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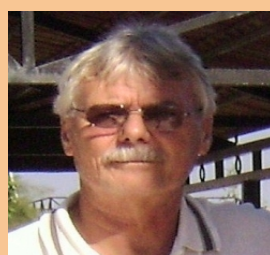

Flight Grievance

Have you ever experienced travel delay, flight cancellation, or flight inconvenience which was out of your control? If yes, read on.

Every year, thousands of airline passengers are delayed, miss flights, lose their baggage, experience poor service or are hit with hidden fees.

If this happens to you, always complain to the airline first. If they

do not respond after eight weeks, or you are unhappy with the outcome, your next step is to find out if the firm is signed up to a dispute resolution service.

The two main voluntary schemes are the Aviation ADR and the Centre for Effective Dispute Resolution (CEDR).

Aviation ADR members include Emirates, Flybe, Delta and Virgin Atlantic.

British Airways, Thomas Cook, EasyJet and Tui belong to CEDR's dispute scheme, along with airports London Heathrow, London

If your airline is a member of CEDR, you can visit cedr.com/consumer/aviation/submit-a-claim, write to Centre for Effective Dispute Resolution, 70 Fleet Street, London EC4Y 1EU, or call 020 7536 6099. There is a £25 administration fee if you lose.

CEDR says it does not close a case until any payment it has awarded has been paid.

To contact the aviation regulator, visit caa.co.uk, write to Passenger Advice and Complaints Team (PACT), UK Civil Aviation Authority, 45-59 Kingsway, London WC2B 6TE or call 0330 022 1500.

We have heard from them recently and they confirmed our claim will be met within the next 4 weeks making our claim value 600 euro (after the 200-euro deduction) to our benefit, which was more than we paid for our 2 return flights!

Contract Mobile Phones

Foreign people here cannot get first time applications for mobile phones, in the TRNC. The reason for this is because holiday makers visiting the TRNC have successfully applied for a mobile phone on a contract basis and then leaving the Country and not meeting their financial commitment.

Well now you can, through Vodafone located on the main road in Alsancak next to Capital Bank.

If you call in to see them, they will give you all the information you need

This Could Come Our Way?

British holidaymakers may face long airport queues in Greece as police bring in extra checks on British passports.

From April 7, Hellenic police will be completing additional checks on travellers going to and from areas outside the Schengen zone.

The Foreign Office has warned Brits to arrive at the airport 'in good time' - which is usually at least two hours before your flight is set to leave.



The travel advice on the Foreign Office website says: 'As of 7 April 2019, the Hellenic Police will begin implementing systematic passport control checks for all European citizens travelling to/from destinations outside the Schengen area (including the UK) in line with a 2017 Schengen Borders Code regulation.

International Driving Permits [IDP] Save 100s of ££££££££?

With all the chaos surrounding Brexit and whether the authorities over the border will allow you drive on a UK licence is still very much up in the air.

However, Mary and myself visited the UK to ascertain the true and accurate detail in order to make a successful IDP application.

Firstly, you can either go to the UK and gain the driving permit, or you can solicit the services of someone else who is going to the UK and make the application on your behalf.

You will need to find a Post Office which has the authority to complete your application[s] successfully. Note, not all Post office staff are in full possession of

the rules governing the process, as we experienced ourselves.

All you need to take, is a copy of your passport and a passport size photograph plus your UK driving licence and ask for an IDP 1949. The fee for a single application is £5.50 for a twelve-month permit, which remains the same for any application made by you for somebody else.

The whole process only takes about 5-10 minutes and is handed over to you upon completion.

At the moment you can apply for a 1949 permit on a yearly basis and no longer, but this may change as time goes by.

We are about to set up a service to make your application far easier and no need to go to the UK to make the application, or the annual renewal, which will only take two weeks from start to finish. This will save lots of money and lots of

time spent flying over to the UK every year to renew the permit.

Watch this space when, or if the UK finally agrees to leave the EU.

Replacing a Lost/stolen TRNC Driving Licence

If you happen to lose or have stolen your TRNC driving licence and you did not take a copy, keeping the original in a safe place at home, there is a procedure to follow in order to get a replacement.

