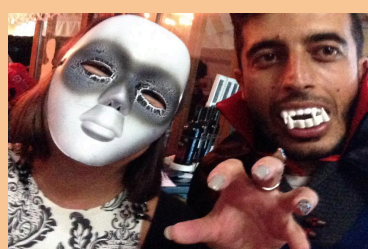

What is Halloween and why do we celebrate? The night of 31st October, is the Eve of All Saints' Day, often celebrated by children dressing up in frightening masks and costumes.

Actually, Halloween is thought to be associated with the Celtic festival Samhain, when ghosts and spirits were believed to be abroad. The Celts, who lived 2,000 years ago in the area that is now Ireland, the United Kingdom and northern France, believed that the dead returned to earth on Samhain. Samhain is actually a Gaelic festival marking the end of the

harvest season and the beginning of winter or the "darker half" of the year. Traditionally, it is celebrated from 31 October to 1 November, as the Celtic day began and ended at sunset.

Halloween is certainly not something you really have to celebrate and many religions don't even celebrate Halloween! Many beliefs celebrate this day as a reason for fun and not as celebrating the ghosts and spirits approach to the world. Halloween is also known as All Saints' or Hallowmas on 1st November and All Souls' Day on 2nd November, thus giving the holiday on 31st October the full name of All Hallows' Eve (meaning the evening before All Hallows' Day).

And how did trick or treating come to life?

In North America, trick-or-treating has been a Halloween tradition since the late 1920s. In Britain and Ireland the tradition of going house-to-house collecting food at Halloween goes back at least as far as the 16th century, as had the tradition of people wearing costumes at Halloween.

In the last few decades celebrating Halloween became really fashionable mostly because of the popular culture, the effects of capitalism and consumption

increase of people all around the world. Do you know Halloween is the second highest grossing commercial holiday after Christmas? Each and every year you see more decorations and costumes and accessories on the market, and every year there are more places like cafes, bars etc organizing Halloween events.

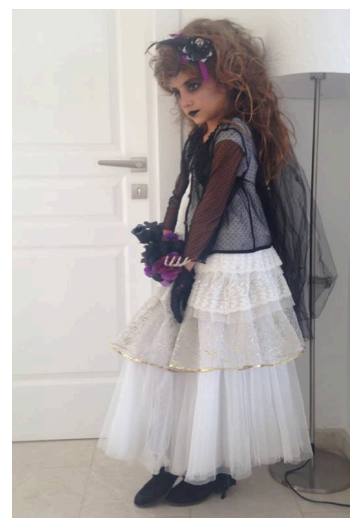

## No longer in position of only observing and protesting

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay made statements to NTV regarding natural resources in the Eastern Mediterranean.

**NTV:** In what way are the drilling studies started by vessel Fatih important? And what will be changed in the region by this step which has been taken with Turkey?

**Özersay:** “We gave licenses previously to Turkish Petroleum Corporation (TPAO) which will start some excavations on behalf of the TRNC and the Turkish Cypriot people within the maritime jurisdiction areas of Cyprus, and the Turkish Cypriot side will no longer be in the position of only observing the unfavourable de facto situations and protesting about what has been done, as it was in the past.

This should be seen as an indication that what we say will not be just words but instead we have the physical opportunities to carry out what we say. The Greek Cypriot side have done things in the past and we could only protest, saying that we reserved the right. We always protested when they made the Exclusive Economic Zone agreements with neighbouring countries and also when they granted licenses and did seismic research. Thus, up to now the de facto situation has always been held against us.

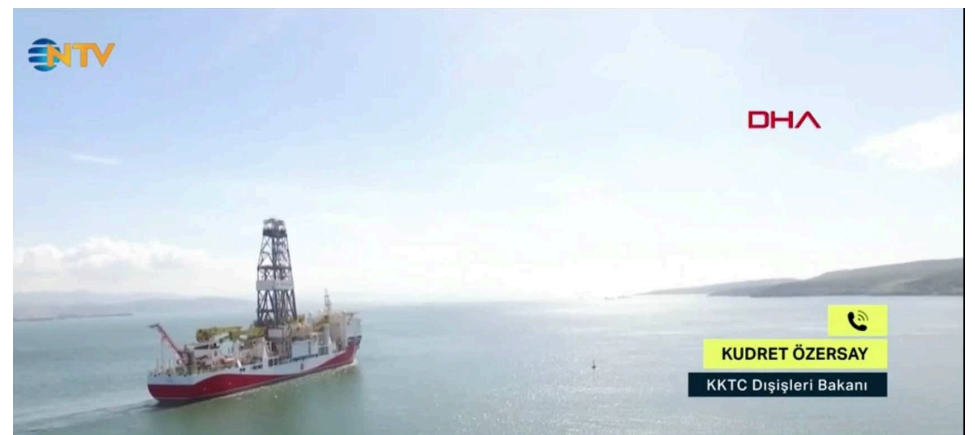
With this development now, with the drilling vessel purchased by Turkey and the second drilling vessel which will be activated after a period, we shall be in a position of establishing our own rights by ourselves. The de facto physical opportunity to be in the field is emerging for us

