A Molotov bomb was thrown at Köprülü Mosque in Limassol, South Cyprus and racist and anti-Islam slogans were written on the walls.

Tatar said "We are worried that while the Pandemic process is continuing in the whole world, there are still some people in the Greek Cypriot side who watch for an opportunity to attack the places of worship of foreigners especially the Muslims. Wishing to burn the mosque cannot be accepted.

The Greek Cypriot people and the Greek Cypriot Administration must know that racist attacks and hostile attitudes will not be

beneficial for anyone. Those who ignore such attitudes will come to the greatest harm one day".

Üstel message in the "Stay Safe" hotel certification campaign

"Stay Safe" certificates are the aim of our safe country"

Tourism and Environment Minister Ünal Üstel has started to issue certificates to the tourism enterprises that fulfill the terms of the criteria and have the right to receive the "Stay Safe" certificate.

Minister Üstel visited the tourism establishments that qualified for controlled opening and issued the "Stay Safe" certificates to the business officials.



In his speech Minister Üstel wished success to the tourism enterprises that will evaluate the process and start operating in a controlled manner, having made arrangements in accordance with the specified criteria and who were entitled to receive certificates as a result of the inspections carried out by the Ministry.

Tourism and Environment Minister Ünal Üstel reminded that within the scope of the new type Coronavirus pandemic measures,





with which the world has been struggling, with the decision of the Council of Ministers they decided to stop the activities of the sectors by keeping human health in the forefront, and that the activities of the tourism sector were stopped.

"The point that we have reached in the COVID-19 struggle as a country, and which will set an example to the whole world, has brought the controlled reopening the sectors closed precautionary measures to the agenda," said Minister Üstel. "As the Ministry, we entered into intensive work with many tourism stakeholders, especially the Cyprus Turkish Hoteliers Association (KITOB), as to how the tourism sector, which as in the rest of the world is affected the most, can be opened in a controlled opening process and how they can continue their activities and we have set the criteria."

Minister Üstel, taking into consideration the successful situation of the country in the process of combating the global pandemic with the decision of the Council of Ministers, the tourism establishments that fulfill the

operating conditions in accordance with the determined criteria and which are eligible to receive the "Stay Safe" certificate as a result of the audits conducted as a Ministry, expressed that they are pleased to be operational again.

Saying that "Stay Safe" certificates are the indication of how safe our country is, Minister Üstel said, "Our tourism facilities with certificate will be an indicator, by keeping human health in the forefront of providing a safe holiday opportunity to our guests in accordance with the specified criteria and hygiene conditions."

Minister Üstel also noted that all tourism businesses that fulfill the controlled opening requirements will continue to receive their certificates as a result of the inspections to be carried out by the Ministry.

Turkish Foreign Minister Mevlüt Çavuşoğlu made a statement regarding the latest developments in the Eastern Mediterranean and expressed "We are ready to cooperate with all sides in the Mediterranean. Furthermore, Çavuşoğlu pointed out "We are ready to cooperate with all sides in the Eastern Mediterranean. Up to the present

time the countries of Greece, Egypt and Israel have attempted to make cooperation between each other by excluding Turkey. We have always stressed that any agreement which excludes Turkey is not valid. We are fully committed to protecting our rights and Turkish Cypriot rights in the Eastern Mediterranean".

Tatar: Turkey resources will be a driving force for the TRNC

Prime Minister Ersin Tatar stated that the country entered the normalisation process faster than expected, saying, "Where did we come from in 2.5 months? I believe things will normalise after a few months. We should not be pessimistic."

Minister Tatar noted that it is accepted that the downsizing of the TRNC economy will recover in a short period of time "for the future of the TRNC's development and progress, the resources from Turkey will be a driving force for the reduction of economic factors," he said.

Stating that COVID-19 is taking the world by storm and the economies are getting smaller in this process, Tatar said, "It was not possible for us to be exempt from this situation. We entered a shrinkage, but normalisation is faster than predicted. I believe that it will not take long, before we will come to the previous dimensions."

The Minister stated the start of flights, opening of land border gates and the quarantine conditions for those who will come to the country will be evaluated by the Ministry of Health and scientific boards, "Where did we come from in 2.5 months? I believe things will normalise after a few months. We should not be pessimistic. I have never been pessimistic, I've always been positive about matters."

He also said that the good management of the Coronavirus will be perceived and the attractiveness of the TRNC could increase.

Noting that they are working on the second economic package and they want to evaluate with economic organisations, the Prime Minister said, "Yes, there are problems in the private sector, we also know that there are problems in the conditions of the business world. We are working on how to help the private sector, the real sector, and how to transfer resources."

