Projects in Eastern Mediterranean excluding Turkey not realistic

Turkish Foreign Minister Mevlüt Cavuşoğlu stated at the joint press conference with the Greek Foreign Minister Georgios Katrugalos in Antalya that "Any energy project in the Eastern Mediterranean which excludes Turkey is not realistic. Turkey has rights originating from international law."

One of the top issues the two Ministers discussed was a recent ongoing hydro-carbon tension in the Eastern Mediterranean. Çavuşoğlu stressed 'Turkey has rights to conduct activities to explore hydro-carbon reserves around Cyprus and in the Eastern Mediterranean originating from international law and apart from that the Turkish Cypriots also have their own rights around the island. Even the Greek Cypriot Side, Greece and the European Union are accepting We are not against the explorations however we had a very simple demand for securing the rights of the Turkish Cypriots. This guarantee can be provided through the European Union or other formulas can be found. We have shown possible flexibility on that.'

The Turkish Foreign Minister also underlined that this issue might have been resolved simply, nevertheless although Greek Cypriot Leader Anastasiades accepts that the Turkish Cypriot side has rights, he states that he cannot take any further steps to guarantee those rights. Turkey began its own explorations in the region after the Greek Cypriot government refused to secure the rights of the Turkish Cypriots and said, 'We will start drilling operations in the coming period but recently there has been a proposal for the formation of a fund for the fair distribution of the revenues, we will also evaluate that'.

Minister Çavuşoğlu "Turkey will use its own rights in the continental shelf but it has also, as a guarantor country, the right to protect the rights of the TRNC. This authority arises from the international rights. Therefore, I want to underline that I do not agree with Georgios in this issue. Today, the issue of guarantee is not outdated. Why? We see unilateral drilling activities. Maybe, Turkey's guarantee is more important than ever. We have seen at the negotiations continuing between the TRNC and the Greek Cypriot side that the Greek Cypriot side does not want to share their power with the Turkish Cypriots.

In the same way, although Anastasiades accepted political equality before Crans Montana, he direction after Montana. Adding that claiming that the agreement for guarantee and security is outdated is not a realistic approach, Çavuşoğlu said that they held a Crans Montana Conference which comprised all these issues. Indicating that Anastasiades took a step back at the Crans Montana Conference due to his own concerns the conference became unsuccessful, Cavusoglu added that therefore it is a waste of time to start from the stage left after the failed conference. We are continuing our unofficial meetings to determine what and how we will negotiate and its framework as well. It is out of the question to resume the negotiations from the stage which was left at Crans Montana. We have been giving our constructive messages since Crans Montana.



Inspections by Girne Municipality Health Branch





Girne Municipality Health Branch teams continue to inspect food and hygiene related to the public health of hotels, restaurants, cafes, markets, food production and sales enterprises. The Health Branch teams inspected the conditions of food production areas, personal hygiene of employees, health reports, kitchen, toilet and warehouse areas, general cleaning and hygiene conditions, food storage conditions to ensure that health compliance is controlled.

The Health Branch teams conducted controls of the municipality are based 372 hygiene audits in the first 3 on general hygiene and human health months of 2019. Political equality of the Turkish Cypriot people

President Mustafa Akıncı said "The only point that I am sensitive about is the political equality of the Turkish Cypriot people. Equal treatment should be given to the both sides. This is not an ordinary fight for status. It has a great importance for the existence of the Turkish Cypriot people".

President Mustafa Akıncı organized a press meeting at the TRNC Presidency regarding the friendly football match to be played between Mağusa Türk Gücü and Nea Salamina from South Cyprus.

Akıncı expressed that previously, it was stated that the friendly match would be played in Pile due to its

being a bi-communal region but later the UN stated that they could not provide the security in Pile and it was decided the match would be played in South Cyprus.

Akıncı said: "If the principles mentioned at the beginning were followed, we would also be attending that match. Failure to comply with the aforementioned principles made our participation impossible.

