Over the past months, the British Residents' Society have been in consultation with the TRNC Prime Ministry and Ministry of Interior asking questions and offering advice regarding the new TRNC Residency Regulations following the 23rd October 2019 introduction further discussions were held to fine-tune regulation requirements.

In the past few days BRS issued a Residency Regulation update to its members and kindly also passed this information to CyprusScene for a wider distribution and understanding.

► REGULAR ENTRY STAMP:

What happens if I get a REGULAR

When you get this kind of stamp at the entry, you are allowed to stay in the TRNC.

- Until your legal status expires,
- cancelled.

► VISA STAMP:

This stamp;

- *Includes the date of entry, type* of visa, duration of visa.
- Is applied to those with NO LEGAL STATUS in the TRNC. What happens if I get a VISA STAMP?
- 1. You are allowed to stay in the TRNC.
- 2. Until your VISA expires,
- Until your VISA is cancelled.
- 3. Any kind of your employment is FORBIDDEN, until you get a work permit.
- ► What if I have 1-year grace period?
- 1-year grace period has an effect like LEGAL STATUS in the TRNC. You don't need to get a visa in this period.

Normally, you should be given a REGULAR ENTRY STAMP in the grace period.

But If you are given a VISA STAMP in the grace period, don't take it into consideration.

Steps will be taken to protect interests of Turkey, TRNC and Libya

Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan answered the questions of students in a program themed "Every Human is a World" at Bilkent University on World Human Rights Day.

Stating that Greece, Egypt, Israel, and South Cyprus took joint action regarding the step taken in Libya, Erdoğan indicated that Turkey is together with Libya.

Erdoğan also said : "We will do all our research in the Eastern Mediterranean, also will take steps to protect the interests of Turkey, the TRNC and Libya, and these are in accordance with the international maritime law and the international law. We do everything within the framework of law."

Upon a question whether it is possible to conclude a similar

agreement as done with Libya with the other countries on the Mediterranean coast, Erdoğan said that they could take every step with all the riparian countries in the

Mediterranean on the basis of "win win", but they did not consider the understanding of "all should be mine" as being reasonable and fair.

News Agency, Taçoy said: "We have always stressed that by usurping Turkey and the Turkish Cypriots rights in the Eastern Mediterranean and in Cyprus, no one can reach anywhere and this is also contrary to the international law.

All balances have changed in the Eastern Mediterranean after the proactive policies of Turkey. All challenges of the Greek Cypriots are in vain.

The relevant states began to understand the Greek Cypriots' game behind the scenes.

Minister of Economy and Energy Hasan Taçoy attended the "OIC High Level Public and Private Investment Conference" organised in İstanbul.

In his speech at the conference, Taçoy made a call to the Greek Cypriots and all other related countries to accept the equality of the Turkish Cypriots in respect of the natural gas on the island and stressed "All of the other options are composed of a dream, as long as they violate our rights, they will hit a wall".

Adding that the maritime agreement signed with Libya shows that nothing can be achieved in the Eastern Mediterranean without Turkey, Taçoy expressed that the Turkish Cypriot State has a

common past and culture with the member countries and as an honourable observer member depends on the principles of OIC. Furthermore, Taçoy stressed that he is so pleased to express that the





Minister Çavuşoğlu underlined that with the maritime pact with Libya the unilateral steps of many countries has been prevented. The Turkish Foreign Minister also said 'In the Eastern Mediterranean, we have said the same thing since the very beginning.

With the exception of the Greek Cypriot Administration, we are ready to have bilateral or multilateral agreements with all countries, but some countries have preferred taking unilateral steps and criticising Turkey. Turkish President Erdoğan told the Greek Prime Minister Mitsotakis that Turkey is ready to make a maritime pact with Greece. We do not recognise Greek Cypriot

Administration, if there will be an agreement in Cyprus in the future we can sign a deal with them. We may make bilateral or multilateral agreements with all countries,

including Egypt and Lebanon, with the exception of the Greek Cypriot Administration, because we are on the side of collaboration in the region.

Speaking at the 5th MED 2019-Mediterranean Forum in Italy Turkish Foreign Minister Mevlüt Çavuşoğlu said 'We do not want to fight with anyone but if we need to take measures to defend our vessels, we will'.

While he was in Italy for 5th MED 2019-Mediterranean Forum, Minister Çavuşoğlu spoke to the local daily newspaper Corriere della Sera on a variety of topics, including Turkey's S-400

purchase, its anti-terror operation in northern Syria and recent developments in the Eastern Mediterranean region.

Responding to a question as to whether Turkey will use force for its search and drilling activities off Cyprus, Cavusoglu said 'We are the guarantor of the TRNC in the Cyprus Issue. We tried our best to reach a solution. The Greek Cypriot Administration refuses to make an agreement. We rejected



She has once again proved that women are able to compete with men in almost every field. This is a challenge which the menfolk usually do not even like to discuss.


In this world where rules have been made, written, approved and implemented by men, it is indeed very difficult for women to reach top posts.

The exhibition will continue until 21st December – opening times are weekdays 10am to 5pm and Saturday 10am to 3pm.










Poets Corner





*Help needed to collect a poorly kitten from Lapta to Girne and sponsorship for his/her treatment *

Over the last few months we have been asked for help with numerous cases and where we have been able we have done so and taken these cats on board.

Sadly however despite appeals for help we didn't receive any donations for them.

