Maybe it is time to make a change in our current paradigm

Özersay: "Maybe it is about time that we make a change in our current paradigm"

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay received Turkish Minister of Defence Hulusi Akar, Chief of General Staff, Full General Yaşar Güler as well as the Commanders of the Turkish Air, Land and Naval Forces.

Stating that the visit of Minister Akar, Chief of General Staff Full General Yaşar Güler and the Force Commanders was meaningful and made at a crucial time, Özersay said:

"Your existence and visit ensure peace, security and, most importantly, stability. We are of the opinion that the message should be recognised by everyone."

Minister Akar pointed out that welfare, peace and security of the Turkish Cypriots are important to them and further remarked:

"Political equality and security of the Turkish Cypriots are indispensable for us. No compromises can be made on this issue, nor can it be distorted".

Stressing that the Turkish Cypriots want to see beyond, Akar stated:

"We know and accept the fact that the parties would not gain anything from the processes initiated for the sake of having negotiations. This should also be taken into consideration. Turkey has no imposition regarding the solution model in Cyprus. We are not excluding any solution model either"

Indicating that they will not allow a fait accompli in Cyprus on any matter, Akar said, "We would like to clearly point out that it is impossible to put such decision and implementation into practice".

Erenköy Resistance on August 8, 1964, which is one of the turning points in the history of the Turkish Cypriot struggle and those who lost their lives during this resistance, was commemorated yesterday (8th August).

The ceremony was held with the participation of President Mustafa Akıncı, Speaker of the TRNC Assembly Teberrüken Uluçay,

Prime Minister Ersin Tatar, state and government officials, as well as Turkish Defence Minister Hulusi Akar, Chief of Turkish General Staff Full General Yaşar Güler and Force Commanders.

Many university students who were then studying in Turkey and also more than 500 young Turkish Cypriot people from the UK came to the island by boats in 1964 and

struggled against the Greek Cypriot attacks in a critical struggle together with the people in the Erenköy region and this has been a cornerstone in the struggle for existence of the Turkish Cypriot people.

18 people in 1964 and 3 people in 1974 lost their lives in Erenköy.



Donmez: Yavuz has started drilling in Eastern Mediterranean

Turkish Minister of Energy and Natural Resources Fatih Donmez stated that as of yesterday (7th August) the Yavuz drilling ship had reached a boring depth of 1,710 metres.

Minister Donmez, who came to the TRNC on the previous day to examine the drilling on-site, made a statement to a group of journalists. Donmez, who stated that the Yavuz drilling ship had started drilling, said "As of 7th August we have reached approximately 1,710 metres of depth of boring. Drilling The Minister reminded that last will be continued for approximately $2\frac{1}{2}$ to 3 months. We hope that when offered to we reach the target point, we will have located the presence of natural gas here."

He also stated that they always stand behind the rights and interests of the Turkish people who live in and they acknowledge the unlawful fait accompli which is carried out unilaterally by the Greek Cypriot Administration.

Akar also added: "We are in favour of the peaceful solution of the problems in Cyprus, in the Aegean and in the Eastern Mediterranean within the framework of good neighbourly relations and respect for international law.

Dönmez: "Hydrocarbon issue should increase peace and prosperity

Turkish Minister of Energy and Natural Resources Fatih Dönmez expressed his wish that especially hydrocarbon resources should serve towards increasing peace, tranquillity and prosperity instead of an issue of discussion which has been continuing for many years.

Dönmez came to the island for a one-day official visit yesterday (6.8.19) and during his meeting with Tatar, he pointed out that the relations with the TRNC are continuing to develop.

Mentioning the negative response concerning the proposal of the Turkish Cypriot side to the Greek Cypriot Administration regarding establishing a joint committee, Dönmez stated that they hope that the Greek Cypriots will reconsider their decisions and that this proposal should be taken seriously to ensure peace and stability on the island.