Of course, these excavations are starting in Turkey's maritime jurisdiction areas but the real important step to be taken will be the commencement of excavations in the blocks declared by the TRNC.

**NTV:** Do you think that if a new negotiation process resumes in Cyprus, these activities will halt again as they did in the past?

**Özersay:** In the past, this was

unfortunately misused in a manner which was against us. In fact, in 2015, the two sides had mutually decided to suspend these works because negotiations were taking place. In the period following this agreement, the Greek Cypriot side continued these works. The Turkish Cypriot side had suspended these works with Turkey. From now on, we will not allow anyone to stop our works related to the maritime jurisdiction areas using the negotiations as an excuse.”



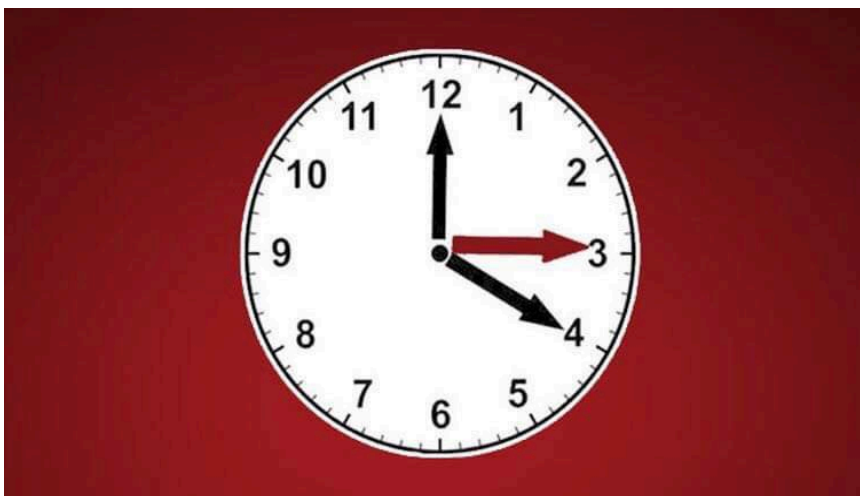
## TRNC Public Office hours

The clocks were set an hour back at 4am Sunday morning (28th October) in line with a decision taken by the Council of Ministers.

Turkish Airlines, flight number TK978, took off from Istanbul Airport on 31st October at 5.30pm local time in Turkey and arrived at

Ercan Airport at 6.00pm local time.

Minister of Public Works and Transportation Tolga Atakan, who observed the arrival of the first plane from Istanbul Airport, said this was an “historic and a proud moment”.

## Fatih sailed to Mediterranean for first drilling

Turkey's first drilling vessel 'Fatih' sailed to the Mediterranean to start the country's first deep-sea drilling operations. Turkish Minister of Energy and Natural Resources Fatih Dönmez stated that for the first time, Turkey is conducting deep sea drilling operation with its own vessel. Dönmez gave a speech at the ceremony held for the first drilling. Dönmez said that Turkey has always supported stability, peace and prosperity in the Eastern Mediterranean, and has taken steps

within the framework of maritime law.

"Turkey will always protect the rights of the Turkish Cypriots in accordance with international maritime law in respect of unilateral and illegal steps. Pointing out that naval forces and coast guard are accompanying 'Fatih', Dönmez said that there is not any security risk but in a situation of risk, Turkey will do the necessary.

that President Akıncı expressed to Lute that an open ended process will not be possible in the issue of the solution for the Cyprus problem and active participation of the Turkish Cypriots in an agreement to be reached has great importance.

