

# Where is America in the Cypriot Dispute?

The dispute between Greek and Turkish Cypriots could be settled by the US in two days, but the US takes no action.

The Greeks have lived by the guile of their diplomacy since the year 1453, and are the best diplomats in the world. The proof is they have the UN and EU completely supporting Greek positions.

The Greeks have only one objective. Pursuant to the Megali Idea, the Greeks want all Turks to either leave Cyprus or to be subordinate to the Greeks. That is unrealistic.

Secretary Pompeo is pre-occupied with North Korea, China, Russia and other issues. He is not involved in the Cypriot dispute. With Mitchell now out of the way, the US Ambassador in south Cyprus could contact Secretary Pompeo requesting action to bring peace and prosperity for all Cypriots. Does she have the initiative?

The US State Department is a huge bureaucracy rather than the residence of diplomats. If Mitchell, Cohen, and others had ever taken Diplomacy 101 in school, they would understand that both Greece and Turkey are allies of the US. Therefore, the role of the US should be to mediate disputes without taking the side of one country. As soon as the US takes one side, the US alienates the other side. Can the US Ambassador in south Cyprus separate herself from the bureaucracy by contacting a Republican Secretary of State?

If you want to work for the US Federal Government, have a long, successful career, and get promoted, you have to support the Democratic Party. So employees of the State Department, including the Ambassador to south Cyprus, are just waiting for a Democrat to be elected as President. President Trump's election was a rejection of the Democrats by the American people. The only question is whether he will drain the Swamp of Democrats to restore democratic traditions. The answer will come from the new Attorney General, William However, Mr. Barr will not be looking at the US position in Cyprus.

Each nation has its own persona. The French are very different from Germans. The French and Germans are very different from the British. The three are very different from the Japanese. Turks are very different from Greeks. Turks are a resolute

people, the kind who would not give ground to the Allies at Gallipoli. You should never challenge a Turk, because they will never submit.

President Trump does not like the UN or EU. He also does not have anyone advising him about the history and issues of Cyprus. He is ignorant about Cyprus. However, he belongs to the American nation. The American nation supports the oppressed. The TRNC is oppressed. Currently President Trump is supporting the people of Venezuela along with 65 other countries in their attempt to remove the dictator Maduro from office. The UN still supports Maduro.

Daily the TRNC Government blames the Greeks for the problems of Cyprus. The TRNC officials have attended more meetings and given more speeches than anyone can count, but the problem has not been moved one centimeter. TRNC officials have been contacted numerous times about steps that would resolve the disputes between north and south Cyprus, but been unresponsive. suggestion of an outsider is like a confrontation to a Turkish official. They are resolute to do nothing on behalf of the Turkish Cypriot people. They defend their ground like it is Gallipoli.

The solution is quite simple. The TRNC or US Ambassador through the Secretary of State should ask

President Trump to appoint an envoy as the President's personal representative. The person should be knowledgeable in the history of relations between Greece and Turkey, and the issues in Cyprus. President Trump, unlike all the other US Presidents, will take immediate action.

The action to take is for the US and TRNC to establish mutual diplomatic relations and commercial trade. The OIC countries will do the same. The TRNC will get economically stronger. The incomes of Turkish Cypriots will increase, and the TRNC will no longer have its hand out begging for financial support from Turkey. The TRNC will strengthen its own identity.

The TRNC Government will not ask for help like the soldiers at Gallipoli, or Ismet Inonu at Eskisehir. The Greek Army at Eskisehir was about to wipe out the Turkish Army. The Turkish Army was only saved, because Gazi Mustafa Kemal ordered his good friend to retreat to fight another day at the Sakarya River. There is no Gazi in the TRNC, or official who has learned from the Gazi. The Turkish Cypriot persona is preventing peace and prosperity from developing in the TRNC.

Until someone figures out how to contact President Trump so the plight of the Turkish Cypriot people can be addressed, both north and south Cyprus are at great risk.

I have resided in the TRNC for the last 14 years. I understand that to legally own a D.L. you do need to obtain Temporary Residency even if one is over 60 years of age.