Tatar stated that they always care about Turkey's support, public finance and economic financial cooperation protocol, the real sector, infrastructure investments and said the defence would be supported. resource will be a driving force for the future development of the TRNC, to reduce the shrinking economic factors we are in now," Tatar said.

Noting that the expenditure in health increased due to pandemic, Tatar pointed out the expenditure made on tests, health supplies and additional payments, and said the expenses were covered by public finances.

Reminding that they created internal resources and made decisions to complete the hospitals in Güzelyurt and Kyrenia, Tatar emphasised that this would be an important step for the economy.

To ensure that the objectives of stimulating the economy by entering a new breakthrough process, the Prime Minister also expressed that the purpose of the signed Economic and Financial Cooperation Treaty with Turkey was to achieve these goals.

TRNC broad expansion of unlocking starts as of 1st June

Within the framework of the normalisation process for Coronavirus, broad expansion in the TRNC starts today. Starting from today, night curfew will be lifted but obligation for wearing masks will continue.

Hotels, casinos, betting offices and tattoo parlours, cultural and art activities, cinemas, exhibitions and libraries, individual sports branches and kindergartens will start to resume activities. Vehicles which carry personnel will start working. A statement will be made about mass transportation during the week.

Those who have been abroad and their residence is the TRNC will be able to arrive in the TRNC starting from today (1st June). Citizens who arrive in the TRNC will stay under quarantine and quarantine cost will be met by the state.

It is likely that charter flights will be organised from the United Kingdom to the TRNC on 5 June, 11 June and 17 June 2020.

Those who are not TRNC citizens but who have a working permit, residence permit etc. will be able to arrive in the TRNC starting from 8 June. They will also stay under quarantine during 14 days but the quarantine costs will be met by themselves.

It will be possible to bring the corpse of TRNC citizens who lost

their lives abroad due to Coronavirus, or any other reason, back to the country to bury them.



From "THE MASK" to "the masks" and what then?

What comes to your mind, if someone says "the mask"? Just a couple of months back "the mask" meant either the 1994 film "The Mask", or the masks used by surgeons and medical staff in operating theatres or a mask when someone occasionally puts one on while cleaning, to be safe from dust.

That was all that the word "mask" used to mean. But not now. Now the word mask has become directly related to the Coronavirus. The first thing that comes to our mind is nothing else but what we are putting on our faces right now. Most of us are using a mask when going out of our homes. In most of the cases it is now a legal requirement.

So nowadays life with a mask on has become a necessity, a common practice, a legal requirement, and is socially accepted.

I wonder if rarely in the past, finding someone wearing a mask covering his/her nose and mouth, others would to turn to look at them. A mask had been used only by sick persons, and that too was a rarity. Even then such people would try not to wear a mask, just to avoid being the centre of enquiring looks by passers-by. A mask in public places was not just part of the social norm.

I do not know, if the writers and producers of the film "The Mask" had ever thought of the present times, while working on that particular film about 26 years ago. I wonder if Jim Carrey had ever thought that the mask would one day become a reality, and everyone everywhere would be using it.

I am sure there are quite a few people, like me, who still do not like using a mask. Everyone has got his/her own reasons for not wearing it.

Most of those who do not like using the mask are those who are basically stubborn. They do not accept a change in their usual lifestyle and social behaviour easily. They simply feel happy and adjusted in the way that they have been through for the whole of their lives. A sudden change in that set up instantly springs a reaction from inside. This is why I do not like using a mask. I usually keep a mask with me, and only put it on when entering a market or close to a public place. I usually do not use a mask while running or long distance road walking.

But there are many who have adjusted themselves to the changed circumstances. They appear at ease wearing a mask. They no more consider a mask as something out of routine.

However there are some who in

fact do not like wearing a mask, but due to the requirement of their place of work, they do have to constantly wear the mask throughout the period of their work shift.

Yes, I mean those people who work in markets and superstores. For them wearing the mask is a necessity, whether they like it or not, but they do not have any option. I wonder how they feel once they finish their work shift. Do they immediately take off their masks and put them in their pockets, and take a deep breath, or do they just even forget to take the mask off. The situation of course differs from person to person.

I happened to discuss this point with a couple of people working in superstores. Their response is simple. For them, masks are just part of their uniforms. Though in the early days they found themselves somewhat disturbed, with the passage of time they found themselves adjusted to

wearing masks.

However for certain, each of them to whom I spoke, take their masks off immediately after finishing their work shift. Unfortunately, they have to wear the mask again until they reach their homes.

I wonder, what will be the first reaction from such people when the mask wearing does not remain a legal requirement?



The Potting Shed is on the Bellapais Road, just past Uncle Sam's.













"Good Morning.