1. Go to the main police station in Girne.
2. Report the loss/theft.
3. Give the officer your details who will arrange a typed report for you.
4. Hand over postage stamps to the value of 17.5 tl.
5. Go back to the police station the following Friday for the report.
6. The replacement licence can only be renewed at the main licencing office Lefkosa with a fee of 175 tl.
7. Go back to the same office in Lefkosa 3-4 weeks later and collect your new licence.

To obtain the replacement you can of course go to Capital Bank in Alsancak who will do it for you!!

TRNC Environmental Protection Department report for 15-28 April

The Environmental Protection Department of the Ministry of Tourism and Environment carried out 2 weekly inspections and the results have been announced.

Between 15th and 21st April, 637 workplaces, people or vehicles were inspected across the island. During the week of April 22nd to 28th April, 900 workplaces, persons or vehicles were inspected.

During the 2 week period, the audited sites were 484 music venues, 114 plastic bag inspections, 8 natural life audits, 16 wastewater audits, 16 solid waste

audits, 10 EIA inspections, and 889 air emission and industrial plant inspections.

Sound, solid waste, EIA, industrial chimneys, wastewater, air quality and plastic bag inspections carried out were - Nicosia 768, Famagusta-Iskele 415, Girne 240, Güzelyurt-Lefke 114. 9 people or institutions were given a notice and 4 people or institutions were given a penalty.

Jordanian and 3 children handed over to GC Administration



Jordanian dad and his three children handed over to the Greek Cypriot Administration via UNFICYP.

42-year-old Jordanian national Sufian Mohammad Abdallah Marie who kidnapped his three children from South Cyprus was detected in the TRNC and has been handed over to the Greek Cypriot Administration via the United Nations Peacekeeping Force in Cyprus (UNFICYP).

The Jordanian man Sufian was detected in Gayretköy with his three children aged twelve, six and four and the Bi-communal Technical Committee for Crime and Criminal Matters was contacted.

Following contact with the Committee, they were handed over to officials from UNFICYP at Ledra Palace border gate who then handed them over to the Greek Cypriot Administration.

Akkule Museum, Famagusta was opened 27th April 2019

The Akkule Museum, located at the entrance of Famagusta Castle, which is under the control of the Department of Antiquities and Museums of the Ministry of Tourism and Environment, was opened on Saturday 27th April with a ceremony attended by President Mustafa Akıncı and his wife Meral Akıncı.

Within the scope of the improvement and conservation work financed by the European Union, Akkule Land Gate was restored by the UNDP and handed over to the Department of Antiquities and Museums, which carried out the internal arrangements and enabled the historical Akkule to come to life again.

The Akkule / Black Gate (Ravelin) will attract tourists from overseas and there will be information about the ancient structures and walls in the castle.

A large model was prepared at the entrance to the building, showing the walls and important old structures of the fortress. By placing numbers into the model,

visitors will be able to track where the structure is, which date it belongs to and the information boards named after it.

On display in the building are 2 Ottoman soldiers, 2 Venetian soldiers, 1 Ottoman statue, 1 imitation Ottoman cannon and 1 imitation Venetian cannon.

It is more appropriate to exhibit sculptures and cannons which relate to military architecture and 120x400 size oil paintings are also exhibited within the building.

The display table describes the Ottoman and Venetian wars in Akkule and the coat of arms of the period on the walls and stonemason signs are described in English and Turkish with information plates.

The Akkule Museum will be open full-time on weekdays and on weekends.

Speaking at the opening, Minister of Tourism and Environment Fikri Ataoğlu explained that the Ravelin Land Gate was organised for the benefit of tourists with some arrangements after the restoration.

Ataoğlu emphasized that the city of Famagusta is integrated with historical riches, and stressed that they will continue to contribute to the city as a Ministry. He also said that one of the unique historical sites that tourists can visit is the Akkule, and that the beauty of our country should be shared.

President Mustafa Akıncı said that the city of Famagusta has a

historical background and that there were traces of many civilizations. He pointed out that historical monuments have been preserved to this day and will continue to be preserved in order to share them with future generations.

After the speeches, the opening ceremony continued with the cutting of the ribbon.

