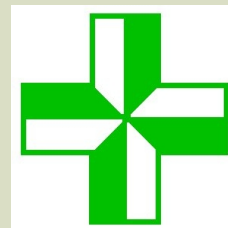

## No settlement while current isolation continues

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay has participated in the “23rd Council of Ministers Meeting” of the Economic Cooperation Organization (ECO), at which the TRNC is an observer member under the title of ‘Turkish Cypriot State’. The meeting has been organised in Dushanbe, the capital of Tajikistan.

In his speech at the meeting, Özersay outlined the TRNC’s stance on various issues. He emphasised the importance of the relationship between the Turkish Cypriot State, an observer member since 2012, and the ECO, reiterating that this current membership represents a concrete step towards resolving the unjust isolation imposed on the Turkish

Foreign Minister Özersay underlined that Turkish Cypriots are exposed to numerous constraints in all areas, ranging from travel restrictions for those holding TRNC passports, to representation in international organizations, as well as restrictions in the areas of trade, education, culture, art, and sports. Stating that this situation encourages the Greek Cypriot side’s uncompromising stance on any potential settlement, Özersay said that the Greek Cypriots move further away from sharing power and wealth with the Turkish Cypriots with each day that the isolation continues.

Özersay stated that the TRNC is ready to work together with the ECO and its member states in order to take concrete steps to

remove the restrictions which prevent Turkish Cypriots from becoming a part of the international community.

Özersay asked for solidarity and support from the ECO member

states and emphasized the importance of the participation of the member states in the four different ECO events, which will be organized in the TRNC.



## Turkish Foreign Ministry reacts strongly to EU report

The Turkish Foreign Ministry has stated that the report prepared by the European Commission on Turkey is neither objective, nor balanced.

In a written statement, the Ministry responded firmly to the

European Commission’s 2018 Turkey Country Report and said :

“Statements with regard to the Cyprus issue within the report is nothing beyond repeating the EU’s already known views based on wrong premises on the Cyprus

issue. These expressions reflect the attitude of the Greek Cypriots which is the basic reason for the failure of the negotiation process and it sets yet another example of the exploitation by the Greek Cypriots of EU membership in its efforts for deadlock.

The fact that the EU insists on this unilateral and distorted understanding reveals that it not only lacks strategical evaluation about the Eastern Mediterranean but also that it does not have the capacity to develop a long-term vision for the region.”

In his written statement; the European Union Minister and Chief Negotiator Ömer Çelik said:

“The EU has almost been captured by the Greek Cypriot side”.

Çelik added: “As we have clearly stated, the Greek Cypriot Administration’s continued unilateral hydrocarbon exploration in Turkey’s continental shelf, which the TRNC has a right to as part of the Exclusive Economic Zone, is out of the question.”

## Training of TRNC Environmental Officers

Training of Investigation Officers in cooperation with the TRNC Ministry of Tourism and Environment and the General Directorate of Police has been completed.

The 23 Environmental Officers, who have been trained in the relevant legislation, will be able to prepare files and bring them to court, as well as punish environmental polluters. Tourism and Environment Minister Fikri Ataoglu and Police General Manager Süleyman Manavoglu presented certificates to the Environmental Department staff who successfully completed the training.

The Minister of Tourism and Environment Fikri Ataoglu said that as a result of the training which took place in conjunction with the Ministry and the PGM, the Environmental Department personnel started to investigate the people who did not pay the penalties and to prepare the files and to bring them to the prosecutor's office and the court. As a result of the course, Ataoglu stated that the knowledge of the staff of the Environment Department had improved and they will continue to work to create awareness about the environment.

Minister Ataoglu said that he wanted



to make environmental controls more comprehensive in cooperation with the police and local government by making necessary changes in the environment and stressed that not only institutions or organizations, but all people, are responsible to ensure a clean environment.

Ataoglu underlined that the prevention of pollution, the protection of nature and the awareness of the public are the priorities for leaving a good

environment for future generations, and expressed the belief that these steps will increase the sensitivity to the environment.

At the certificate ceremony General Director of Police Süleyman Manavoglu stated that the Environment Department gave the Investigation Officer Basic Training Course for 23 personnel and all the participants completed the course successfully.

Manavoglu: The training period was for one week and the course covered - Environmental Law, the Law on Civil Rights, the Code of Criminal Procedures, as well as file construction and evaluation issues. Manavoglu also stated that the course was extremely useful and that his teammates would become more conscious of doing their tasks properly.



