruses cause liver cancer and EBV viruses cause lymphoma".

Suggestions to Prevent Cancer

Dr. Fazıl Küçük Faculty of Medicine suggests the following to prevent cancer:

- A dynamic lifestyle: regular physical activities reduce the risk

of intestine, breast and cervical cancer.

- Quality sleep
- Knowing one's body: self-examinations and noticing other anomalies forming on one's body
- Raising awareness on cancer
- Watching out for electromagnetic pollution
- Awareness on breastfeeding: breastfeeding for a sufficient amount of time can have preventive effects on cancer development
- Preventive inoculation: the HPV vaccination should not only be applied to girls, but also to boys from the age of 12.
- Awareness on infection risks
- Prostate checks for males over 40

- Mammography checks for women over 40, smear tests and self-examinations.

"For some types of cancer, we admit that no current treatments can be a solution; however for most, many things can be done. We can even prevent the cancer from forming in the first place. Avoiding all these precautions, leaving it up to fate and giving into pessimism is an outdated approach. Preventing cancer and getting treated can only be realised with awareness. Most of the time knowing the causes, knowing one's own body, awareness on what one is capable of and determination can solve the problem".



"Listen to Children" project by European University of Lefke

The Social Services Club of European University of Lefke, recently started a campaign which is aimed at adults. The campaign

emphasises the need of listening to the children. The club members, distributed brochures which provides details of dealing with children.



The students, also distributed small gifts among the children.

Assoc. Prof. Dr. Özge Özgür Bayır, who is in charge of this campaign stated that there is great need to make adults understand the necessity of listening to the children. The pamphlets included information on Child neglect and abuse. She said that child neglect and abuse, which is called child maltreatment, is a traumatic event that can affect lifelong, both in the short and long term, the mental

health of the individual, causing traumatic stress disorders and problems in school and career life.

Bayır also said that "This project aims to contribute and draw attention to the child neglect and abuse issue" and added that the aim is to increase the knowledge level of families and to increase the awareness of the district by giving information about the neglect and abuse of children by contacting the parents especially in the region of Lefke.

Survey of selection of statues carried out by NEU

In a recent survey 20 distinct personalities were selected, whose statues will be made and exhibited at the Turkish National History Museum.

According to the information provided by the Press and

Information Department of Near East University, two thousand participants simultaneously took part in the survey via the internet, newspapers and in the field to decide the 20 valuable figures for the Turkish Cypriots to be exhibited initially at the Cyprus Turkish National History Museum. As a result, it was stated that the

making of the 20 statues of the decided figures has begun.

The survey was completed in 6 main areas, Nicosia, Kyrenia, Famagusta, Güzelyurt, Iskele and Lefke and the streets were chosen randomly. It was stated that the survey was completed by 40 surveyors and one in every three homes were included in the research. During the survey, it was stated that gender and age demographic features were considered. Moreover, it was stated that in addition to questions regarding the determination of the pieces to be exhibited at the Cyprus Turkish National History Museum, there were also items to determine the socio-demographics of the participants. Providing further details, it was expressed that 1000 people participated in the field application of the survey; whereas

1000 people participated in the survey via the internet, making a total of 2000 participants. As a result of the survey, the most wanted 20 figures to be displayed at the museum was determined.