Özersay to meet Akar

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay travelled to İstanbul yesterday (29/04/2019) upon the invitation of Turkish National Defence Minister Hulusi Akar.

Özersay will participate in the International Defence Industry Fair (IDEF), which has been held every two years since 1993, with the Foreign and Defence Ministers from different countries, and will hold various contacts.

Özersay began his contacts with a reception given in honour of guest

ministers yesterday evening. Özersay will hold an inter-delegation meeting with Akar today.

The latest developments and technology in the fields of defence, maritime and aviation following the rapid developments in defence and security areas in the Eastern Mediterranean Region and the Middle East recently will be exhibited at the IDEF, which is recognised as one of the biggest defence industry fairs in the world in terms of participant firms and the number of delegations.



Ozersay - Istanbul contacts

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay evaluated his Istanbul contacts on BRT.

Minister Özersay said that they discussed the latest stage reached on the Cyprus problem.

Pointing out the actions of the Greek Cypriot side in the Eastern Mediterranean, Özersay said that they have also mentioned the relations of the Greek Cypriot side with third countries on military, defence and security issues. Özersay added “According to us, these are the initiatives which can endanger the regional security and

stability because both the Turkish Cypriot side and Turkey are excluded. These are the developments which will affect the stability of the region in a negative way”.

Furthermore, stressing that the Turkish Cypriot side and Turkey will not allow the Greek Cypriot side to usurp the rights of the Turkish Cypriots by their unilateral activities in the field of energy in the Eastern Mediterranean, Özersay said that they have also discussed how they can take measures on the issue and put our rights into practice.



The price of short-sightedness

“The price of short-sightedness of 15 years ago has been high”

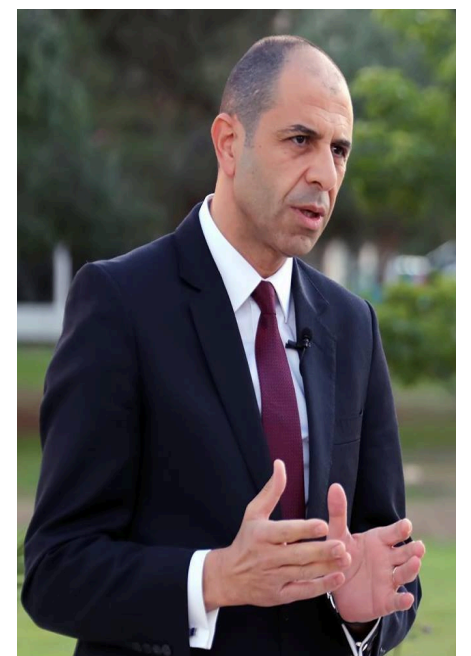
Cypriot side has undertaken a mission to put obstacles or delays on each issue.

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay stated that it has become clearer in the last years that it was a wrong decision to make the Greek Cypriot side an EU member unilaterally 15 years ago on 1 May 2004, who prevented solution of the Cyprus problem, and stressed that the Turkish Cypriot people have paid the price of this wrong decision.

Minister Özersay added that this unjust EU membership was an unfair action which was against the EU’s own values and we as the Turkish Cypriots have paid the price of this unfairness for the last 15 years.

This short-sightedness caused the Turkish Cypriot side to move further away from a solution and the Greek Cypriot side securing a greater comfort zone. Following their EU membership, the Greek