Coordination between agencies in preventing crime and coordination of administrators is extremely important. "People who commit crimes against an educated and determined government official will always have to step back," he said.

Mr. Manavoglu also gave his thanks to the Personnel staff of the Environment Department who participated in the course and the police officers who carried out the training.

## Cultural promotion : An indispensable part of foreign policy

Tourism and Environment Minister Fikri Ataoglu accompanied President Mustafa Akinci at the 21st Eurasian Economic Summit in Istanbul.

The Minister attended the opening of the TRNC stand by the Ministry of Tourism and Environment in the congress at which more than 500 government representatives, academicians and business people from more than 40 countries participated.

He said "Cultural promotion activities in an international area, the

image in the world is very important in terms of its prestige and therefore the effectiveness of the foreign policy that is targeted".

Ataoglu underlined that it is important for promotional activities to be coordinated and collaborated with a specific strategy and with all related institutions and organizations, and said that cultural promotion is an integral part of foreign policy.

## President Akinci : Everyone wants peace and stability



President Mustafa Akinci stated that everyone wants peace and stability on the island of Cyprus, and that no one wants the next generations to face the same difficulties as before. Akinci also added that the resources of the island are enough for all its residents, and that everyone can benefit fairly from the island's blessings.

Speaking about his social dinner with the Greek Cypriot leader Nikos Anastasiades following a hiatus of nearly 10-months on 16

April, President Akinci said that he had evaluated the latest situation and exchanged views with the leaders of the political parties represented at the TRNC Assembly.

Emphasizing that it is very important for the two sides in Cyprus to understand each other, to find common ground, and to imagine a common future with a common vision, which Akinci noted can only be achieved by trying to understand one another through dialogue.

## President Akinci: “No new situation on Cyprus issue”

President Mustafa Akinci has said that nothing new was discussed at the informal leaders' meeting yesterday evening (16th April).

President Mustafa Akinci and the Greek Cypriot leader Nikos Anastasiades met last night for an informal dinner for the first time since the talks collapsed in Crans Montana in July 2017.

In his statement following the meeting, President Mustafa Akinci underlined that the sides were still at the same point as they were in Crans Montana and added that he did not observe any obvious change in the stance of the Greek

Cypriot side. Akinci said that this first meeting between the two leaders following a break of almost ten-months was intended to help them better understand each other's points of view.

Pointing out that an historical opportunity had been missed at Crans Montana President Akinci said: “I want to underline, in order to avoid any misunderstandings, that nothing can be the same as before. This is impossible. Both sides have to learn lessons from the Crans Montana process and take these into consideration in the future.”



Stating that he had brought up the issue of natural gas at the meeting, Akinci added that he also warned about future steps, and stressed that the issue of natural gas concerns both sides. Akinci proposed that a committee needs to be set up on this

issue, and if this cannot be done, then the Greek Cypriot side should suspend their activities. If this is impossible, he said, the Turkish Cypriot side will be forced to embark on similar activities with Turkey.

President Mustafa Akinci also stated that ahead of the leaders' meeting he had requested information from the Greek Cypriot side regarding the Aplıç and Derinya crossing points and he was informed that the Greek Cypriot work on the Aplıç crossing point will be completed on September 15th, and that the Derinya crossing point will be ready on July 1st.

## Customs duty removed on goods to Greek Cypriots and Maronites



The customs duty imposed on goods sent to Greek Cypriots and Maronites living in the TRNC by the Greek Cypriot administration has been removed.

In accordance with the TRNC Council of Ministers' decision dated 13 April 2018, supplies, which are provided by the Greek Cypriot administration and delivered by the United Nations

Peacekeeping Force in Cyprus (UNFICYP) to Greek Cypriots and Maronites residing in the TRNC, are exempt from customs duty.

This is under the presumption that these commodities are for personal use only.

Under no circumstances can these supplies transported to the TRNC, be sold or used for any commercial

activity.

In such a case, both the vendor and the purchaser will be penalized according to the TRNC's relevant laws and regulations.

## Wow, how fast time has passed

Frequently it happens that we feel that time is not passing, almost stopped or passing very slowly, and we get fed up and say it out loudly. But the truth is that time never slows down or stops, it does not even increase its pace. It continues passing unnoticed, just like calm water. We do not feel it physically, but ultimately we find that it has passed. Then we say that the time has passed.

But in fact when we try to look back, we see that much time has passed, and we are galloping onwards everyday, with all of the present changing into the past.

I just recalled that it was the year 1968 when I first started learning to use a typewriter. For years and years I worked on typewriters, and then from there moved to computers. 50 years have passed since then.