# Everyone, including UN, knows that there is no document dated 4th of July 2017

Presidential Spokesman Burcu said that Barış meaningless debate was raging in South Cyprus however everyone, including the UN, that there was no document tabled on the 4th of July 2017. Pointing out that there only one Guterres Framework document which was presented to the two sides on the 30th of June 2017, Burcu added that as has been stated by President Mustafa Akıncı if this document is to be included in

any discussion as of this point onwards, it must be taken as it is, without being watered down or distorted.

The Presidential Spokesman stated that it was clear that such unproductive debates by the Greek Cypriot side did not contribute in any way to the solution of the Cyprus Problem. "Our expectation is for the Greek Cypriot side to abandon such debates and to clarify its vision towards the future of Cyprus" he stressed.

Burcu also said that President Mustafa Akıncı will be attending the leaders' meeting on the 26th February 2019, with a constructive and sincere attitude to listen to

Anastasiades' clarification of his proposal for decentralized federation as well as any other ideas he may have.



# Özersay: The negotiation process in Cyprus has collapsed

Underlining that federal the model based partnership sharing in Cyprus was tried and exhausted, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay stated that the negotiation process in Cyprus has actually collapsed.

his statement to AAcorrespondent, Özersay reiterated that the Greek Cypriot side can

carry out their unilateral natural gas exploration activities in the Eastern Mediterranean in the context of international references as the Turkish Cypriot side has mentioned before.

Özersay announced that the TRNC

Pointing out that there is a duty for the international community and energy companies to encourage the Greek Cypriot side to obtain the consent of the Turkish Cypriot side in the natural gas exploration activities in the Eastern Mediterranean, Özersay said that this was not the case up to now.

Özersay indicated that the Turkish Cypriot side was not in a position to wait for the international community to take a step forward and continued:

As the TRNC we shall use our means, instruments and capabilities in order to prevent the Greek Cypriot side from usurping our rights. We shall try to implement our own rights by ourselves. I think that everyone has noted that we are doing this in a diplomatic and peaceful way.

Kudret Özersay stated that the negotiation process has actually collapsed following the Cyprus

Conference in Crans-Montana in Switzerland and the approach of the UN is towards this direction.

Özersay stated that in the period of the Annan Plan in 2004 it was tried to conduct a closed end negotiation method based on a calendar and it was exhausted.

'It is a proven reality for all of us what cannot be done in the Cyprus Negotiations. A federal partnership based on sharing has been discussed for 50 years in Cyprus and has been tried and exhausted.

If the Greek Side will not come close to a partnership based on cooperation-based sharing, a partnership should be tried.

However if the Greek Side will also not accept a cooperation-based partnership, they will find themselves sharing the island without their consent'.




# Akinci met with US Congress Members

# Anastasiades must clarify what he means on 26 February

President Mustafa Akıncı and Prime Minister Tufan Erhürman held a one-hour meeting today within the framework of their regular weekly meeting.

In his statement following the meeting, Erhürman pointed out that Anastasiades is expected to define his statements so far at the meeting on the 26th of February, 2019.



Indicating that Anastasiades has put forward different concepts for a long period of time and insistently refrains from making these concepts definite, Erhürman said that he needs to clarify what he means at this informal meeting so that other things can be discussed.

Erhürman also mentioned that some issues such as mobile phones and electricity within the context of confidence-building measures did not materialise due to the reluctant attitude of the Greek Cypriot side and added that although the two

leaders agreed on the realization of these issues, the Greek Cypriot side avoided taking the steps, and progress could not be achieved.

Stating that the Turkish Cypriot side will not negotiate for the sake of negotiating, Erhürman said that it was not possible to negotiate on conditions where political equality was not accepted.

Erhürman said: "If Anastasiades' current approach continues at the meeting, it wouldn't be wrong to say that any result cannot be achieved"

# Çavuşoğlu: "We are starting to drill around Cyprus"

Turkish Foreign Minister Mevlüt Çavuşoğlu said: "We are starting to drill with two vessels around Cyprus in the coming days "

In his speech at an event, Cyprus problem and said: "Cyprus is both a strategic target and a national cause for us"

Cavuşoğlu, continued as follows: "Natural resources in the Aegean,

Eastern Mediterranean and Cyprus are a strategic target and a national cause for us. We never let the rights of the Turkish Cypriot people and Turkey be violated and we shall never let it be in the Çavuşoğlu touched upon the future. We are starting to drill with two vessels around Cyprus in the coming days.