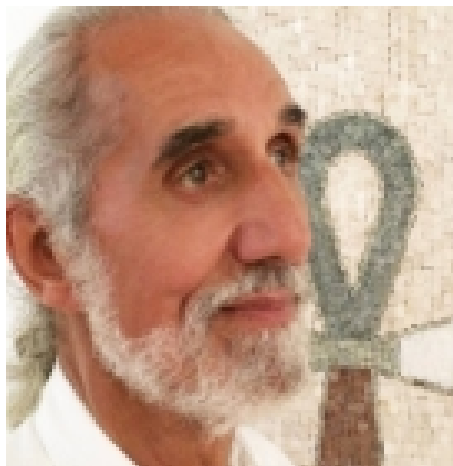

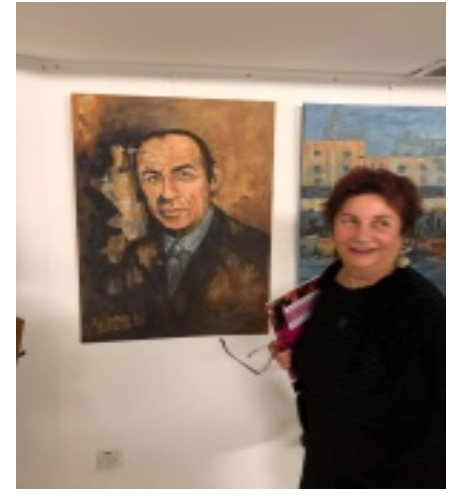

In the art centre that is named after him many art exhibitions take place and there is hardly any idle time for the managing department, the centre is booked out over the year.

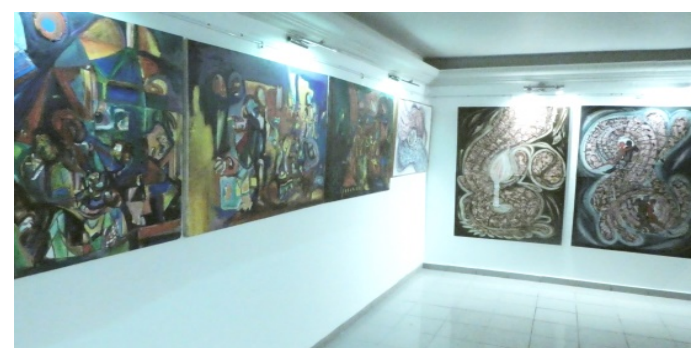

Cyclist Abdulhalim AKÇAY is touring Turkey on his cycle. He had started off from Istanbul on 28th November 2018. In this 5 months he has covered a distance of about 5,600 kilometres.

Here is a short summary of his movement from 22nd to 27th April 2019.

145th day (22/04/2019)

He had spent the previous night in his tent at the allocated place of the Kumluca municipality. He set off for KARAGÖZ. He met two aged tourists from Czech republic. 146th day (23/04/2019)

He reached a small village by side of the sea. There were many tourists there. The natural beauty of the area was superb. He found a friend there who arranged for a wonderful dinner. He spent the night on the beach.



147th day (24/04/2019)

He had decided this would be a rest day. In fact the previous day was really tiring, as he had climbed up the hill, on a very bad road. He went on a short tour of the area. There was a small old building near the beach from where the whole of the natural beauty could be seen. He went there, but of course the way up to the top was not easy. He faced much difficulty in reaching there.

However once there, he realised that it was worth it. He enjoyed the scenery and natural beauty spread all around. He went to an old castle too, which was not very far away.



148th day (25/04/2019)

He started off from Adrasan, early in the morning towards Olympos. The route was full of natural beauty. There were small villages where he drank tea, ate food and enjoyed meeting people. There were many tourists in the area.

The distance between Adrasan and Olympos is 12 kilometres. There is a mountain that distances them from each other. He went to see the historical city. The area was filled with tourists from all parts of the world.

There was a place where the gases coming out of the old volcano come up in the form of fire. He went to see that.

He spent the whole day strolling around, and seeing the area.

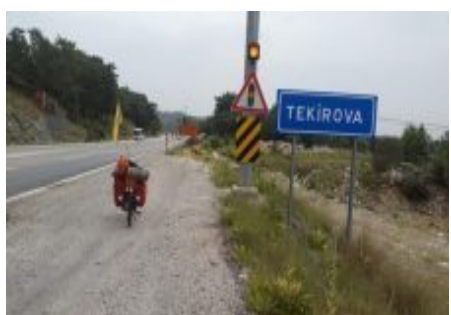


kilometres. Indeed it is not an easy task. Against all odds his will power is keeping him moving ahead.

When people ask, "can't you help?" time for example, petrol - collecting and going to and from the vets, costs of heated pads on 24/7 are all given for free and willingly along with the abundance of love, sleepless nights and care but veterinary bills need to be paid.

A few recent examples:-

Annie (plus her subsequent 4 kittens) that wandered into the Wednesday craft market in labour, had several ultrasounds. She and her kittens will all be vaccinated along with spaying and neutering when the time comes.