Looking back it was the year 1966 when a new art teacher taught our class how to paint on a glass. For years I continued painting on glasses, and left no glass unpainted in our house. 52 years have passed.

I must have been 3 or 4 years old, when playing in front of our house, I went away on my own, unnoticed by the other children I was playing with, and lost my way. Someone had found me, and brought me back home, by which time my mother

and grandmother had started rushing out in the area, shouting for me. My father had run to the police station. That had happened some 59 years ago.

It was the year 1969 when my father had sent me to a local drummer to learn to play drums. Since then for years I played on drums, forming an amateur group of my own with friends, and played in private functions. 49 years have passed since then.

I must have been 3 or 4 years old, when playing in front of our house, I went away on my own, unnoticed by the other children I was playing with, and lost my way. Someone had found me, and brought me back home, by which time my mother and grandmother had started rushing out in the area, shouting for me. My father had run to the police station. That had happened some 59 years ago.

It was the year 1969 when my father had sent me to a local drummer to learn to play drums. Since then for years I played on drums, forming an amateur group of my own with friends, and played in private functions. 49 years have passed since then.

At the age of 11 I had broken my front tooth, when playing cricket, after the wooden bails had hit me in mouth. I was the wicket keeper. 51 years have passed since I left playing cricket

At the age of 17 I broke my arm twice, while playing hockey. (I wanted to be a member of the national hockey team), and I left playing hockey. 45 years have passed since that time.

At the age of 26 I participated in my first long distance (6 km) race, and finished last. 36 years have passed.

My first Letter to the Editor (Daily DAWN) was published in the year 1975 or perhaps it was 1976. Since then 42 years have passed.

My first article was published in THE TEENAGER magazine in 1976. 42 years have passed since then.

My father had taught me how to draw a portrait. I was in middle school then. About 52 years have since passed.

It was the year 1985 when the first exhibition of my paintings was held at the Arts Council of Pakistan. Since then 33 years have passed.

In the year 1972 I boarded an airplane for the first time. 46 years have passed.

I visited Istanbul in December 1972, and took the most serious

decision of my life, to leave my home country and to settle in Istanbul. However ultimately I settled in the TRNC, and not in Istanbul, but I am still in love with Istanbul. For the last 46 years my love for Istanbul is still as fresh as it was on the first day.

In 1991 I left my home country for good and landed in the TRNC. 26 years have passed.



The list is too long to be written. There are too many important milestones in my life, like everyone else. But I think the above list is sufficient to prove that time has passed too quickly. The time has passed, and is continuing passing, with the same speed. Tomorrow, looking back, we will again say that the time has passed with great speed. But in fact it does not change its speed.

## Trevor's Tips for April 2018

### Change of Ownership Details on your vehicle Log Book.

If you have followed the correct procedure when privately selling your motor vehicle, the log book must have the new owner's name entered on it within 7 days from the date entered on the Tr 2 form.

The 7 day period includes Saturday and Sunday and any Bayram holidays which occur during this 7 day period.

Failure to meet this 7 day period, for each and every day after the date registered on the Tr 2 form, the buyer will be fined 70TL per day. This is over and above the fee charged to enter the new owner's name on the log book.

If for whatever reason, you cannot meet the 7 day deadline, to avoid being fined, you will need to complete a new Tr 2 form and the seller of the vehicle to go to their Muhtar and obtain his signature on the new form.

Now this could prove problematic if the previous owner has left the island for good.

You, the seller, are not required to go to the Vehicle Registration Office in Lefkoşa with the new owner, but it may be wise to go with him/her to ensure the log book is registered in his/her name.

There have been instances where this procedure has not been followed and you, the original owner, will accumulate all the road traffic offences and fines, because the car is still officially registered in your name. Don't leave anything to chance!!

- Ensure you have your passport with you for police inspection.
- Take with you a postage stamp to the value of 13.5 TL. [the cheaper option]
- When called into the office hand over the documents to the officer on duty who will process your application

## Cyprus Tour with Martin Bell and Julia Berg

In the past I had some email contact with Martin Bell following my review of his book "The End of Empire" which recalled his time as a British national serviceman in Cyprus with the Suffolk Regiment.

Many people of the older generation will remember Martin who was fondly nicknamed "The Man in the White Suit". Having spent his British national service in Cyprus, he went on to join the BBC and in the following 30 years he covered 11 conflicts and reported from 80 countries, being remembered for reports from countries such as Vietnam, the Middle East, Nigeria, Angola and Northern Ireland during the troubles there. He was the BBC's Washington correspondent from 1978 to 1989.