> Nothing can be carried out in the Mediterranean excluding Turkey, we will never allow this."



# Come on, Let's Twist Again

Everybody knows that I usually do not use my car, unless it is a long drive. But during the last few days, I did have to use my car frequently.

The FM radio of my car is always Interestingly on all these occasions when I used the car. I found this song on air. I am referring to the title of this article. Yes I mean "Let's Twist again", by Chubby Checker.


Of course I had listened to this song frequently during the 1960s, when the twist craze had engulfed the whole world. In fact that was the period when we in Pakistan did not have Television service, so there was no chance of watching people dancing the twist, but listening to these songs on the radio now and then, were sufficient to make us feel the power of music. Just listening used to make us dance inside our souls.


I remember reading about the world-wide twist craze in that era, through LIFE and TIME magazines, of which my father was a subscriber.

Twist was a totally different type of dance, which had come up in place of the slow dances of the 1950s. Though Rock and Roll was also popular in those days, yet the twist was a far faster type of dance.

I would like to share excerpts from Wikipedia, as under:

" The twist is a dance that was inspired by rock and roll music. From 1959 to the early sixties it became a worldwide dance craze. enjoying immense popularity while drawing controversies from critics who felt it was too provocative. It inspired dances such as the Jerk, the Pony, the Watusi, the Mashed Potato, the







Monkey, and the Funky Chicken, but none were as popular.

Having seen teenagers in Tampa, Florida doing the dance, Hank Ballard wrote "The TWIST" and released it as the B side of Hank Ballard and 'The Midnighter' 1959 single "Teardrops on Your Letter". Dick Clark, having noticed the dance becoming popular among teenagers, recommended to Cameo Records that the more wholesome Chubby Checker re-record the song, which was released in 1959 and became a number one hit in 1960. The dance became passé among teenagers as it became acceptable among adults and the song was released, becoming a number one hit again in 1962.

A world record was set in DeLand Florida, on October 11, 2012, when Chubby Checker sang the song live and the crowd danced. An estimated 4,000 people twisted along with Checker, surpassing the previous Guinness World Record for most people twisting in the streets at once. "

And now after a long, long gap, when a school going lad like me has crossed the 60 age bar, it is really wonderful to find my soul swirling again on the twist beat.


Here are the words of this fantastic song, which I am sure would make all young and old feel their souls dancing aloud.

# Lucky Lucky Luka

Do you remember last year we sent out an appeal to find Luka's owner after he had been found wandering on the streets by some visitors last August. Although we shared Luka's photos and advertised for his owner - no one claimed him.

But Luka's picture had been seen on here and he captured the hearts of Issie and Adam. Adam flew over to meet him and Luka was adopted. Issie and Adam are regular visitors here and they wanted to take him home to the UK. However it had already become apparent that Luka was not settling well at our Rescue Center (where he had been since we were unable to find his original owner) and everyone was worried how he would cope during the 4 month timescale he needed to be prepared for the UK. He was depressed and was also feeling very anxious being up there - not all dogs can settle into shelter life even if they are only there for a limited time.

Luckily for KAR one of our most experienced foster carers had space and agreed that Luka could stay with her (and her many cats and dogs) during the preparation process. Luka is a real character and he certainly made his presence felt at the Foster home and amongst the other pets!

Last week it was finally time for Luka to fly to the UK. Because of his breed (snub nosed) it was decided that it would be better for Luka to fly to Brussels and Issie and Adam would collect him there and then continue to the UK. This involves a much shorter travel time and no long cargo transit layover at Istanbul.

Everything went like clockwork for Luka - he and his courier arrived in Brussels half an hour early and after his entry process was completed he was very happily reunited with Adam - and introduced to Issie and her parents. All 5 of them left Brussels airport and set off for Calais and the final leg into UK - they would hopefully be home in time for tea!

One of the advantages of this option, for pet relocators, is that we can see (without being seen) how airline and airport staff actually handle pets during their travel. We are all aware now of how caring they are at Ercan Airport but often owners worry about what happens to their pets, and how are they treated, at Istanbul.