Checkers - an older kitten rescued months ago has been poorly and has had several days of drips and medication, luckily he is feeling much better today and has moved to daily injections and special diet food to aid his recovery.

A family of young orphaned kittens that need kitten formula and will be vaccinated and neutered in the future.

One little orphaned kitten that aspirated his milk and was having a drip and antibiotics.

Three kittens that were rescued with their Mom a few months ago (mom was spayed last month) have started their vaccinations today.

A stray cat with a poorly paw - possible bite or maybe foreign object stuck in his paw. Course of antibiotics completed. If still limping will need to be sedated and his paw x-rayed.

These are to name but a few.

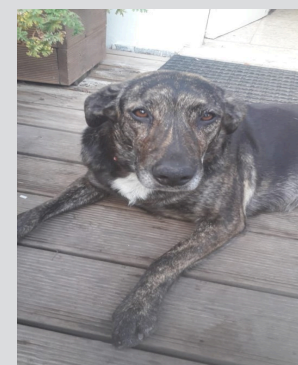

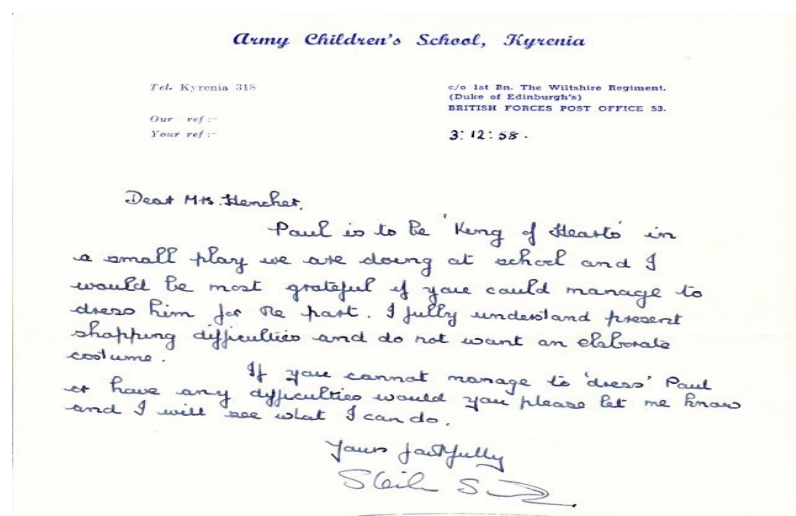

Tourism Festival held in Girne

Ministry of Tourism and Environment, organised festivals for Tourism Week during 15th – 22nd April 2019 with artists, artisans and universities.

Following the Tourism Festival in Famagusta, a Tourism Festival was held in Girne. The event was held in order to draw attention to domestic tourism in the country during the period 15th to 22nd April, which was accepted as the opening of the tourism season, and to instil tourism awareness in our country.

Organized under the sponsorship of Girne American University and the Dome Hotel, the festival started with a cortege walk between Ramadan Cemil Square and the Ancient Port organised by the Ministry of Tourism and Environment.

Minister of Tourism and Environment Fikri Ataoğlu, Minister of Labour and Social Security Zeki Celer, Kyrenia District Governor Sinan Gunes, Lapta Mayor Mustafa Aktug, Ministry Undersecretary Ismet Esenyel, Ministry Directors, Kyrenia Police Director Sitki Erkivanc, citizens and tourists attended.

At the event, there was a concert by the Band of the Turkish Cypriot Peace Forces at the entrance of the Ancient Port.

Tourism and Environment Minister Fikri Ataoğlu emphasized that tourism is the main sector of the country's economy and emphasized that tourism is a matter that concerns the whole country. He thanked everyone who had contributed to the organisation of the tourism festival, pointing out

that some sectors were trying to undermine tourism, which is the main sector of the country.

The Ministry and its stakeholders' aim is to develop tourism, to diversify, to encourage tourists and increase the number of beds and local employment. Many studies have been carried out across the country to increase the use of local produce. Ataoğlu said that as well

Tourism Festival held in Girne

Mr. Ataoğlu stated that despite the criticism and boycotts, the festival took place without any problems, thanks to the cooperation of the main sponsors, ministry staff and stakeholders.