Martin received the OBE in 1992 and that same year he reported on the war in Bosnia. In the 1990's Martin decided to change direction and moved into politics which continued for the next few years.

In 2001 he was appointed UNICEF UK Ambassador for Humanitarian

Emergencies, for children caught up in conflicts or natural disasters.

He has also found time to write several books along the way.

Martin, together with his friend Julia Berg of Prestige Holidays, had organised a tour of Cyprus with a group of people who had previous associations with Cyprus and as I had never met him personally I was delighted when he invited Chris and myself to join him and the group on 18th April at the Colony Hotel in Kyrenia where they were staying during their tour of the north of the island.

We met at the Colony and had a chat before other members of the group started to enter the dining room for dinner and we then enjoyed a nice meal from the very substantial buffet before going to the 4th floor where Martin was to give a talk about Cyprus and his time here. He had arranged for me to sit beside him to answer any present time questions from the group. I am glad to say that there weren't too many!

It was a very interesting talk, ranging from the history of the island to the

Emergency and the present day situation. Martin told us he was a Corporal in the Suffolk Regiment during the Cyprus emergency between 1957 and 1959. Many years later he found more than 100 letters in a chocolate box in the attic that he had sent home to his family, which gave a vivid impression of what it was like to be a conscript on active service during the EOKA rebellion against British rule. He described road blocks and cordons and searches, murders and explosions and riots and a strategy of armed repression. It was these letters and the memories contained in them

that prompted Martin to write his book The End of Empire. Many of the group had Martin's book which he had signed for them.

Martin spoke of the violent process of decolonization, of the character of the British Army at the time and the impact of National Service on young men who were not much more than 'kids in uniform', and the use of force in the insurgency and the campaign to defeat it and of how Britain tried to crush a violent rebellion sixty years ago and ultimately failed.

The general feeling of the group was that the

towns were being spoiled by over development and they were also amazed at the amount of traffic, especially in and around the Kyrenia area. As many of the group were in their late 70's or into their 80's, their recollections of Cyprus were so different from today.

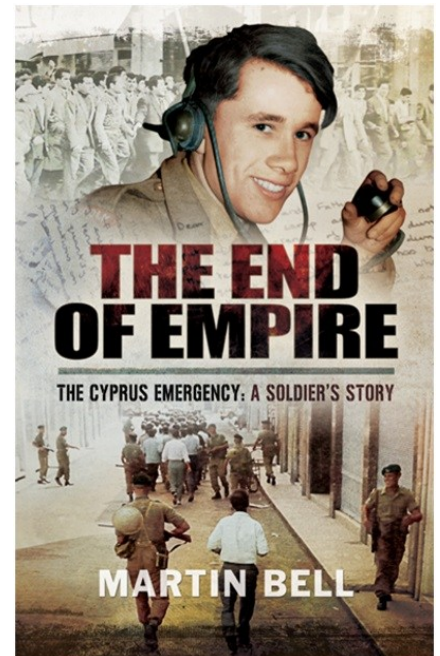
Following the meeting I had a long conversation with Jessie Nagel who was based at Nicosia Airport and was PA to the RAF Commanding Officer who was in charge of 7,000 men. Jessie said she formed the first Nicosia Girl Guide Company which was very successful. I have tried to persuade Jessie to write down some of her memories so that we can record them on our website, so I will have to wait and see if this very interesting lady will share her memories with us.

The group were heading south early the following day, so they were gradually leaving to have an early night. They will be visiting Troodos and staying overnight at Casale Panayiotis, then to Larnaca, Limassol and Paphos during the remainder of their one week tour.

Gökhan and Hale Hançer have been learning to fly a Gyrocopter for a year and both have 33 hours training so will soon be applying for their licences which are issued from mainland Turkey. The couple live in Lefkoşa and have a web design company, ATA Bilisim, they also have 2 young children, Ata and Hale, so we were amazed that they still find time for this exciting hobby. They came from Mersin in Turkey in 2004, when Gökhan attended university in North Cyprus, and they decided to make their home here.

While Hale was flying we drove out with Gökhan to be able to see more of her training manoeuvres, one of which was she actually turned off the rear engine which

drives the Gyrocopter and then she was able to glide it safely before turning the engine back on and doing some more circuits before eventually landing near to us. It was then Gökhan's turn to take over for his session. We watched him circling and also carrying out various manoeuvres before Hale then drove us back to the hangar to await his return. The video below shows Gökhan during an emergency landing training session switching off the engine and gliding in to land.