During Luka's transfer onto his Brussels flight I managed to take some photos - he was treated with the utmost care. Even taking him off of the trolley to go onto the travelator was done very carefully. At one point after his box was carefully put onto the travelator to take him into the aircraft - the Istanbul ground crew actually waved him goodbye!

Again at Brussels his transfer through to Animal Collection was seamless and he arrived via his own personal porter. Without everyone's involvement Luka may not have been so lucky.

# Hasan Eminağa workshop at Girne Municipality Art Gallery





# On the road with cyclist Abdulhalim Akçay: Part 3

As you know Abdulhalim Akçay, a cyclist, is presently touring Turkey on his bicycle. He intends to complete his tour, covering 81 provinces and 800 districts in a two year period. Cyprusscene.com is following him on a day to day basis.

Hereunder is a summary of his ongoing adventure from 13th to 19th February 2019.

#### 77th day (13/02/2019)

Spent whole day inside in Gümüldür area, as there was heavy rain outside. He had plans to go to the Menderes area, but could not due to the weather.



#### 78th day (14/02/2019)

Started off from Gümüldür, towards Menderes and Torbali areas. At the speed of 12 kilometres per hour he ultimately reached Menderes. On his way he had stopped for lunch at Ataköy. The strong wind was creating problem, yet he continued moving forward. He had to stop to do some minor repairs to his bicycle, but luckily it was not a serious fault.

He continued to reach Torbali, where Zeliha hanim of Warmshowers arranged for a night's stay.

The total mileage covered that day was 92 km.

#### 79th day (15/02/2019)

After having a good night's sleep, and breakfast at Torbalı, he started off for Bayindir. There were flowers not just on both sides of the road but everywhere.

Spent the night at Tire.













#### 80th day (16/02/2019)

There were a couple of people who extended their hands to help me in Tire. Left Tire around midday, left for Birgi village.

The whole route was windy, and it took much labour to move forward.





#### 81st day (17/02/2019)

Spent last night in the camp in Birgi village. The night was somewhat cool. He continued to pass through the Bucak village, after passing through a hilly area. From there he started off for Kiraz, which is also an important place in the area.

After Kiraz, Baydağ was the next stop, which he reached at sunset. Finding a place to stay for the night was difficult, however ultimately the local municipality provided him with a nice room to spend the night.





#### 82nd day (18/02/2019)

Started off at about 9am next morning from Beydağ to Nazilli. The route was tough and it was difficult to move on the hilly zigzag road. However there was natural beauty all the way. Here Enis Buğra Tosun and his family arranged for his night's stay.





#### 83rd day (19/02/2019)


He came across some representatives of UNICEF, who took photographs of him. The Karacasu Municipality arranged for his night's stay at the guest house of the Municipality.



# Not just a small achievement by NEU researchers


The researchers attached to the Near East University, have recently succeeded in preparing software, that automatically converts sign language into written text. However small this achievement may appear, it is a big achievement in a field where there is still much room for development and further research.

According to the information provided by the Near East University the engineers at Near East University Faculty of Engineering Applied Intelligence Research Center have developed software which is able to translate sign language for people with hearing disabilities, and turn it into

letters and text for the hearing people who do not understand sign language.

Taking into consideration not only the limited options for people with hearing disabilities who use sign language as their primary means of communication but also the challenges that may confront a deaf person trying to converse with folks who do not know signing language, NEU engineers have developed a sign-recognition software program that can translate sign language into text.

NEU engineers, who have developed many software programs for autonomous cars, for enabling the disabled to use the mouse and the cursor with head and eye movements, for manual remote object control, for the detection of epilepsy from brain signals, for the detection of the sleeping mode of the driver in a vehicle, stated that they had been continuing to conduct different research studies to serve humanity adding that they would share the results of these studies through scientific publications and conferences under the name of Near East University and the Applied Artificial Intelligence Center.



# EMU Students - automated water-feeding station for stray animals

# Esentepe hopes sink in the mud and rain

11 mins: Esentepe equalised with a scrappy goal scored by AHMET ÇAĞER. Junior found Efosa on the left the Nigerian whipped in a cross finding Ahmet whose shot took a deflection off Mustafa before completely deceiving Goalkeeper Okyanus and trickled over the line. 1-1