Tourism, which is the leading sector of the country, met 50 percent of the budget deficit last year, and Ataoğlu said that they are proud of this, and emphasized that the new projects they will implement soon will bring tourism revenues to 65 percent of the budget deficit.

In the last 3 months, there has been a decrease in the number of tourists compared to last year. South Cyprus try to prevent tourists coming to the north from countries outside the EU and also endeavour to blockade every platform in which we participate. Despite this, with Turkey's support, we continue to work tirelessly to develop tourism, Ataoğlu said.

Speaking at the opening of the Tourism Festival, Labour and Social Security Minister Zeki Çeler emphasized the importance of tourism for the country and being aware of what it adds to the country.

Çeler said that they have contributed to the promotion of the culture of the country by promoting the folklore groups in similar festivals held in the past and said that they are very proud to show the culture of the country to tourists visiting the country.

Tourism is the main sector of the economy and efforts are being made to improve the number of tourists visiting the country. The Ministry of Labour and Social Security, work in cooperation with

the Ministry of Tourism, to promote the culture of the country. Stating that they will share the common projects with the community in the near future, Çeler wished all the participants a good day at the tourism festival.

Following the opening speeches, the Turkish Cypriot Comedy

Theater show, Laren Hastunç Modern Dance show, various folk dances, hip hop, modern dance, Sema, illusion, Nejla Egemen music concert, İllizyon, Pelin Kutluba and Ahmet Evan concert took place.

In addition, hotels operating in the

country established stands in Kordonboyu and visitors were introduced to their facilities.

Girne Tourism Festival ended with a concert of Group Frequency and a cocktail reception was organised by the Dome Hotel to honour the opening of the tourism season.

"Exclusive Economic Zone Debates and Maritime Law Violations",

"The Place and Importance of Environmental Policies in Maritime Safety",

"Current Situation and Sectoral Analysis of Turkish Maritime Trade",

"Defense Industry Studies on MİLGEM and Maritime Security",

"Turkey's Shipbuilding Capabilities",

"Hinterland and Port Expansion Plans of Turkey",

"The Importance of Maritime Tourism in the Country Economy",

"Security of the Black Sea after the

Kerch Strait Crisis",

"Aegean Sea Security and Aggressive Discourses after Kardak Crisis"

"Areas in Turkey's Sovereignty 'fait accompli'"

"Energy Supply Security and the New Ecosystem of Competition in the Eastern Mediterranean",

"Turkey's Deep Sea Drilling Capabilities"

"Construction of a Turkish Naval Base in Cyprus Debate"

Nişantaşı University faculty member of the forum attendees Dr. Gökhan Ak, in his opening speech emphasized the importance of activities such as these and said; Such events are the kind of things we need to deal with. I would like to thank everyone who has contributed to the organization of this event.

Chief of Staff of Navy Rear-admiral Cihat Yaycı emphasized that he especially wanted to participate in this forum and thanked the organizers of the

event; "Although the Forum has a great meaning, it also answers a big question. Turkey's not only a motherland with its land, but its seas and airspace above it as well. Of course, the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus is a very important part of our country."

Yaycı said they were trying to fit the concepts in the Republic of Turkey and the Turkish nation, and stressed the importance of creating the doctrine of maritime connections in the media and the need for very serious maritime safety.

Chairman of TASAM Süleyman Şensoy emphasized that being a naval force depends on the becoming more maritime as a society and state and said "Although activity has been shown in maritime security by associations, foundations and non-profit organizations, there is a need for think tanks and institutions that can evaluate all aspects of marine geopolitics and maritime power

together and contribute to maritime by analyzing the maritime power; offer scientific options to capacity-makers, entrepreneurs, investors and decision-makers"

Şensoy emphasized importance of maritime-themed networks between Turkey and other countries and providing academic contribution towards the creation; he stated that in every field related to maritime, regional, continental and global developments should be followed and academic suggestions should be directed to international relations, defense, security, economy, law and socio-cultural policies.