For example more latterly our help was sought for a cat that had been involved in a car accident and couldn't walk.

Whilst in Lapta picking her up we discovered she was the mom of some kittens and there were more kittens and another mom cat.

These kittens were all suffering from a terrible gastrointestinal virus. They, along with the other mom cat, were collected and taken to the vets. The mom was fine and was spayed and has been returned to Lapta.

The original cat from the traffic accident continues her recovery.

Sadly of the 5 kittens only two have survived. These cats and kittens received a huge amount of veterinary care, medication, special food etc and their bill alone is in excess of 5000TL.


Without donations to support the veterinary needs we will be unable to help the many animals that are reported to us as in need. Everything else is given for free - petrol, time, use of telephones etc.

We have had a poorly little kitten reported to us - again with what seems to be gastrointestinal problems.

Turkish Cypriot's fundraising for Tanzania children's education

We were invited to attend a fundraising event at the home of Figen Rasmussen who is passionate to help a Masai friend, John Laizer, to complete his dream project of a school in Losinoni, secondary Tanzania.

We arrived at Figen's home to find around 12 people at a beautifully laid out table and were served with chicken curry, vegetable curry and side dishes, followed by profiteroles and apple crumble and custard. There was wine or soft drinks to accompany the meal, which was delicious.

All of the guests made a donation at the invitation of a friend, she for the meal and raffle tickets were given in exchange, so following our sumptuous feast there was a draw and everyone seemed to receive a parcel from under the Christmas tree. A nice touch. We were told that 1,050TL was raised from this first event and Figen will be holding others to raise more funds for her friend John to complete his project. Figen would also like to thank a good friend who has said he will double the amount raised.

When most people had said their goodbyes, I asked Figen for some information about how this all came about and she told me that following a trip to Tanzania in 2003

found herself looking after a family where the husband had died leaving a wife and 4 children. They were very poor village people and had little in the way of food, and she was devastated at the life these people had, and has continued to sponsor this family over the years.

Figen met John Laizer while she was in Tanzania, he was a young man of about 16 years of age at the time, he is now married and has 2 children of his own. John's education and training in Tanzania to become a teacher was paid for by Figen's dear friends Palle and Ingrid Mork from Denmark.

Once John had obtained his degree he returned to his Masai village of Arusha.

A few years ago John built a small primary school for the local children, with the help of Danish friends and aided by volunteers and which sponsorship, gave children the chance to receive a much needed education. Now those children need a secondary school. The secondary school has now been built, again with the help of his Danish friends, but John now needs to build toilets for the teachers and boys and girls. He has been working on the now completed school building for the last 18 months but there is more to do with the building of toilet facilities.

" Had a lovely afternoon with my much loved paying guests. Today we raised 1,050TL, although, donations should still come in. A great start but our goal is \$7500. So we still have a way to go to build a toilet block like the one shown.

Here is a photo of a school from 2003 when I was in Arusha, Tanzania.

From this to this! "

Following is a comment received from John Laizer:

"We will have 4 classrooms. Two are finished ready to be used. Two are not yet completed. There will be two offices, the one for the teachers is finished but the one for the Principal is not yet completed. We discussed that the teachers should stay at the Primary School teacher's house where they have the extra space, but later we will start building houses for the teachers. We are looking for more than 6 teachers.

The district education office told us that the important things are the toilets and desks then the teacher's houses, laboratory, library and other important things for the school.

Instead of walking 9 km to Oldonyosambu secondary school, the children of the Masai will now walk 3 or 4 km to their new school. The opening day of the school has been scheduled for 6th January 2020.

Right now we need to finish all four classrooms, to build 3 toilet blocks, two teachers houses just to start with. We expect next year soon the children will start Form One. So we need around 44,450 USD dollars for the above to be completed. Welcome all of you who wish to give your support. 'Education for all'!

'Give a man a fish, and you feed him for a day. Teach a man to fish, and you feed him for a lifetime' Lao Tzu. Thank you to Katrinadal School in Denmark (Gitte Kaersgaard), TANAPA, Finn and Erik, My society, Doctor Mahera from Arusha DC and all of you. We still need more support from you."

Editor's Note:

When the project is completed there will be a facility for the education of around 100 children from the villages in the area.

We are overwhelmed by the dedication of John Laizer, who has spent many years working to give the children of his homeland a chance of education in a purposebuilt school, firstly a primary school and now a secondary school, to enable them to at least have the opportunity to make something of their lives and in return perhaps also to be able to help the isolated villages and people of the area.

Reminder of main rules regarding service offered by TRNC Taxis

Shown below are some issues that taxi users must take notice of in order for the sector to develop and for the service provided to improve to a certain standard.

Below are some main rules that taxi drivers must follow and customers should make sure they are followed:

- * All taxis serve on a single fare. The fare doesn't change according to the destination.
- * Opening the taximeter before the journey is compulsory for all taxis.
- * The amount at the end of the trip is a single fare. This amount cannot be demanded separately from passengers. The taxi driver cannot demand a higher amount than the figure on the taximeter.

- * You are not obliged to pay an extra fee for luggage or belongings that fit into the trunk of the taxi.
- * Taxi drivers do not have the right to choose passengers or destination.

We believe that following the basic rules mentioned above will contribute to the increase of customer satisfaction and the spread of taxi use in our country.

people who were enjoying the occasion.