In his speech, Ersin Tatar noted that steps have been taken in order to protect the rights and interests

arising from international agreements, and said that the Turkish Government's

determination, stance, and selfsacrifice at this point are very important for them.



Özersay answered AA reporter's questions

Stating that the unofficial meeting of Akıncı and Anastasiades will be held with an open agenda on Friday, August 9, 2019, Özersay said: "In my opinion, there will be a meeting during which some will issues be discussed confidence-building concerning and maybe measures some decisions can be taken.

I have to say that I do not have high expectations regarding the comprehensive settlement negotiations or in the context of a comprehensive settlement."

Indicating that the Greek Cypriot side will probably try to make some initiatives that will enable them to take part in the process

regarding the closed city of Maraş, Özersay stressed that the TRNC government does not feel this would be right.

Mentioning that on the one hand, the Greek Cypriot side is trying to exclude the Turkish Cypriot side from the process of the natural gas issue, on the other hand it is not acceptable to ask for the right of say in the closed city of Maraş. Ozersay said that the Greek Cypriot side leadership will want to prevent us from carrying out activities regarding the natural gas issue.

Özersay continued:

"If they come to us with the should suggestion that we establish bi-communal

committee together on natural gas and will discuss these issues among ourselves, we should not approach this positively, because what we want is not just a dialogue between the two sides. The decision-making process must be together as it relates to the resources to which we have a right."

Mentioning that the closed city Maraş is a part of the TRNC and the buffer (military) zone which is under the control of the Turkish Cypriot Armed Forces, Ozersay said: "We are authorised here. Of course, we can decide for the region to be converted from a military region, to a civilian region after 50 years."

Greek Cypriots should reconsider joint committee proposal

President Mustafa Akıncı stressed that the proposal he made on 13 July 2019 to establish a joint committee on the hydrocarbon issue, should be re-evaluated by the Greek Cypriot side and he called on the third parties.

Akıncı met with the leaders of the political parties represented at the TRNC Assembly. Akıncı made a statement following the meeting and shared the common evaluations with the public.

In his statement, Akıncı mentioned that he would go to the meeting with the Greek Cypriot leader Nikos Anastasiades on 9th of August with "good faith and a constructive spirit" as the Turkish Cypriot side and stressed that they

will also continue with their constructive understanding at this meeting.

Akıncı continued:

The Turkish Cypriot people have very important sine qua nons in whatever solution is to be found. One of them is political equality and effective participation in decisions. During the meeting, sensitivity on this issue was underlined. "I would like to point out that it is time for the Greek Cypriot leader to become clear on this issue."

Akıncı said that they also evaluated the hydrocarbon issue at the meeting and said:

"The Greek Cypriot side

categorically rejected the proposal earlier. This was extremely wrong. It is our common belief that there is great interest in reconsidering this proposal once again."

President Mustafa Akıncı also called for support from the third parties.

Akıncı also stressed that the third parties should support this proposal in order to turn the hydrocarbon issue from a source of tension to a source of cooperation in the Eastern Mediterranean and they should also carefully review the proposal and convey the necessary messages to the Greek Cypriot side.



Turkey will always protect legitimate rights



Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan stated that Turkey will always protect the legitimate rights of the Turkish Cypriots.

According to the AA news, in his speech at an event, Erdoğan said: "We cannot remain indifferent to the initiatives of gas and sabotage undertaken in the name of "drilling in the region".

Erdoğan continued:

"Stability in the Eastern Mediterranean and Cyprus is only possible with the observance of Turkey and the TRNC's rights and interests. We will continue to always protect the legitimate rights of the Turkish Cypriots."

Approach by Greek Cypriots regarding Maraş should be avoided

Özersay: "The approaches that will involve the Greek Cypriot leadership regarding Maraş process should be avoided"

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay issued some warnings and stated that the approaches that will involve the Greek Cypriot leadership regarding the Maraş process should be avoided at the meeting which will be held between President Akıncı and the Greek Cypriot leader Anastasiades on August 9, 2019.