The only way to find No Name is to search deep within your heart and find the realisation that we are all one, we are all family, we are all human. That epiphany and a sincere desire to be as one with Mother Gaia transports you to our humble happy home, a Cyprism of all cultures. My mission is to go out and discover what's happening on this beautiful divided island we call Cyprus and preserve our common heritage. So I'll explain how I got my name and begin the odyssey.

The Royal British Legion will be represented at this peaceful march and our Standard will be in attendance along with our own war veteran Bob Howard.

We will then return to the Colony hotel where there will be :

- A display of children pictures,
- Poetry readings,
- Chronological movie to show the universal struggle of war and singing of wartime songs
- A buffet and drinks are also available to purchase at the Hotel.

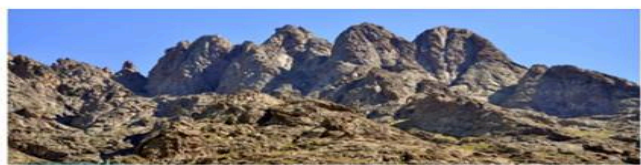

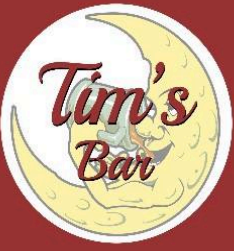

Both teams won away from home Yenıcamı 2-1 at in form Merit Alsancak, with MTG overcoming Lefke 4-1, will any team slip up?

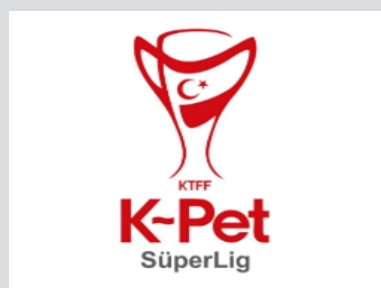
At the bottom L. Gençler Birliğı joined already relegated Girne Halk Evi when they lost 3-2 at Gönyeli

Esentepe who have leaked goals recently employed an “offside trap” which seem to have worked!

MATCH NOTES :

34 mins : Good work by Binatlı’s two Brazilian players Vinicius Jorge and Dos Santos ended with Jorge heading straight at Esentepe goalkeeper Onur .

45 mins : A long clearance from Binatlı’s Zihni put Jorge in the clear but the striker shot over the Esentepe bar as Onur came out.

45 + mins: Binatlı would pay dearly for that miss as Esentepe with virtually their first attack of the half took the lead in first half injury time. Yakup on the right laid the ball back to Mahmut whose cross was flicked on by KAAN beating the Binatlı goalkeeper Salih at his far post.

HALF TIME SCORE : 0-1.

54 mins: From an Onur goal kick Junior marked by both Zihni and Ayhan got his head to the ball, which went over the advancing Salih, but Zihni managed to get back and clear the ball off the line. Junior retrieved the ball and set up Yakup but the midfielder blasted his shot over the bar from a good position.

68 mins : A great run on the right by

Uğurcan surging pass defenders before squaring the ball across to Efosa in a good position but his shot was saved by the foot of goalkeeper Salih.

Esentepe were in full control they looked dangerous whenever they attacked, especially from the right another attack should have led to another Esentepe goal in the 78th minute.

Efosa made a great run down the right squared the ball across to Junior whose shot was blocked, the ball ran to Kaan who had a shot blocked. Kaan retrieved the ball and tried his luck again only to see his effort hit the post before it was cleared.

80 mins: Binatlı broke immediately from that Esentepe attack with Jorge passing to Muammer Tip, the talented midfielder returned the pass to Jorge who saw his shot parried by Onur straight into the patch of substitute SERTAÇ to score. **1-2**

Esentepe brought on defender Hasan and were quietly seeing out time, but the game ended in a fiery climax .

90 +3 mins : Esentepe took a short

corner on the left with Junior holding up the ball by the corner flag, fending off Ayhan. Fellow defender Hüseyin Taşçı out of frustration went in hard on Junior who fell to the ground, as he did so he lashed out at Hüseyin with both feet catching the Binatlı player in the stomach, who fell to the ground doing a “Neymar roll”. Referee Serhan Şimsek had no option quite correctly to red card Junior.

SUMMING UP: Shame about the Junior red card it took the gloss off what was a thoroughly competent and professional performance by Esentepe, who had a job to do and did it well.
