



"UN accepts that there is not any ground for negotiations"

Prime Minister and Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay evaluated the new Cyprus report submitted to the UN the UN Security Council by Secretary-General Antonio Guterres.

Özersay made a statement through the social media and pointed out that the submitted report is still a preliminary draft and added that it is not sensible to make any statements at this stage about the report.

Özersay also underlined that the draft report could have been more realistic and added that it is accepted in the report in a fairly cautious manner that there is not any ground to begin a negotiation process. It is also said in the report that if the sides could not begin the negotiations at least they can continue to have consultations.

Özersay stated that being afraid of offending one of the sides by speaking the truth, the UN once again seems to forget to be fair

with the concern to treat both sides equally. Lastly, Özersay said that he will evaluate the report at the

beginning of next week when it will be finalised and share this for public opinion.

Candan speaks to Italian press

Guarantorship and security is more important than ever

Turkish Foreign Minister Mevlüt Çavuşoğlu stated that today the entire world's eyes are on the Eastern Mediterranean and it is an area of tension. Unfortunately, we have been unsuccessful in turning the Eastern Mediterranean into an area of peace.

Çavuşoğlu delivered a speech during the joint meeting of the 99th Rose-Roth Seminar and the Mediterranean and the Middle East special group of the NATO Parliamentary Assembly meeting in Antalya, Turkey and he also touched upon the Cyprus issue.

Regarding the guarantor countries on the Cyprus issue, Çavuşoğlu expressed his disagreement concerning the statement of the Greek parliament saying that "Cyprus is an EU country and the guarantorship is not within the framework of the modern world".

Mevlüt Çavuşoğlu continued:

"At this time, the guarantee of Turkey is very important for Turkish Cypriots and Cyprus. The second issue is that despite all our efforts and goodwill calls to Greek Cypriots, without guaranteeing the rights of the Turkish Cypriots (Greece and the Greek Cypriot side accepted that the Turkish Cypriot side has such rights) the Greek Cypriot side has started unilateral hydrocarbon activities and this reminds us that the guarantee of Turkey is more important than ever in Cyprus today.

On the one hand, they try to operate unilaterally with some countries and they express that 'the Turkish Cypriot side also has rights', on the other hand they ignore it. Then, who will defend the rights of the Turkish Cypriot people? Turkey will defend as a guarantor. This is Turkey's most natural right and the Turkish Cypriot people say that the guarantorship is more sensitive than ever before. As Greece, you do not wish for this. You cannot decide for this. Turkish Cypriot people will decide and we decide, as Turkey, for this. The issues of guarantorship and security are more important than ever in Cyprus today. You cannot underestimate it with statements such as 'outdated or outmoded'.



"Turkish Cypriots are a part of the EU, they are Europeans"

The Republican Turkish Party (CTP) Deputy and Foreign Relations Secretary Armağan Candan gave an interview to the Italian media in Strasbourg during the General Council of the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe. Candan and Italian parliamentarian Roberto Rampi answered the questions of the Radicale Media Organisation together regarding the Cyprus problem. In his interview, Candan said that the Turkish Cypriots are a part of the European Union who showed their will to the whole world in 2004 with their 'yes' votes for the Annan plan.



"We as Turkish Cypriots want to reach peace with the Greek Cypriots in the Island of Cyprus. We are still working with this aim. The Greek Cypriots should share their administration and power with the Turkish Cypriots" Candan stressed.

Candan also pointed out that the Turkish Cypriots cannot carry out direct trade and many other ordinary things under the current conditions, and one of these is that the Turkish Cypriots cannot attend international sport activities.

Adding that the Turkish Cypriots take place at the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe with a special status, Candan said that they have right to speak but cannot vote therefore a way should be found to strengthen the status of the Turkish Cypriots.

Furthermore, the Italian parliamentarian Roberto Rampi

conveyed his views regarding the developments in Cyprus. Expressing that the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe is the only international organization where the Turkish Cypriots are represented, Rampi said that this can serve as a model for the European Parliament. Stressing that the European Parliament elections will be held in the near future, Rampi said that the Turkish Cypriots who are the European Union citizens will not have the opportunity to be represented in the European Parliament. "This is a problem because North Cyprus is a part of Europe.

The European Union should take steps on the issue and especially should give hope to the youth. The Turkish Cypriots are a part of the European Union therefore they do not deserve any restriction, including sports".

Me and my changed handwriting

Everything changes over the passage of time, so does the handwriting too. I never believed that until I found myself changing my writing style.

Before going into detail, I would like to say that my handwriting was different until I came to Northern Cyprus. Once I arrived in the TRNC, I found that my style of writing was not very understandable here. In fact my style of writing was not very common here.

So I decided to change my style a bit.

However just to explain what I am discussing here, I am sharing my previous and present styles of writing.