In his statement to the Turkish News Agency, Özersay said: "There was some news in the Greek Cypriot press regarding Anastasiades bringing up the Maraş issue in the agenda for the meeting on August 9, 2019, and will ask for the establishment of a

committee on this issue. This is not acceptable to us as the Government of the TRNC.

Maraş has been discussed several times between the two sides for many years whether it can be a confidence-building measure or not, yet it has not reached a solution because of the strict attitude of the Greek Cypriot side. Now we cannot accept entering the same vicious circle.

While we have started to take steps concerning the closed city Maraş as the government of the TRNC, it is not possible to accept an interruption to this process which we initiated and including the Greek Cypriot side in the Maraş process one way or another, is out of the question.

Özersay continued: "Property rights of former owners are protected in different ways with the decisions taken by the Immovable Property Commission (IPC) such as the options return, compensation exchange, and this is possible by the decisions of the European Court of Human Rights within the TRNC as well.

The same situation is also valid for Maraş. There is no need for UN control to prevent any prejudice to people's property rights. Basically IPC law, our own legislation, and the European Court of Human Rights decisions are essential, not the decisions of the Security Council, which are shaped on a political and cyclical basis.

Çavuşoğlu spoke within framework of the 11th Ambassadors' Conference held yesterday (05/08/2019)

Noting that the Greek Cypriot Administration continues to see itself as a unitary state and the sole owner of the island and the Turkish Cypriots as a minority, Çavuşoğlu said that it is this mentality that has resulted in the failure of the negotiation processes within the framework of the United Nations (UN) since 1968.

Pointing out that the Greek Cypriots still lack the will to share political equality and prosperity with the Turkish Cypriots, Cavusoğlu said that the latest example of this is the Greek Cypriot hydrocarbon activities in the Eastern Mediterranean.

Çavuşoğlu added: "I would like to emphasize once again determination to protect the rights of our country on the continental shelf

recorded by the UN and the fundamental rights of Turkish Cypriots on natural resources. Our stance is sharp and clear on this issue.



TRNC Ministry appeals for cooperation to reduce traffic accidents

The Ministry of Public Works and Transportation issued a statement appealing to the public to give support and cooperation to minimise traffic violations and accidents, especially those which result in death and serious injuries.

In the statement, the Ministry said everything possible was being done for a better infrastructure to make roads safer but indicated that we as people cannot sit and do nothing just because these works are not being completed as rapidly as they should.

The Ministry added that besides infrastructure, they were working to reform driver education, licence and traffic fines systems and will not give up just because they were being criticised by those who wish to protect the status quo.

"Until we improve the infrastructure and the traffic system in coordination with other state departments, what we need is total cooperation of the people", the statement said.

The Ministry explained cooperation as: complying with traffic rules, especially speed limits and driving by taking the condition of the roads into consideration.

The Ministry said "We should not drive if we are under the influence of alcohol, taking medication which could adversely affect driving standards and without using seat A driver's eyes should always be on the road. We should police each other and not hesitate to warn other drivers and inform authorities in the event of coming across traffic violations.

We are taking steps on road safety, licence system, speed cameras and vehicle inspection system. We are working to minimise the part the in road infrastructure plays accidents. We will continue working to correct the inadequate system but again, when lack of infrastructure meets a culture of

violations on the roads, we as the people need to do something about it. Until we reach our target which is to educated drivers and an infrastructure free of problems, we need to respect and take care of each other in traffic."

Everyone involved in the KAR cat catching programme so far this year - Thank you.





Looking back - Erenkoy the Truth is Told

The 2019 commemoration at Erenkoy took place on Thursday 8th August, now marking 55 years since the Siege of Erenkoy ended with the intervention of the Turkish Air Force.

I was fortunate to be able to make the trip to Erenkoy in 2013 and 2014 by way of the usual convoy of transport which is escorted by the UN and Police from the meeting place in Yeşilirmak.