CHAIRMAN'S NOTES

TRNC RESIDENTS RETURN FROM THE UK

As you will have seen from the Press Release (28th May 2020) the original 3-phase plan to allow people to gain entry to the TRNC has been modified.

Once TRNC citizens who have permanent residency have been returned, the Government will be working towards assisting 'foreign residents' to return.

The estimated dates for return flights for these individuals is planned to be 28th June and depending on how many flights are required will determine the other dates.

At present anyone returning WILL be required to enter quarantine for a 14-day period and there may well be a requirement to make a financial contribution for this.

A confirmed list of those individuals who wish to return as soon as possible will be supplied to the Government to begin the planning. Once confirmed dates are provided, we will notify those members who are looking to return.

Despite concerns by some members who have been affected by this deeply frustrating time, we have constantly lobbied Ministers and senior Civil Servants to relent, but they have always insisted that until the 'health' conditions were correct and the Health Service was in a position to support the possibility of 'new' infections brought by returnees, of any nationality including TRNC citizens, they would not allow entry.

I would like to take the opportunity to thank Caroline Houghton, from the TFR, who has kindly collated all the relevant information to provide to the Government to ensure those individuals who wish to return are included.



TFR meet Ministry again about TRNC Expats repatriation flights





TRNC expats around the world wanting to return to their only home in Northern Cyprus

Recently we published a letter from Chairman Horst Gutowski of The Foreign Residents in the TRNC - TFR in which he reported progress made following a meeting with the TRNC Ministry of Foreign Affairs to clarify the situation regarding when ex-pats living in Northern Cyprus will be able to return to their homes after the lifting of the coronavirus lockdown.

We have now received a further letter in which TFR explains further progress made following a meeting with the TRNC Ministry of Foreign Affairs on Tuesday 2nd June 2020.

2nd June 2020

Foreign Residents Returning to the TRNC

I am writing to you on behalf of the Foreign Residents in the TRNC Association (TFR) to provide you with an update on the latest position with respect to Foreign Residents wishing to return to the TRNC following the Coronavirus Lock-down.

This morning the TFRChairman,

Horst Gutowski and **TFR** Secretary, Caroline Houghton met with The Foreign Minister, Kudret Özersay, and Ismail Ali Sahinoğlu, Department of Foreign Affairs to discuss repatriation of Foreign Residents who have been stranded outside the TRNC and to understand how and when the borders will be opened.

We would like to thank the Foreign Minister for openly discussing the issues to ensure Foreign Residents have the latest view of the current situation.

Stranded Foreigners and Residency

As you are aware many Foreigners who live in the TRNC have become stranded outside the country as the borders were closed as part of the Lock-down procedures.

A number of the people who have stranded become had not completed/or had only partly completed their residency applications when the TRNC As a result, many locked-down. genuine residents do not have a residency document to show they are permanent residents. This has caused significant concerns, as these people wish to return as soon as possible to their homes.

As a result of representations made several organizations, situation is now understood by the TRNC government. Kudret Özersay advised that the Interior Ministry has agreed to review and confirm the residency status of any person wishing to be repatriated, and confirm they are permanent residents. We are writing to all the people on our database, who have registered that they are stranded and wish to return asking them to provide additional information to assist the Interior Ministry to undertake checks.

If you have been stranded outside the TRNC and have not already completed the repatriation form, it's not too late to apply, but you must reply by mid-night Thursday 4th June. You should complete the attached form and in addition provide the following information:

Residency – to provide a scanned copy of the data page of their passport and a scanned copy of their current residency document.

Category 2 Persons who started Residency, but not fully completed - a scanned copy of the data page of their passport and a scanned copy of the slip issued to them by the Police Station notifying of receipt of their application. If you were not given a slip, please state.

Category 3 Persons without Residency - a scanned copy of the data page of their passport. If you can also provide a scanned copy of your Kocan or the signature page of your rental contract this will also be helpful.

Quarantine

Foreign Residents who are stranded and wish to be repatriated in June, will need to undertake 14 days quarantine. This will be The costs chargeable. for quarantine have not been confirmed. Kudret Özersay, the Foreign Minister is meeting with the Minister of Finance on Wednesday to discuss and details of the costs of quarantine will then be published, probably on either Thursday or Friday.

It is proposed to offer a choice of quarantine hotels, and the cost of quarantine will vary depending on the hotel selected. The process for selecting a quarantine facility has not yet been confirmed.

Country Classification

From 1st July some tourists and other travelers will be permitted to enter the TRNC. The requirements on entry to the TRNC will differ dependent on the country you arrived from. It is planned to classify countries into two categories – high and low risk.

Low risk countries – people will need to present a certificate showing they have had a negative PCR test within 3 days of departure. No quarantine required.