I remember when I was in primary school, way back during the 1960s, our teachers were very particular about our handwriting. Right from the very first class in primary school, we were asked to write on copies which used to have four horizontal lines, and we were taught to write between the second and third lines. Our teachers would give us homework, where we were supposed to copy the words as written by the teacher on top of the page. I remember any mistake would cost us dearly, since we would have to write the same line or word 50 or 100 times, before we left the school.

So all in the class were very careful and particular when writing English on the four lined copies.

I think I had always been good at writing. My handwriting was quite



good when I was in fifth class. I remember on many occasions I had helped classmates in completing their work.

My father too was very particular about good handwriting. He had good handwriting himself, and was always helping us in improving our handwriting.

So I grew up giving much importance to handwriting. Good handwriting in those days meant additional points in tests.

Oh yes, I forgot to mention that since there was no computer in those days, we all had to write down everything by hand. (I am



clarifying this because I am sure some new generation youngsters also read my column).

So until the age of 36, I continued writing with much care and always wanted to make it clear and beautiful. The long loops, the capital letters and their balancing with the other small letters, used to be main feature of my handwriting. However, after I came to the TRNC, I found that not much importance was given to handwriting here. In primary schools the style of handwriting is different, so obviously there are no long loops, and the alphabets have not been written attached to each other.

So in my earlier days in TRNC I noticed that people usually found it difficult to read what I wrote. They were not used to the way that my handwriting was done. On the contrary I was not finding their handwriting difficult to read.

So I decided to change my style. Now I no longer attach alphabets with each other. I no longer write Capital letters in the beginning of a word, in decorative style. I do not make long loops for g, y, z.

But I can say that even so my handwriting is still good. I like it in both forms.

However there is one important point here which needs attention. With computers now everywhere, people are no longer writing much by hand. So when they write less, their handwriting is suffering. They do not care about the balancing of alphabets, or try to make it attractive.

Nowadays, people usually avoid writing by hand. They prefer to write on the computer. Obviously, writing on a computer is not only fast but is also easier.

I wonder, if the next generation would forget writing by hand in future?

What do you say to it? Just think.



My best wishes go with her.

















CyprusScene is following Abdulhalim Akçay, who is continuing his long cycling tour of Turkey. He plans to visit 81 provinces and 800 districts in a period of 2 years. Here is his diary for the period from 6th - 13th April 2019.

129th day (06/04/2019)

So far he has completed about 4890 kilometres, which indeed is a big achievement. It was his second day in ORTACA. He met a lot of people, including Tarkan and Zahra who represented a bicycle club, and had migrated from Istanbul.







130th day (07/04/2019) The weather had changed. The sun, the sea, everywhere spring was evident. There was an overall wonderful atmosphere and environment in ORTACA.

He went on a tour of the ancient city of Kaunos, which was about 20 kilometres from there. It was wonderful to have a look at the whole area from the top of this ancient city. He took a lot of photographs.

There were many tourists there. He had a nice time looking around with them.



131st day (08/04/2019)

He went to the IZTUZU beach near ORTACA along with his new cycle loving friend.

He spent most of the time strolling around and taking photographs.





132nd day (09/04/2019) The weather had changed again and it rained most of the day, so he put off his plan to leave the area. He was staying at the Hurpedal Nature and Sports Society. However he took time to enjoy the natural beauty of the area. He went to see the ancient graves in the hilly area.



133rd day (10/04/2019)

Once again rain forced him to extend his stay in Ortaca. He spent most of the day inside the building where he was staying. He had started feeling uneasy, as he wanted to go out and re-start his adventure, but the weather was too bad. Just another day at Ortaca had ended.



134th day (11/04/2019)

He left Ortaca early morning after having a nice breakfast with Mr. Tarkan and his wife Zehra. He moved ahead for DALAMAN. He met students of a primary school in SARSALA village, where they showed great interest in his adventure. He wanted to take some photographs, but the teachers there would not allow this.





135th day (12/04/2019)

He had reached GÖCEK in the Dalaman area. However on his way he lost much time after he went in the wrong direction. He had lost his way. He returned back to his planned route after much difficulty. He met a few Russian tourists. He also met Mr. Rüştü, who loved cycling. He spent a good time with him. He pitched his tent for his night's stay in an open space nearby. So far he has completed cycling for 5,000 kilometres.



136th day (13/04/2019)

He has completed about 5050 kilometres since 28th November when he started off from Istanbul. Over the period of time he has gained a lot of experience. It was a tiring day, due to weather conditions. He spent his day travelling around Göcek, Inlice, Fethiye. It was his second day in the area. He was still staying in his tent pitched near to the home of Mr. Rüştü. The terrible weather had started to make him upset. He wanted to continue, but it was too difficult, so he decided to stay for one more day, or until a change in the weather.



Following the results of CBC in addition to him showing positive for Erhlicia and Lieshmania his operation to amputate the leg cannot take place for at least a month maybe even 2. He also tested negative for distemper.