Sadly, with August being such a hot month, I have not made the visit again but, as my adopted homeland, I can still recall the emotion felt at this very moving ceremony.

Following the visit in 2014 I wrote an article entitled "Erenkoy 50 years on" and this can be viewed on the link shown below.

A fine example of this is to try a Google search on "Erenköy Siege" and you will find Wikipedia shows a limited choice and in fact your attention is drawn to the fact that the village of Erenköy was called Kokkina.

So what of Erenköy, perhaps at the first search through Wikipedia we are told of the siege of Erenköy but is this the complete story and is it complete and correct?

If it were possible to read and understand the Turkish and Greek press we may find differences of opinion so let's start with an overview of its reported history.

Having visited the village twice I was able to realise my dream of learning more about the dramatic defence of Erenköy (Kokkina) which was defended from April 1964 by initially Turkish Cypriots including 500 Turkish Cypriot

which was set up to counter the attacks on the Turkish Cypriot community by EOKA.

A small number of volunteers including those from Britain had managed to get through the Greek security lines but the total defenders remained very few and they were only armed with lightweight weapons. The area defended originally consisted of 5 villages but the defenders were eventually forced back to make their last stand here in Erenköy.

With the mountains surrounding this pretty bay being taken over by Greek and Greek Cypriot armed forces whose numbers swelled from 1,500 to 3,000, from the 6th August 1964 the fire power they directed down into the village; from artillery and mortars, was devastating and the defenders were also attacked from their rear by two Greek Cypriot patrol boats from the sea.

Following Operation Attila 2 of the Peace Intervention by the Turkish Armed Forces in 1974 the Turkish forces were not able to break through to this last enclave, so to this day the Erenköy uninhabited enclave remains under the protection of the TRNC armed forces with a UN contingent nearby creating a buffer zone.

Within the enclave at the village cemetery, there are 13 carefully tended graves of Turkish Cypriots who were killed at the siege at Erenköy. The village itself still carries heavy battle damage and to see the caves created as protection from the overwhelming artillery fire is frightening. There is a museum which was created from the refurbished mosque and this contains fine photographs showing the heroes who fought there and also the families who had nowhere to go and managed to survive the horrific assault by the Greek forces and the Greek National Guard.

Considering the small number of defenders, who mostly had very little military training and were armed with either homemade guns, shotguns or relics from another era, it was a miracle they held their ground against overwhelming odds.

Yes they were supported with a very limited supply of modern light weapons which came from Turkey and this did help them in their seemingly impossible task.

So on my second trip to the village I visited the cemetery where the fallen are buried and remained there with the local media crews to record and write of the experience when two helicopters flew in carrying the TRNC President, the Minister Prime and other dignitaries who came into the cemetery to pay their respects and give comfort and support to the relatives of those who had fallen in this struggle for survival.

In that short period of time of the

ceremony and with the sound of bands, speeches and the saluting gunfire and the smell of the wafting gun smoke you could see in the eyes of everyone there, the sadness and also the fierce pride to overcome adversity that is the hallmark of the Turkish Cypriots.

We read so much of the injustice of what was the Turkish Peace Intervention on 20th July 1974 which saved so many lives and brought peace to the Turkish Cypriots in North Cyprus guarded by Turkey and embargoed by the rest of the world. It is said by the Greek Cypriots that the Cyprus problem started in 1974 on the 20th July, this is far from the truth, there was fighting and unrest and

attacks on the Turkish Cypriots by Greek Cypriots and Greeks in the name of Enosis as far back as the 1950's and this is fact

Let's remember that President Makarios stood before the UN Assembly on the 19th July 1974 and stated his country had been invaded by Greece and was being aided by Greek Cypriot extremists and called for help.