Stating that he never has an attitude not to participate in events in the South, Akıncı stressed that activities organised in the south should be also organized in the north like the cultural activities.

Expressing that it is a pity that the UN cannot provide sufficient security to an organization to be held at the buffer zone, Akıncı said that if they say that they cannot provide the security, they should question themselves. If the security cannot be provided in an

organization that has a few hundred people, it means that they allow the Greek Cypriot police in the south to provide the security. This is unacceptable. The UN should help us to provide support and logistics in such matters.



Özersay attending OIC extraordinary meeting

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay is in Istanbul to attend an extraordinary meeting organized by the Organization of Islamic Cooperation (OIC) regarding the terrorist attack in New Zealand.

On this occasion, Özersay also met with Turkish Foreign Minister Mevlüt Çavuşoğlu in İstanbul.

Former Prime Minister Osman Örek will be commemorated on the 20th anniversary of his death.

The ceremony will take place on Sunday, March 24, 2019 at 11:00 at Lefkoşa State Cemetery.

Wreaths will be laid by President Akıncı and the late Prime Minister Osman Örek's family and a minute's silence will be observed.

Flags will be raised with the National Anthem.

Orek's daughter, Yeşim Orek, and President Mustafa Akıncı will also give a speech at the ceremony.


Dönmez made a statement to the Editor's Desk of the Anadolu Agency (AA) about the agenda.

The TRNC has issued its own exploration licenses and hopefully we shall be making our own discoveries. I hope the Greek Cypriot side sees this and focuses on a model that will benefit everyone."



Stamp collecting (philately) past, present and future

My last column was regarding pen-friendship, where I had discussed how as a teenager I used to write and receive letters from penfriends. I had also expressed my views about the future of penfriendship.

The hobby of philately (collection of postage stamps) is directly related to my previous column.

Just as I was starting writing this column, I had had a quick look on the internet about philately. There were a number of articles written on the same topic, where writers have come up to the conclusion that philately is fast becoming unpopular. There are a few staunch supporters who still believe in the revival of the hobby and are trying hard towards that goal.

Stamp collection used to be a hobby which was directly related to sending and receiving letters by post. Thus in those days, when I was a teenager, whether one is a serious stamp collector or not, having postage stamps of a number of countries was obvious, because almost everyone used to have penfriends.

I admit that I was never a serious stamp collector, but frequently came across friends of my age, who were stamp collectors. They had always been after me to grab some free stamps.

My elder brother was somewhat more seriously interested in stamps as compared to me. But he too could not be declared as a serious stamp collector.

I remember I used to have an envelope, where all the stamps were kept. I was never careful enough to arrange them countrywise. However, frequently when with friends, I used to take out those stamps, and with the help of them, arrange them country-wise, on a newspaper spread out for the purpose.

Once finishing this initial stage, we used to enter into the phase of display and examination of the stamps. In this stage, each of us would put out those stamps where there were more in quantities, asking others if they needed one in exchange for their surplus.

I admit this process of exchange not everytime ended up with a smile on faces. Frequently with the increase in demand of one particular stamp by more than one friend, obviously led to arguments. Frequently my mother had to intervene to calm us down. of stamp collecting. The reason for my pessimism is simple. Since digital chatting has taken the place of pen-friendship, nobody is writing or receiving letters. With a drastic reduction in number of exchange of letters, particularly among teenagers, I do not see any future for stamp collecting.

The physical quantity of postage stamps has also reduced, due to reduction in demand, so who is going to collect them?

Indeed there are some people who are still very serious stamp collectors, and they are doing their best to continue that. I just read an article where steps are being taken

KAR - Story of the Week - "Anke & Rita"



A heart wrenching message from one of our wonderful KAR Rescue dog owners - sad but oh so very lovely

Dear KAR-Team, Dear Margaret,

In May 2007 I had the honor to adopt one of the most wonderful characters you can imagine, a little Cyprus poodle named Rita, your KAR dog No 1584. In our correspondance at that time you assured me that "these type of little dogs are very intelligent and very quick to learn, most of them already seem to know how to get their paws quickly under the table and make themselves at home." You were absolutely right.