He has started on Allopurinol, Leishquard plus multi vitamins and a buster collar as well as his antibiotics. He can stay at Vet Petite until Friday whereupon he will need to go somewhere they can guarantee he will have all of his medication every day - Allopurinol is twice daily. His leg wound will most probably need attention - cleaning etc. He will also have to go for periodic check ups/blood tests.

All these tests paraband, worming, nextquard and projected operation costs etc excluding vaccinations are in the region of 2000TL. We will create Flynn's own gofund and add it later but..... What we now need urgently is a foster home for 5 months or so with someone who is prepared to give him the love and veterinary support he will need in recovery because we have found him a place in the UK with the help of our friend the wonderful Kathy Ashton and we have until Friday to find one. All his veterinary bills, food and bed will be provided by H4P.



Comfortable Win for Çetinkaya!

Saturday 13 April, 2019 : K-Pet Super League : Lefkoşa Atatürk Stadium.

Fifth placed Çetinkaya had a comfortable win over a disappointing Esentepe team. They were leading 4-0 with 10 minutes left to play, which maybe was a little flattering to them. Esentepe rallied and scored two late goals in the last 10 minutes to make the score more respectable which in the end was a fair score.

The Atatürk Stadium remains a "bogey" ground for Esentepe, in the last 10 seasons they have never won or even drawn here and in Saturday's match they never looked like breaking that "voodoo". Three matches ago after winning two consecutive matches, morale and confidence were high, now after losing their last two matches and conceding 10 goals, that has deserted them and they are not looking like a team that can escape relegation through the Play Offs.

They only have themselves to blame they should have gone into the interval leading, missing a couple of glorious chances. Like Brit-exit hopes Esentepe defence then disappeared for 30 minutes allowing Çetinkaya to take a comfortable 4-0 lead. This was mainly due to the efforts of Çetinkaya's "foreign imports" Africans Faye Bapiste, Ugochukwu and Herve Amoni who as a trio were very impressive and they were the main difference between the two teams.

In fairness to Esentepe, they rallied in the last 10 minutes, pulling the score back to a more respectable 4-2, and it could have been closer when they had a penalty appeal turned down after an Ahmet cross had struck a defenders hand.



A week ago the Atatürk Stadium was an arena full of noise a great atmosphere created by a large crowd as leaders Yenicamı and second placed Mağusa Türk Gücü clashed.

For Saturday's match there were barely a 100 spectators in the ground (capacity 26000), there was no noise nor atmosphere it was more like a morgue. With the weather being warm and muggy this probably was the reason for such a lethargic start to the match.

MATCH NOTES:

22 MINS : Esentepe had a great chance to take the lead following a long free kick on the right by Mahmut, central defender Mustafa Kiliç rose unchallenged but sent a poor header wide from a good position

25 mins : Çetinkaya had a great opportunity themselves to open the score, when Esentepe goalkeeper Onur made a hash of clearing a back pass, he miss kicked the ball straight to Ugochukwu who, presented with an open goal, shot wide.

31 mins ; UGOCHUKWU did get on the scoresheet eventually when Onur could only parry a dangerous cross from the left by Herve straight into the path of the African striker to score easily. **1-0**

Match action with Esentepe in red

45 mins : Esentepe wasted another opportunity to equalise when good work on the left by Efosa beating a couple of players, setting up Yakup in a great position. The young midfielder was forced wide by goalkeeper Cenk and saw his shot blocked by a defender on the line, the ball rebounded to Yakup but he blasted a cross/shot wide.

HALF TIME SCORE : 1-0.

46 mins : A great cross by Çetinkaya right back Tunç saw Herve head weakly wide.

47 mins; Junior did well winning the ball back from an opponent on the right, he cut inside the box and hit a left footed shot that was saved by the diving Cenk.

50 mins : Herve had another chance after being put through but sent his shot high over the bar.

51 mins ; Esentepe goalkeeper Onur made a good diving save from a header from Ugochukwu following a Çağdaş cross.

55 mins : Çetinkaya increased their lead with another simple goal. Herve crossed to the far post from the left where an unmarked UGOCHUKWU scored his second match goal **2-0** **64 mins** : Esentepe's Junior lost possession of the ball to Herve on the left who outstripped Vurkan before sending over a cross for FAYE to score easily. **3-0**

70 mins : A cross from the right by Ugochukwu was missed by Faye and Onur leaving HERVE AMANI a free diving header at the far post. **4-0**.

This meant all of the Çetinkaya's goals not only were scored by their African players they also provided the assistance for their colleagues to score as well.

82 mins : A good goal by Esentepe's UĞURCAN who cut inside the area from the right and sent an unstoppable shot past Cenk that hit the far post before nestling into the net. 4-1.

86 mins: Good work on the right by Uğurcan and substitute Emre set up EFOSA FRANCIS to score with a shot that took a deflection off a defender and into the net. **4-2**

87 mins : another one of Esentepe replacements Ahmet had a left wing cross that appeared to hit the hand of a defender, but referee Osman and his linesman were having none of it despite Esentepe appeals.