High risk countries – people will need to present a negative PCR test certificate, but will also be required to quarantine (costs and arrangements as per above)

The list of high and low risk countries is not yet confirmed, but it is probable the UK will be classified as a high risk country. Other classifications may be similar to those already published for the Republic of Cyprus, but there may be variations.

TFR meet Ministry again Quarantine requirements will be organized. These are likely to only

monitored and only relaxed if the number of COVID19 cases remains very low.

Flights

3 flights have been arranged from the UK to Ercan for Turkish Cypriots who live on the island. The flights are not open to Turkish Cypriots who live in other countries. If there are spare places on these flights they will be offered to Foreigners who live permanently in the TRNC. Additionally one or more flights are being arranged for Foreign Residents who are stranded in the UK.

From mid-late June Turkish airlines and Pegasus will resume a small number of scheduled flights. The number of flights is likely to be very limited and will be dependent on demand.

A small number of Chartered flights from other countries with 'touch-down' in Turkey may be

be from 'low risk' countries.

Flights which transit through Turkey - there is currently no agreed process for people who book a flight from another country which transits through Istanbul or who book a flight to Turkey and a follow-on flight to Ercan.

Border with Republic of Cyprus

At the present time, only a small number of Turkish Cypriots who meet the criteria previously published will be able to cross the border. When the border will be opened to other people has not yet been confirmed.

Information & Updates

We have provided the latest position and as you can see, there are several areas where we cannot provide complete answers. Ministry of Foreign Affairs are committed to resolving the issues during this difficult period and we

Atakan: TRNC entry rules still apply for flights before 1st July

TRNC Minister of Public Works and Transportation Tolga Atakan, made a statement via his social media account and announced that the scheduled flights which are planned to start before 1st July 2020, will not be organised with the structure envisaged for 1st July 2020, but within the framework of the entry rules still in force in our country.

Minister Atakan underlined 'At the present time who can enter our country and under what conditions and rules is determined by the decisions of the Council of Ministers'.


Atakan also added 'As of 1st June, TRNC citizens, and as of 8th June, foreigners who live in the TRNC with a residence permit, student permit or any other kind that has ties with TRNC, are eligible to enter the country. All these entries are allowed under the supervision of the Ministry of Health, subject to 14 days of mandatory quarantine implementation.

These are the rules to enter the country up to 1st July, 2020. Entries to our country are also made by sea and charter flights. Therefore, scheduled flights/ferries which are planned to start before

1st July, 2020 will not be organised with the structure envisaged for 1st July, 2020, but within the framework of the entry rules still in force in our country'

Cleaning Work continues on Girne Western Ring Road

Girne Municipality is carrying out cleaning work on the western ring road of Girne, which is under the responsibility of the Highways Department but it is not possible for them to carry out the cleaning work. Within the scope of the works, the weeds in the central reservation are cleared, the trees are pruned, the roads are swept and the waste is collected.

According to the information given by the Municipality of Girne, they stated that with the end of the Pandemic period, all the teams had started to work, and the cleaning works continued on the ring road, as well as the cemeteries, playgrounds, green

areas and side streets in the city. Safety precautions will be taken during the work, by narrowing the double lane road where the work is being undertaken. For this reason, the drivers using the road are asked to take care and comply with the traffic warning signs and markers during the cleaning works.

Girne Mayor Nidai Güngördü said; "We need to protect the environment and nature. It is important to protect the current state without polluting the environment. We must learn not to pollute the environment any more".

Kervansaray Public Beach opens with Social Distance Measures

Social distance measures are to be taken at beaches against the global epidemic Coronavirus threat. Accordingly, Kervansaray Public Beach, which is connected to Girne Municipality, has completed its preparations for the new season.

In the information given from Girne Municipality; Kervansaray Public Beach, which will be opened at the weekend (6/7 June) in accordance with the social distance rules, has been reduced from 120 umbrella capacity to 80 umbrella capacity. All sunbeds have been removed. It is stated that the products to be sold

on the beaches will be served with disposable cardboard containers. The authorities stated that if the capacity of 80 umbrellas is filled, no other citizens can be allowed entry. Sand has also been added to the beach. The staff on the beach have been trained regarding the COVID-19 pandemic, and Girne Municipality will provide devices for hand hygiene at the entrances

Preparations are also completed for Antis Public Beach

Girne Municipality made a statement: "Antis Public Beach has expanded its area by increasing the

umbrella capacity of 23 to 34 umbrellas while also maintaining the social distance on the grassed area. Stating that the necessary measures have been taken, the officials reminded citizens that they must comply with social

distance rules and decisions."

It is stated that entrance to the beaches is at a cost of 7.5 TL.
















ATA Summer 2020 Newsletter - A bright view of the future