Back to Erenköy and we read even now in the press of the barbaric air attack on Greek Cypriot villages but no mention of the offensive action being perpetrated. There is no mention of the Greek and Cypriot Greek aggressors surrounding this little village and attempting with Artillery forces Naval to seek its destruction including its inhabitants and defenders. You can only read and wonder what may have happened if the defence of Erenköy had been unsuccessful, could it have been another Srebrenica type disaster with the word genocide entering the history of Cyprus yet again... If all people can accept the TRUTH of the history of Cyprus and come to terms with it, then maybe there can be hope of peace and harmony for the future of this island.





From past to present and a memory of an accident not forgotten

The year was perhaps 1961 or 1962. I was in primary school. We were living in Karachi, Pakistan.

Our school was quite a distance from our house, so I was using the school van, which was picking me up in the morning from our house and dropping me back after school finished. It was a small van, which could accommodate perhaps 10 children plus 2 teachers and one driver. I remember the colour of our school van was green.

Karachi at that time was going through a phase of expansion, and new plotting had been done in areas just out of the city. The area of Hydari Chowk, which now is one of the busiest areas and shopping centres of the city, used to be a very far away place, where one could find one or two houses in an area of say 2 - 3 kilometers. The roads were not properly made up, and there was no electricity in the area. It was a far-flung area with very few houses.

One of the students of our school used to live in that area, so every day the van used to drop him at his house. For all of us, it was nothing more than a free long drive, which we all enjoyed.

One day, around midday, when we were enjoying our ride in that remote area, the driver stopped the van abruptly on the side of the road. There was an accident. In those days, there were not many cars in that area. There was not even a bus service.

Someone had perhaps selected the

area to learn to drive a car. As we looked out of our van, a car had badly hit a pole or maybe a tree, which I do not remember now. The door of the car was open and the body of the driver was half inside and half out of the door. The other fellow in the car had perhaps hit his head on the windshield. Both the persons were unconscious and bleeding.

In those days there were no mobile telephones to call for an ambulance or help. In fact there were not even telephones in that area. So as an emergency, our driver took all of us out of the van, and he picked up the two unconscious injured persons and put them on the floor of our van.

Along with our teachers, we had all vacated the van. The driver hurriedly took the injured persons away to the hospital, which was maybe at the distance of over 15 or 20 kilometers. So we all sat by the road along with our teachers and waited for the return of the van.

Curiously, we were all very eager to see the damaged car, but our teachers had told us not to look at the car, as there was blood everywhere. But of course, there was no way out but to see



the blood. That was the first time, I had ever seen an accident and human blood and injured people.

Our van returned after about an hour, and we got back on board. There were bloodstains here and there on the seats and on the floor of the van. We reached home late that day.

For me, it was an unforgettable incident. I remember innumerable times I had narrated the incident at home and to other friends, even when I had grown up. It was an incident, which I could not forget, and is still fresh in my memory.

Very recently, I came across a fellow on Facebook, who had a direct connection with the above incident.

There is a group named "OLD KARACHI", on Facebook, where people from my generation, and the new generation, frequently discuss the old memories of the city. The members of the group usually share old photographs of Karachi city, and then the members share their memories regarding that particular area or building or shop, by way of comments.

One day someone posted an old and a new photograph of Hyderi Chowk. Many members commented on that. I wrote about the above incident as my memory about that area.

In response to my comment, a fellow of my age commented back and told me that he is the son of the man who had got injured in that particular accident. He told me that his father had gone out in the car of a family friend, to learn to drive in the remote area where there was no traffic, but unfortunately, they had hit a tree and had been injured. The friend of his father had died in that accident.

I had never known what had happened to those two injured persons who were taken to the hospital in our van. By coming into contact with this gentleman, the last link of the story was found. One of them had survived

and the other one had died.

This is what I had always wondered over the last 57 years. The story had remained without an end in my memory. It took 57 years to complete the narration of that particular incident.

His father had survived but had died by the end of the last century.