## 95th Anniversary of the Founding of the Turkish Republic

The ceremony program started in front of the Atatürk monument in Lefkoşa with the wreath laying of the protocol at the monument.

A minute's silence was observed and the flags were raised while the national anthem was played and the ceremony was completed with the signing of the special memorial book by the Acting President Speaker of the TRNC Assembly Teberrüken Uluçay and the Turkish Ambassador to Lefkoşa Derya Kanbay.

Acting President Speaker of the TRNC Assembly Teberrüken Uluçay, Prime Minister Tufan Erhürman, Chief of Justice of the Supreme Court Narin Şefik, Ministers, Members of the Parliament, Military Staff, bureaucrats and representatives of the associations attended the ceremony marking the 95th Anniversary of the Turkish Republic.

As part of the celebrations, various ceremonies were held in all major cities of Northern Cyprus.



## Indonesia Plane Crash

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay sent a message of condolence to the Indonesian Foreign Minister regarding the plane crash.

In his message, Özersay said, "On behalf of the Turkish Cypriot

people and my Government, I would like to extend my deepest condolences and heartfelt sympathy to the bereaved families of the victims of this tragic accident, as well as the Government and brotherly people of Indonesia."



## Lute to meet with Leaders

The UN Secretary General Antonio Guterres' temporary special envoy to Cyprus Jane Holl Lute will arrive in the island for a day's visit in order to meet with President Mustafa Akıncı and the Greek Cypriot Leader Nikos Anastasiades.

Lute will be meeting with Anastasiades this morning (31st October 2018) and then meeting with Akıncı in the afternoon.

## Mutual trust is the basis to establish partnership state

Stating that mutual trust is the basis to establish a partnership state, President Mustafa Akıncı said that equal participation of both sides for the decisions to be taken in a possible partnership is also the basis, and stressed that the Greek Cypriot side should face the facts.

In his speech at an event, President Akıncı mentioned the opening of Aphilç gate and said that the people of the region had struggled since 2004 and they have made great efforts for the last three years regarding the issue.

Furthermore, reminding that as well as the decision for opening the gates, they had also taken a decision for GSM inter-operability on both sides three years ago, the President said that although the

Turkish Cypriot side is ready technically, they could not progress on the issue, and this situation is not acceptable.

On the issue of a 'loose federation', Akıncı said that an expression of 'loose federation' is getting around and pointed out that he discussed this issue at his meeting with the Greek Cypriot leader and Anastasiades expressed that it is not a 'loose federation' which he demands but transferring more power from the central government to the wings. Akıncı said "If you ask me, I think it does not differ from 'loose federation', only the name is different. Mr. Anastasiades did not provide any specific details on the issue of authorities".



## Anastasiades should clarify his proposal as soon as possible

Prime Minister and CTP Leader Tufan Erhürman and AKEL Secretary General Andros Kyprianou met at CTP Headquarters last Saturday (27th October).

Erhürman and Kyprianou made a joint statement following a tête-à-tête meeting and a meeting between the delegations.

The parties confirmed their determination for a lasting and just solution based on political equality as soon as possible.

Stating that the parties appreciated the decision taken last Friday regarding Derinya and Aphilç border gates which will be opened on 12 November 2018, the parties expressed their support for the

steps to be taken in the areas of mobile phones and confidence-building measures.

Considering the possibility of accelerating the process, they have the intention to meet more often, and Erhürman and Kyprianou expressed that they had decided to organise activities on either side of the island.

In his statement, Erhürman stressed that the next most important task is to start with a well-prepared, result-oriented and open ended process as the UN Secretary-General Guterres had stated in his latest report, and added that he did not think that the suggestion of a loose federation, that Anastasiades brought up recently, is in opposition to Guterres' desire.

### Girne Mayor met with KTEB

Girne Mayor Nidai Güngördü, met with a delegation from the Cyprus Turkish Real Estate Association (KTEB). During the meeting it was stressed that only members of professional organisations should be allowed to open Real Estate Agency workplaces and professional liability insurance should be in place.

KTEB spokesperson Ahmet Davman stated that if Real Estate Agencies are given permission to open a workplace, the Turkish Cypriot Tradesmen and Craftsmen Chamber and KTEB required that membership should be sought. Ahmet Davman also stressed the need to have professional liability insurance for employees working in Real Estate Agencies.