Lovely Rita and I had a wonderful life. We never got parted except for good reasons and this was no longer than maybe a week, which she had to spend with my mother who loved her dearly. We walked (in our best times 20km per day), we worked together: she's been the boss of 3 other dogs in my office, and growing old with the years, I finally bought us a garden to spend some chilly moments in. We had one of those crazy 24 hours/365 days relationships.

She's been worse than a husband could ever be ... no chance to stay out of bed later than normal bedtime, no chance to contact people she did not like (and of course, she had the better instinct), she's always been first at any barbequeevent and managed to win the hearts of all my friends, neighbours and colleagues.

We perfectly matched.

But time is cruel sometimes.

Last Easter it turned out, that Rita's heart-problem would need medication. She received Pimobendan and diuretics, we moved from our hot penthouse-apartment to a colder flat, we spent as much time as possible in our garden - that's how we survived last summer. We even survived another crisis last October.

Last medical check in January ... my friend the vet turned his face and I know he's been crying. I love him for this ability but I hated the

reason. I hoped that it might be some more months, it turned out to be just weeks.

I had to carry her downstairs. We never walked too long. We stayed in one room side by side. I slept near to her on the floor, kept her in my arms.

BUT - this strong Lady Rita DEMANDED to go to every place we ever considered as being fine. She wanted to see everything - a last time.

The cardiolgist we saw this day made some x-rays and an ultrasonic which left no doubts. She died 11:39am in my arms. Why do I tell you?

Your business is to save a whole lot of these little souls every day. You try to save them, keep them, make them a way to a new home. You see lots of pets dying, just some of them survive and those which you do give out of your hands - what do you know about their ways?

I'll be certainly crying the rest of my life about this loss. But I knew about it that day I adopted my biggest love. This doesn't save me from crying, but I even knew that.

As I tried to tell you (please don't mind my bad English): Rita demanded to see all her important places a last time. But travelling back to Cyprus would have been more than we were able to do.

But we do have to leave at least a much bigger THANK YOU as in 2007.

We had the best 12 years of our lives.

And since she's gone nothing feels the same anymore.

Work on the Lefkoşa Northern By-Pass to resume soon

Minister of Public Works and Transportation Tolga Atakan announced that work on the remaining sections of the Lefkoşa Northern By-Pass will begin soon, a project designed to ease traffic on the Gönyeli Roundabout thus lowering the number of cars using Dr. Fazil Küçük Boulevard.

Minister Atakan tweeted:
"The problem with regards to the final plot on the Lefkoşa Northern By-Pass has been resolved today.

Works to open the section of the road between Lefkoşa-Girne dual carriageway and Taşkent will immediately begin."

The work on Lefkoşa Northern By-Pass came to a halt in 2013 after the court gave interim orders for several plots, blocking their expropriation.

Boat crews who had their boats in the marina or who lived aboard over winter had come for the occasion, also guests from outside and they all were amazed at the young talents. I





















The Quest - Part 6 - Experience out of the Pyramid

39 years old Abdulhalim AKÇAY is is on his tour of Turkey on his bicycle. He started off his tour on 28th November 2018. He is visiting 81 provinces and 800 districts in a period of 2 years.

CyprusScene is following him through his daily postings in Facebook. Here is his journey from 13th to 18th March 2019.

He had reached the TORBA village in Bodrum region, a day earlier.

He had a long rest in TORBA, from 13th to 17th March. It was the first time during this tour that he had decided to rest for such a long period of time. However, he wanted to take a complete rest, while enjoying the beauty of the region.

Torba is a seaside village near Bodrum in the Mugla Province. Torba is located approximately 6km northeast of the resort town, Bodrum. The hillsides are clad in olive groves and pine forests.



During this period for one day he decided to go on foot, and give a complete rest to his bicycle too. His bicycle was also in need of a complete service. Since this village is by the side of the sea, there is no shortage of natural beauty. The people were friendly and helpful. Wherever he went, people thought he was a foreign tourist, but later on accepted him between themselves, after knowing that he is a Turk, and not a foreign tourist.