So we talked on the telephone and became friends. I had planned that during my next visit to Pakistan, I would be meet him. I had planned in my mind to go back to the same place once again with him, to see and find the exact spot, where the accident had taken place, and where all of the students of the primary school had waited with our teachers for the return of our school van.



But just now I found another small twist in the story. I found a notice shared by some member of the group, that my new friend had died of a heart attack.

Thus during my next visit to Karachi, I would not be able to find the same spot where the accident had taken place. My desire to re-live an unforgettable incident of my life after 57 or 58 years thus would not materialise.



Taşkent Nature Park a place of mystery and enlightenment

In Northern Cyprus there are many fascinating places to visit that are well documented and I had heard of the Taşkent Nature Park but had not been there until recently and what can I say, it has to be on anyone's to-do list.

Taşkent Nature Park is a non-profit institution and a social responsibility project dedicated to protecting and raising awareness, of wildlife and the environment, through education.

Each year, hundreds of wild animals are treated and rehabilitated by the Taşkent Nature Park and released back into the wild. It conducts environmental and wildlife awareness workshops and projects. These projects are funded by income generated from the Taşkent Picnic Area, Selvi Restaurant, the Activity Site and from donations.

Cyprus Wildlife Research Institute

Founded in 2016, the Wildlife Rescue and Research Centre (WRRC), the Cyprus Marinelife Centre (CMC), and the Wildlife Hospital and Research Laboratory (WHRL) came together under the Cyprus Wildlife Research Institute (CWRI) in 2018. The CWRI carries out research projects and fieldwork regarding wildlife conservation and habitat protection.

If you find or are aware of wild animals injured or in danger please call the centre on 1190 so that arrangements can be made for their rescue and treatment where necessary.

Driving into the park turn right and pull up outside the Selvi Restaurant and from within the unique views of nature and its panoramic views of Nicosia, seems to enhance the flavour of the food. Located within the picnic area,

The Selvi Restaurant offers a variety of choices such as breakfasts, shared platters, kebabs, vegetarian options and children's menus to choose from.







Panagia Apsinthiotissa Monastery

The Panagia Apsinthiotissa Monastery is the first thing that you see when you drive up to the restaurant area which lies to the east of the Taşkent Picnic Area. The original structure is thought to have been built as a chapel in the 11th Century by the Byzantines and was added to in the 14th Century by the Lusignans.





Apsinthiotissa is derived from the Artemisia absinthium (wormwood) plant and traces of frescos can be seen on the inner walls.

Activity Site

With the Besparmak mountains on one side and the Mesaoria plain on the other, you can spend time in nature on their terrace and balcony.







Also located on site is a conference room with a seating capacity of 100 people where events such as seminars, workshops, conferences and educational activities can be held and guided tours can be arranged for a nominal donation.

Taşkent Picnic Area

With a capacity of 3000 people and wheelchair friendly parking, paths, toilets and playground with a further 2 playgrounds, shop and buffet, it is the exemplary picnic area on our island where families can spend many happy days being together.





With environment protection in mind, it was interesting to note by the offices that there was a small glass bottle recycling plant. With companies in the mountains crushing rocks what a wonderful idea if there was a plant where all glass bottles could be taken for crushing and perhaps be used as sand in road construction etc....

Walking Trails

There are several walking trails, within the picnic area that connect to the Kyrenia Mountain Range.

TRNC FLAG

Located on the Kyrenia Mountain Range (Besparmak Mountains) equivalent to the size of 12 football fields, the TRNC flag has its own breath-taking illumination and can be seen from many locations around the island.





Buffavento

Most visitors to the Taşkent Nature Park would approach it from the south coming into Taşkent or from the west through Dipkarpaz.

There is another route opposite the Buffavento Restaurant on the Five Fingers mountain road and turning into a large parking area on the right you can take the narrow road to the highest and most mysterious castle which also circumvents Taşkent Nature Park. The exact date of the castle's construction is unknown but is thought to have been built originally as a watch tower in the 11th Century by the Byzantines.