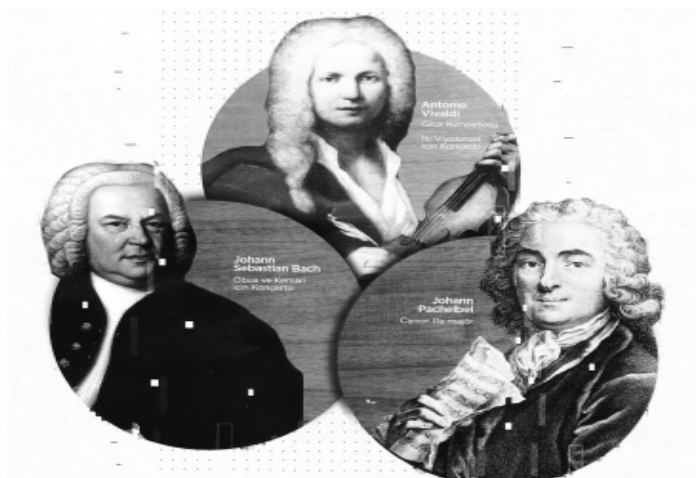

## North Cyprus Trevor's Tips for November 2018

### MOT Late Renewal Charge

The current charge for an MOT is 186TL. The penalty for late testing will now cost 275TL which includes the test fee.

### Vehicle Security

According to a recent survey, Cyprus has been voted one of the safest countries in the world. Although crime is very low here, reported crime has shot up by over 50%, according to Chief Justice Narin Sefik. This applies to personal attacks, car crime and home break ins.

The Government are therefore keen to promote the TRNC as a low crime country in which to visit, live and enjoy. We all have our part to play, you can't just sit back and let the Authorities do it all. The police are informing the general public to think about vehicle security and always lock the car when leaving it parked and to put valuables in a locked boot. During dark periods, park the car in a well-lit area which will go some way in deterring a would-be thief.

If your car is left unlocked or the keys left in the ignition and items

are stolen from the car, or even the vehicle itself is stolen, your insurance policy becomes invalid and any claim made will not be honoured.

Home security is also vital, we should not go out leaving windows wide open, enticing would be thieves to steal from you.

### Vehicle Log Book Additions/Alterations

To make any change to your vehicle log book can be an experience in itself. Going to the office in Lefkosa can mean up to a five-hour marathon. It can be a very frustrating experience due to the number of people waiting to be seen. If this is not for you, Capital Insurance in Alsancak has the answer. For a small fee we will do the whole process for you and your documents will be returned on the same day. For more information call into the bank and ask for Mary.

### In's and Out's Price increase

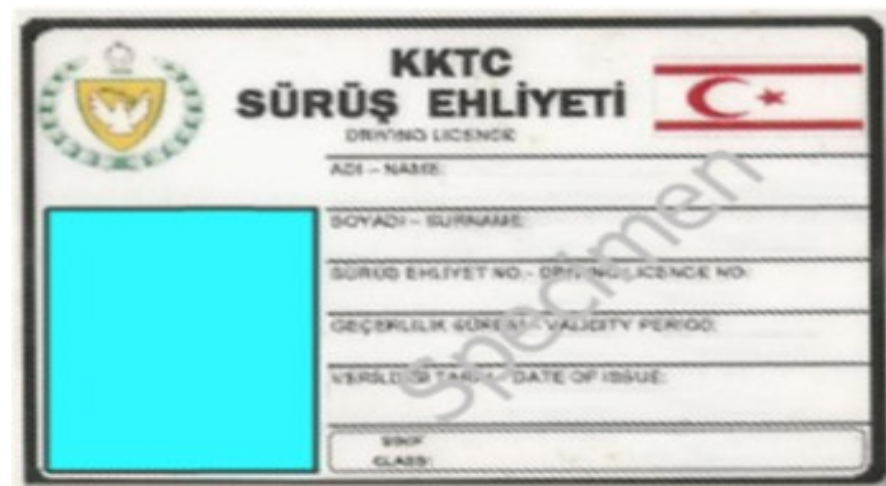
The price of getting your "in's and out's" from a main police station has gone up to an 18-lira stamp.



### TRNC Driving Licence Application for "First Timer's"

Since we started to offer a new licence application service, we have processed over 150 applications, which is only the "tip of the iceberg" trying to get people to drive legally by way of a TRNC licence.