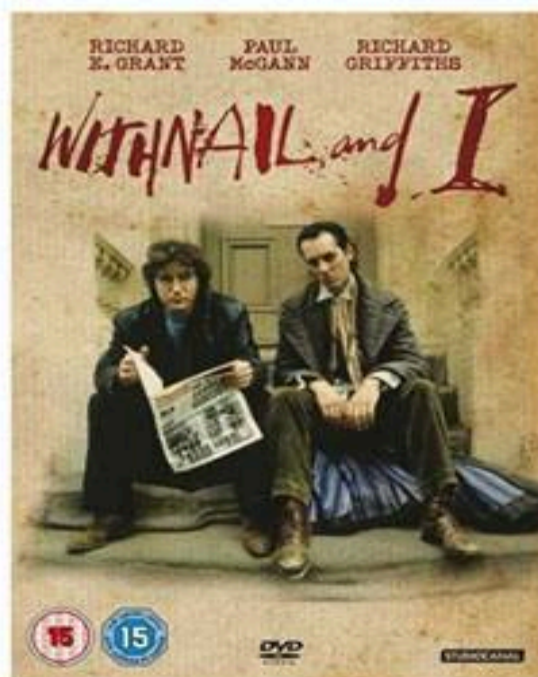
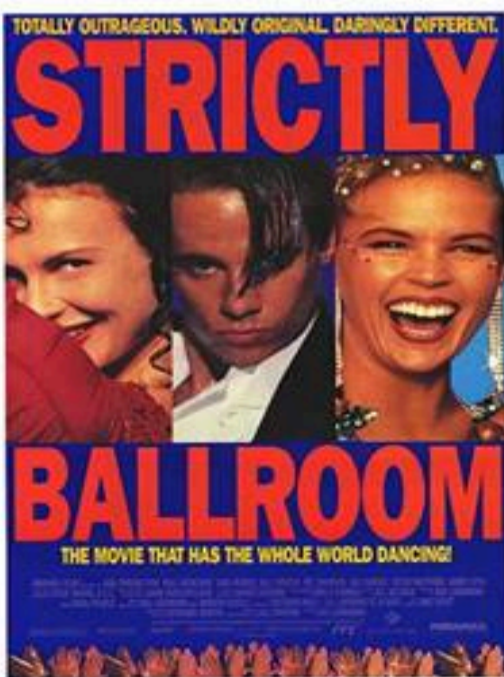

A very tough and robust Binatlı team were too strong for Esentepe and deservedly won this second round encounter of the Kıbrıs Kupası.

MATCH NOTES :

23 mins ; Binatlı were awarded a free kick in a dangerous position right on the edge in the middle of the goal area. Muammer Tip bent the kick round the wall only to see his shot hit the angle of the crossbar and post, bounce down before it was scrambled away.

40 mins : Junior went down again, while Binatlı were in possession of the ball a number of Esentepe players thought that Binatlı would kick the ball out of play to enable Junior to get treatment. They did not and the ball was played up field to Mustafa Suzgen who squared the ball across to HASAN NALBANT who simply tapped the ball in. This led to some



bad feelings with a number of players arguing amongst themselves.

Junior did not return for the start of the second half and was replaced by Ahmet Çağlar.

Binatlı nearly scored twice within 5 minutes of the restart of the second but Esentepe young goalkeeper Onur thwarted them.

53 mins : Binatlı took the lead following slack defending by Esentepe, a long cross found two Binatlı players unmarked at the far post VINICLUS JORGE got in a shot which Onur could only parry back again to Viniclus who shot home the rebound. 1-2

57 mins ; Binatlı scored another simple goal when Mahmut came off worse with a strong tackle by Alattin who outstripped Hasan before squaring the ball across to VINICLUS JORGE whose low drive beat Onur at the near post, the goalkeeper could only help the ball into the net. 1-3

66 mins : In a rare Esentepe attack they put together a good move Vurkan found Kaan who put over a lovely cross just too high for Sane, the ball



went to Ahmet Çağlar at the far post who hit his first time shot wide from a good position

71 mins : Esentepe gave away a bad goal, Esentepe Captain Şahin tried to find Mahmut with a pass across his goal area that was intercepted by MODIAGBE VICTORY who went on to beat Onur. 1-4

78 mins : Esentepe almost reduced the deficit when they broke quickly from a Binatlı corner led by Efosa who beat a couple of players and squared a perfect cross to Kaan who had run upfield himself but the winger's shot flew high over the bar, maybe with a little more composure he could have done better.