When the training sessions were complete, Serkan then had paperwork to complete for the couple with the results of that day's training. Everything was very professional and we were

When Gökhan and Hale receive their licences, we hope to be able to attend at Geçitkale when they are presented to them.

They will be able to fly Gyrocopters in many countries worldwide and they hope at some time in the future they will perhaps be able to purchase a Gyrocopter of their own.

We were pleased to receive some additional information and photographs from Serkan. There are new candidates who will be undergoing flight training soon and they are initially receiving in-house instruction. There seems to be a great deal of growing interest in this very different hobby.

This is yet another great boost for North Cyprus tourism and we hope many tourists who have an interest in this type of activity will take advantage of being able to do Gyrocopter or Microlight flying and other air related activities with the TRNC Air Sports Federation.

## TRNC's Ahmet Savaşan elected Vice President of World Health Tourism Council

Tourism and Environment Minister Fikri Ataoğlu attended the Global Health Care Travel Council with 47 delegates from 38 countries as an Honorary Board Member. In its second year a special session of the World Health, Sports and Alternative Tourism fair was held under the auspices of Turkish President, Recep Tayyip Erdoğan.

World Health Tourism Council Founding President, Emin Çakmak, stated that Azerbaijan has been elected to take over the Chairmanship, with Ruslan Guliyev as President.

Ahmet Savaşan of the TRNC was elected as Vice President.

Constantine Constantinides from Greece was elected as Secretary General.

Minister Ataoğlu said it was an historical moment that Northern Cyprus is represented in equal terms with 57 other countries along with all of their flags as well as the flag of the TRNC and he thanked Founding President Emin Çakmak for this important representation.

Ataoğlu stated that they saw a potential of 1.5 billion people in a distance of four and five hours flying to North Cyprus and said "We are encouraging these areas like many countries in the world in order to develop sport tourism and other alternative types of tourism in our country.

We are taking steps to support the function with high legislation and regulations".

Underlining the fact that all delegates gave a positive vote to the Global Health Care Travel Council for election of the Vice-President from the TRNC, Ataoğlu noted that the success achieved was an historic moment.

Ataoğlu said at the end of his speech "I wholeheartedly thank all countries and delegates for my country and our people".

Savaşan: Northern Cyprus has important advantages in health tourism. He said that the TRNC was accepted as the 54th member country to the World Council and that in 2017 he was a member of the board of directors of the World Council.

In his talk, Ahmet Savaşan said that the geographical location, historical, touristic and human characteristics of North Cyprus, as well as the state of the art devices in the hospitals and in vitro fertilization centres, accreditations, as well as medical wellness, spa practices, and price advantages combined with potentials in advanced age and disability tourism, all of which are essential for being preferred in health tourism.

Savaşan stated that the World Health Tourism Council will make a great effort to increase and



develop the existing cooperation with the 57 countries in 2018 to the highest level and declared that "Our aim is to take the Presidency of World Health Tourism Council to Northern Cyprus in 2020 and host the World Health Tourism Forum"

Emin Çakmak, World Health Tourism Council founder ... We will continue to support the TRNC. He said that the projects will be completed and new projects will be brought to life in order for the TRNC to be able to get the rights it deserves from Health and Sport Tourism companies.

Ruslan Guliyev: 1 nation in the World Council 3 states ... Turkey, Azerbaijan and TRNC take place equally in a nation under the umbrella of the World Health Tourism Council, three states in terms of showing the reality of a very great sense of expression.

"World Health Tourism policies guiding such an important international platform in North Cyprus.

We are very pleased that Ahmet Savaşan is acting as Vice President. I congratulate him and I am sure he will give important contributions to the Council and I wish him success".

At the plenary session, which was held with the main theme of sharing knowledge it was decided to hold the 3rd World Health Tourism Forum in Azerbaijan's capital Baku on February 25, 2019, with membership of new countries such as Lithuania and Iran, and various accreditations and certifications of establishments such as hospitals, clinics, intermediary institutions, wellness centres which are active in tourism.

Kansu gave a first full League debut to 19 year old Mustafa Günlü, but unfortunately for the youngster his debut lasted just 20 minutes as he was injured and replaced by Hüseyin Ermiş.

Apart from a couple of shots easily saved by Esentepe keeper Kemal, Değirmenlik attack containing Ex Esentepe forward Turan offered little threat.