Last week a female driver was stopped by police on one their routine roadside checks. She was asked if she owned the TRNC registered car she was driving and did she possess a TRNC licence. When she said YES I own it and "No, I am only here for eight weeks" the police officer fined her and told her to make an immediate application for one. Goes to show the so called "know it all's" who say you do not need one, don't know what they are talking about!!



### Plastic Bag Charge

The TRNC Government wish to play their part in trying to eradicate the effect plastic is having on the world environment. With effect from December 1st this year, you will have to pay for plastic shopping bags supplied by all supermarkets and most shops for their use, the amount charged is to be decided by the Attorney General's Office.

The bags will no longer be given out for promotions and campaigns either. It is hoped members of the public will play their part when disposing of their rubbish into appropriate rubbish bins and the Belediyesi play their part in emptying full bins quickly.

This will give visitors the impression that our Country is indeed a green and pleasant land which to visit time and time again and take away the dangers plastic is having on our environment, seriously.

### Free Courtesy Car

Because I needed to have my car repaired [non-accidental claim] which took three days to obtain the necessary parts and the repairs to be completed, I needed a car for

the period it was off the road. Under the terms of my policy, a car was supplied by Capital Insurance, absolutely free of charge.

## Trevor's Tips

To make any car claim even more speedy, Capital Insurance will have their very own courtesy car located at their Alsancak branch waiting for the customer to collect and get on living the life for which they came here!

**Alcoholic Beverages**

You may find the price of alcoholic drinks are considerably more expensive now. This is due to the Government hiking the level of tax, and the effect the weak lira is having. We were out recently and were charged 25TL for a local gin and tonic, seems I may have to go tee-total!!!

**Temporary Residence**

There is an additional process for first time applications and people under the age of 60 years which you must follow when applying for Temporary Residence!!

When making your application you need to follow this system to make it successful.

1. Obtain an in's and out's record from the office in the main police station. Don't forget to take an 18TL postage stamp with you.
2. Hand over all the relevant documents to the police officer in the office next door.
3. If all the documents are in order, the officer will give you a form which you need to take to the Interior Ministry in Lefkosa. The staff member will complete the form and put an official rubber stamp on it. [this is the new addition]
4. Return to the police station from where you started the process and hand over the form which was stamped at the Ministry, and in

return they will give you a form for having your bloods taken and the name of the laboratory taking the blood samples.

5. Go to the Koop Bank in Girne and pay the fee.
6. Go to the laboratory for the blood tests and show them your receipt of payment. Then return three days later to collect the results. Do not open the envelope, because if you do you will have to be re-tested.
7. After approximately six weeks go to the Interior Ministry for your application to be completed, taking with you your passport. You must also take the fee for payment, or credit card.

**Car Insurance**

Because of the high cost of accident repair, the fall in the value of the Turkish Lira and the number of claims caused by traffic offences, insurance premiums sold by all providers have been increased.

Out of 86 road traffic accidents which occurred in the TRNC between October 15 -21, one was fatal. During this period, 25 accidents occurred while driving a car, 19 because of failing to stop at an intersection, 17 accidents from driving too close to the car in front and 15 due to careless driving. All this adds up to a staggering amount of money insurance providers have to pay out.

The minimum charged by ALL insurance provider's premiums for third-party is now 450TL. The minimum cost for fully comprehensive insurance is £150. There are no exceptions and all



providers must comply. By saying this, some providers charge in excess of these minimums whilst giving reduced services.

If you purchase anything and value is important to you, shop around and see what you can get for your money, it makes sense!

**Property Tax**

After December, property tax rates which you pay to your Belediyesi in the first quarter of each year is to be increased, according to the square meterage of your property and will include swimming pools. The increase in the amount of tax will be decided in the coming weeks.

**Cash Machines**

Some automated cash machines are charging up to 3.5% on the amount being withdrawn, which is nothing short of daylight robbery!! Why not pop into Capital Bank in



Alsancak and find out how you can avoid these scandalous charges.

**Turkish Visa**

You cannot apply for a Turkish visa when landing in Turkey anymore. The Turkish Authorities are closing down the kiosks in all airports where you used to make an application upon landing and before entry into Turkey. You must now apply on line to the official the Republic of Turkey's e-visa web site [evisa.gov.tr](http://evisa.gov.tr) up to three months before you travel for a cost of \$20 and lasts for 90 days within a 180-day period. Passport control will inspect the visa before allowing entry into the Country. There are some other sites to be found but you will end up paying considerably more.