One day he went to the city centre to buy an additional disc for his computer, as the previous one was almost full.

He had an interview with the Bodrum News, which was published recently.

So many people express their concern for animal welfare around the world through social media and no more so than here in Northern Cyprus which being a close knit group of communities achieves great success in motivating change.

We recently assisted with the publication of a meeting being planned to bring people together and plan for action and we have received this report from Ralf Purcell of the North Cyprus Animal Carers group (which will be seeking approval as an association) and are sharing this so other concerned people can reach out and support this latest initiative to help street animals.

NCACA meeting

Hi Chris,

Here is the update from last night's meeting (15th March).

Firstly a big thank you to all those that managed to attend it was great to see you all.

I believe the meeting was a resounding success with over 25 attendees, all the topics on the agenda were discussed and agreed upon.

We decided that to be able to increase the quality of the animals' lives and ensure the laws are being applied and followed we need to be able to officially approach the government, to enable us to do

this we need to be an officially recognised body ourselves.

It was therefore agreed by all present by a show of hands that the way forward would be to form an official association and have therefore scheduled a new meeting for the 12th April (Time and venue TBC).

We will now start ascertaining exactly what must be done, what we have to do, how we have to do it to get the process of forming the association started.

Yeliz and some of her influential friends (solicitors) and members of other existing animal rights groups in the TRNC have rewritten the Animal Welfare Laws and resubmitted to the TRNC

Government. The rewritten laws have been processed through and passed the 1st of 2 approval stages within the government and are now in the 3rd and final stage before they are passed into law and printed in the official Gazette.

Yeliz has spoken to all her aforementioned friends and associates telling them what we are proposing to do and asking them if they would like to join us in our endeavours, some have said yes to joining with us, she still has to speak with the others.

I have today (16th March) had confirmation that "The Silent Ones" who were present last night wish to work together with us too.

Turkcell Girne Half Marathon will be held on 14th April 2019

Academicians of Lefke University on Consulting Service in Italy

İbrahim Assist. Prof. Dr. Kahramanoğlu and Assist. Prof. Dr. Serhat Usanmaz of European University of Lefke conducted analysis and training in a pomegranate production field located in Italy after an agreement signed between EUL Director the of World Environment TV Andrea Tucci.

Recently the academicians prepared an appropriate irrigation, fertilization and maintenance program for the production area based in Italy.

According to the press release of the university two academicians are attached to the Faculty of Agricultural Sciences and Technologies Department of Horticultural Production and Marketing of the University.

Giving information about the consulting service, Usanmaz

emphasized importance irrigation and fertilization for improved yield and quality and added that any wrong applications could cause irreversible losses and that years of production could be lost. Usanmaz also said that "In this context, considering the current conditions of the trees, climatic conditions, water and soil quality, taking into account all environmental conditions, it was pointed out that plant development and yield increase can be achieved as a result of the program". On the other hand, Kahramanoğlu pointed out that pomegranate fruits are very sensitive to sunburn, cracking and mechanical damages compared to many other fruits and added that in order to avoid this, the first step that should be taken is trimming.

The academicians pointed out that the season that we are in now is the best time to trim pomegranate and thus they have chosen this time to visit.

After the current situation analysis, the academicians gave practical training about the trimming of pomegranates to the producers and workers. Emphasizing the importance of professional support in production, the faculty members pointed out that not only the production of pomegranates, but also that all of the crop production varies according to the variety, soil, water, climate environmental conditions. They also underlined that the right practice in a region may not be valid in other regions and that the important thing is

to comprehend the logic in production. The academicians emphasized that the next visit is planned in June 2019 and that they will continue to support the producers online.

Kahramanoğlu pointed out that with this consulting service they also had the opportunity to make observations on production in Italy, where we have the same climate, as well as offering an education and Usanmaz underlined that both the EUL and the TRNC were promoted by the cooperation in question.