The same can be said for Esentepe their only effort in a poor first half, came in the 40th minute when Hüseyin broke down the left and his cross was only cleared to the edge of the box to Yakup whose low shot was pushed away for a corner by the diving Dağman. **HALF TIME SCORE ; 0-0**

Esentepe injury worries continued when in the 47th minute midfielder Mahmut who suffered a heavy tackle in the first half, limped off to be replaced by 18 year old Emre Mutlu.

Suleyman for Degirmenlik was looking dangerous on the left, one such attack he cut inside and shot which had Kemal at full stretch pushing away his effort for a corner. In the 61st minute Esentepe Captain

Başak missed a great opportunity to give his side the lead when he headed a long cross from Muhammed down and wide from a good position.

With no side looking likely to break the deadlock Esentepe took the lead in the 70th minute with a very fortuitous goal. Başak called for and received the ball from another great cross from Muhammed, he passed back to Emre Mutlu, who ran on into the box, but his cross was poor and going into the arms of Dağman before defender GENÇALI stuck out a leg to deflect the ball past his own keeper. **1-0.**

With Değirmenlik pushing up, Esentepe went close again, teenager Onur broke up an attack and ran upfield exchanged passes with Emre Mutlu and continued into the box as keeper Dağman advanced the full back could only toe poke a shot which the keeper saved.

With Esentepe looking likely to hang on to all 3 points, the crowd were silenced in the 87th minute when the visitors equalised. Hasan put over a good cross from the left where SÜLEYMAN ŞAH leapt high and score with a superb header

score **1-1.**

In 3 minutes of injury time Esentepe Ismail Uçar should have scored the winner when a cross fell to him only a few yards out, but the experienced player chose to blast the ball which went over instead of side footing it in. **FULL TIME SCORE : 1-1**

**SUMMING UP :** A poor match, both sides didn't deserve anything more. For Esentepe 2 points dropped and for Değirmenlik a point gained. No good criticising Esentepe all we can do at the moment is try and get 11 fit players onto the field. We have players who are playing out of position, but the Coach has no options. Esentepe had their best 15 minutes of the match, when they created 3 reasonable chances. Firstly a defensive mistake allowed Eser to get in a shot which was beaten away by goalkeeper Athos. Then from a Muhammed free kick Başak shot wide from a good position. In the 30th minute from an Ismail Aslan free kick Eser got in a header that went just over the bar.

ut Esentepe fell to a sucker punch in the last minute of the first half, Ibrahim led a quick breakaway down the left, his cross was poorly dealt with by Onur who miss kicked his clearance straight to YANKI AKTÜL who slotted home. **HALF TIME SCORE : 1-0.**

Esentepe chances of getting back into the game were greatly reduced when they lost teenage defender Onur who was red carded in the 48th minute. Following a bouncing ball Onur was going to belt the ball away, however he completely miss timed his attempted clearance and instead connected with Yankı instead who was poleaxed. Referee Hasan produced the red card, and despite

Esentepe protests, Onur was dismissed I thought it was bit harsh, there was no intent in it, he just completely miss timed his clearance and probably it was his first foul of the match.

Esentepe were now facing an uphill task as GHE looked dangerous every time they attacked, it was only poor finishing that kept the visitors in the match.

Esentepe injury worries continued when Burak on as a replacement for Hüseyin in the 54th minute, lasted 9 minutes with a re-occurrence of an old injury and was replaced by Emre.

68 minutes it was 2-0, Deniz crossed from the right to the far post where YANKI unmarked had plenty of time to score. **2-0.**

Esentepe Coach Davut Kansu gave a first ever first team appearance to 18 year old defender Ali Soytürk in the 71st minute.

Esentepe Eser was limping heavily and could only offer assistance as a passenger on the wing. In injury time YANKI completed his hat trick when Ismail Aslan lost possession to him and with what looked a tame innocuous shot from just outside the

box, which somehow squirmed underneath the body of goalkeeper Kemal. He was very distraught about his error, but he has no need to be, he has saved us countless times. It was his first mistake of the season, it just sums up a dreadful night. **FULL TIME SCORE : 3-0**

**SUMMING UP :** We were very lucky that GHE had left their shooting boots at home as it could have easily been 5 or 6 nil. Winger Ibrahim tormented Esentepe all night, GHE are a very experienced outfit who are now making a late run for the automatic promotion.

Esentepe still have a 5 point advantage with 3 matches left to play. These matches are all against teams battling for relegation survival, there ain’t no easy matches in this League.

Once again Esentepe's small squad was cruelly exposed, and again after this match we suffered another suspension and more injuries.