**Inflation**

A customer needed to replace her car battery the other day, the price for the small sized 12v replacement was 380TL. That's inflation for you

And only the love you give in return.....

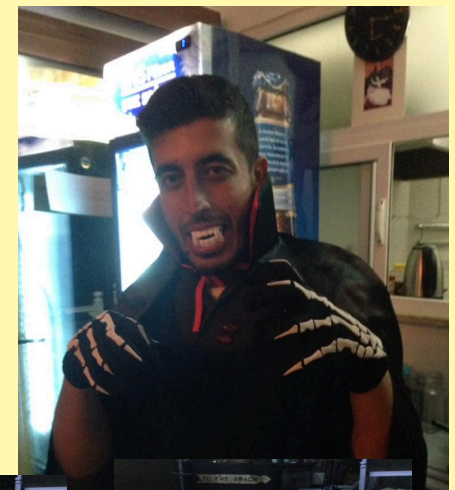
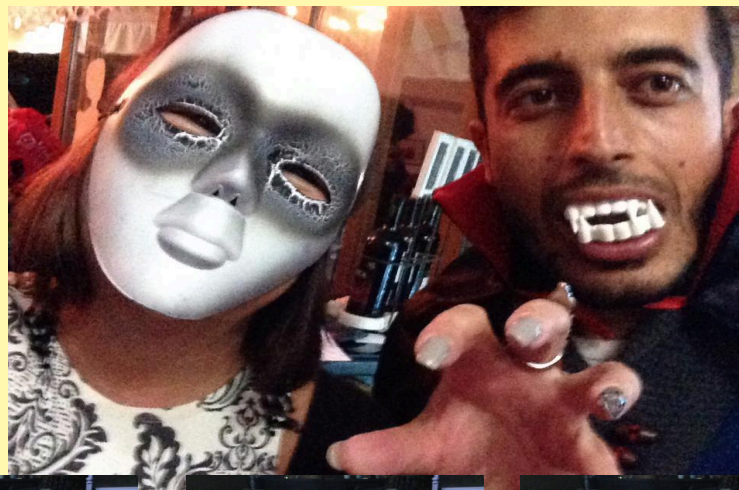

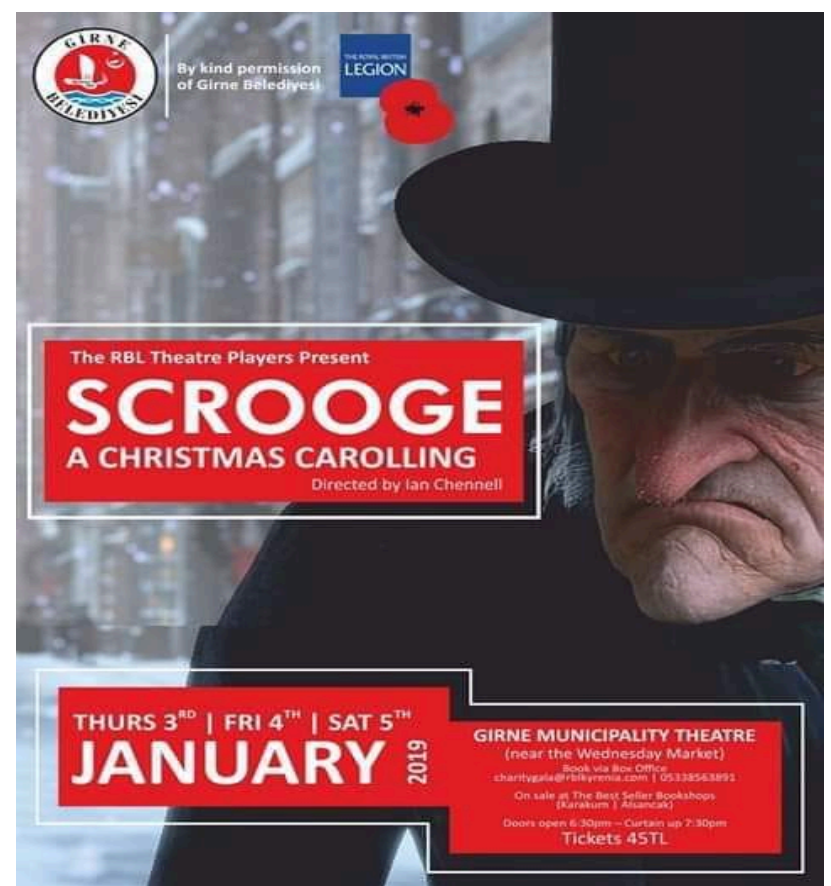

## Davut Kansu leaves Esentepe Football Club.

On the 31st October I read that Davut Kansu has resigned from his post of Technical Director of Esentepe Football Club.