Ercan to Hatay flights started

A ceremony was held on 8th August 2019 to mark the introduction of daily scheduled flights from Ercan to Hatay by Anadolu Jet.

Speaking at the ceremony, Undersecretary of the Ministry of Public Works and Transportation Kemal Bağzıbağlı, stated that new destinations are being organised and the opening of the new airport will allow large-bodied aircraft, which will increase the number of passengers and therefore reduce ticket prices.

Mustafa Sofi, General Manager of Civil Aviation, pointed out that the number of flights has been increased from 2,300.000 to 4,000.000 in a period of 7 years and that they will be ready for international flights with the new airport.

The Minister of Tourism and Environment Ünal Üstel, in his speech at the ceremony, said that they had started to see the fruits of the initiative made over a period of time, and that technical work is being carried out for the reduction of ticket prices.

Anadolu Jet Marketing Manager, Ahmet Yildiz, said that in April, he started direct flights to 4 cities and Hatay will now be the 7th destination. Yildiz also stated that flights from Turkey to TRNC had increased with 110% capacity, and he is full of faith in the TRNC tourism potential, so that they would increase their investment.

Improved Public Transportation for Girne Western Region

A presentation targeting drivers and owners of public transportation companies was held in Lefkoşa by the Traffic Department of the Ministry of Public Works and Transportation in cooperation with the Girne Municipality, Lapta Municipality and Alsancak Municipality.

During the presentation, members of the sector were informed on works which have been initiated towards the improvements of the bus stops and the quality of public transportation around the western route of Girne.

The presentation entitled "Public Transportation in the Girne Region and Planned Regulations to the Western Route Transportation" was delivered by Architect Ayşe Baysal from the Public Works office of the Kyrenia Municipality. She briefed the attendees on the steps which are being taken towards regulating public transportation around the western route of Girne, whilst also referring

to matters that they need to consider in order to raise the prestige of their profession.

Minister of Public Works and Transportation Tolga Atakan, Principle Ministry Clerk Ramadan Beysun and Head of the Public Vehicles Trade Association (KAR-İŞ) Beksan Bekir Akandere were also present during the presentation, which was held at the headquarters of the Exchequers and Audit Department.

Within the scope of works initiated with the aim of "originating a sustainable, modern and safe public transportation system", certain regulations will be put into practice on the route starting from Karşıkaya on the west, towards Girne (Güzelyalı Avenue, Fevzi Çakmak Avenue and Karaoğlanoğlu Avenue) and within the municipal borders around the region.

Within this framework, the final stages of establishing a cooperative

among the public transportation companies serving the region has been reached, and the identification of the locations for the stops needed on the mentioned route and area has been almost completed. Following this, with the placement of new, modern, accessible and stops smart and with introduction of a smart card system, travelling by public transportation will be made more attractive and safe. Passengers will be able to see which bus is approaching and when it will arrive

from the information boards placed at bus stops.

In addition to these, a series of rigorous measures will be taken, including the cancellation of operation licenses for public transportation vehicles, which are spotted dropping off and picking passengers at random locations instead of bus stops.

TRNC vehicle owners will be informed on upcoming fees

The Vehicle Registry and Licencing Branch of the Ministry of Public Works and Transportation, launched a new application under the name "Vehicle Registry Information System" to inform vehicle owners on the approaching road tax and vehicle inspection dates.

The branch sent SMS messages to vehicle owners asking them to write their name, surname, e-mail address, and vehicle licence plate numbers by leaving a space after each information and sending it to 1300 as SMS.

Through this free of charge service, the information sent by the vehicle owner will be added to the database, which will allow the Ministry to inform the owners before the date of his or her vehicle inspection or road tax payment approaches. In order to be registered to the system, an SMS can be sent to 1300 anytime, regardless of whether the original announcement message was received or not.