He made his decision after Esentepe were defeated 3-2 on Sunday by Baf Ülkü Yurdu. Esentepe have lost their last 3 matches and have slumped to bottom but one in the League.

We know that when the season started it would take a miracle for Esentepe to remain in the Super League. We have competed well in most of the matches we have played so far. Lady luck has not been with Esentepe, as proved when we had a 94th minute equaliser disallowed on Sunday.

## Esentepe lose out in Five Goal Thriller

Esentepe had a controversial 94th minute equaliser disallowed in this Super League match played at Guzelyurt. It was a much improved hard working performance from Esentepe, but for all their effort they have nothing to show for it.

A glorious sunny afternoon in Güzelyurt attracted a reasonable sized crowd.

The crowd almost had a goal to cheer about in the first minute when Baf Ülkü Yurdu (BUY) Ahmet took a free kick some 35 yards out which had the Esentepe goalkeeper Ali springing to his left to push the ball away for a corner.

**9 mins** : Kaan had a shot on right which fizzled just over the BUY crossbar.

**16 mins** : A cross/cum shot from BUY Göктаş caused Ali some concern as the ball struck his crossbar and rebounded to Joseph who from a good position ballooned his shot over the bar.

Esentepe were working hard as a team, as BUY attacked they defended in numbers and it looked like they would go into the break on level terms. Unfortunately they conceded a goal at a crucial time a minute from the interval.

In an attack left winger Azat did well to control the ball slipped past



Uğurcan challenge and put in a low cross to the near post where Esentepe's Salih and BUY Joseph contested the ball, it appeared that the ball went in off the Esentepe defender but later JOSEPH would claim the goal. **HALF TIME SCORE : 1-0**

**55 mins** : BUY almost scored again through that man Joseph getting the better of a hard challenge with Salih, the Nigerian striker sped on into the Esentepe area with only goalkeeper Ali to beat, however Ali managed to block Joseph's effort with his foot for a corner.

Salih was unable to return after that challenge and he was about to be replaced by Şahin with Esentepe down to 10 men when BUY increased their lead in the 59th minute. Esentepe Mahmut who had just come on to replace Edis with his first touch of the ball tried to pass the ball back to Ali. The ball was played horribly short, where JOSEPH nipped in and rounded Ali to score easily – a very soft goal to give away. **2-0.**

To be fair Esentepe heads did not drop and in the 62nd minute they got themselves back into the game with a goal from midfielder SANE. A Kaan free kick from the right was missed by Esentepe's Odi and his marker fell obligingly to Sane to shoot past Erodğan. **2-1**

From the restart Esentepe scored again in the 63rd minute when an innocent looking cross from Kaan was headed into his net by substitute **FIKRI. 2-2**

BUY should have taken the lead in the 73rd minute when Sane lost the ball to Erdiñç who found Azat on the left, he passed to Hüseyin with the goal at his mercy, but he shot hastily and his effort clipped the top of the Esentepe bar.

BUY didn't have long to wait when they took the lead in the 79th minute again JOSEPH being the scorer, as he leapt high at the near post to head in a Berk corner. **3-2**

Esentepe bravely took the game to BUY without creating any real chances, their cause was helped when BUY were reduced to 10 men in the 91st minute, when substitute Fikri who had already been booked was sent off for bringing down Uğurcan.

Esentepe kept pressing and virtually with the last kick of the game they had a goal disallowed. Mahmut pumped a high ball into the area aimed at Şahin who was in an offside position, but the Esentepe player made no effort to challenge for the ball, Kaan who had read the situation ran on to score.

The linesman had already raised his flag, presumably thinking that Şahin had touched the ball and goal was disallowed. Strong protest from the Esentepe players and bench to the referee and linesman went unheeded and there was no reversal of the decision.
