## Reaction from Turkey to the Greek Cypriot Administration

Reaction from Turkey to the Greek Cypriot Administration regarding arrest warrant issued for the crew of drilling ship Fatih

Regarding the news of the arrest warrant issued by the Greek Cypriot Administration for the crew of drilling ship Fatih and for the executives of the partner companies of the Turkish Petroleum Corporation, the Turkish Ministry of Foreign Affairs Spokesperson Hami Aksoy stated: "If the Greek Cypriot Administration, who ignores the very existence of the Turkish Cypriots and violates their rights, has really taken such a decision, it will be considered by us as null and void. No one should have any doubt that the necessary response will

be given, in the case of such an insolent action."

Aksoy also stated that Turkey is closely following the news claiming that the Greek Cypriot Administration has reportedly issued an arrest warrant for the crew of their drilling ship Fatih and for the executives of the partner companies of the Turkish Petroleum Corporation.

Aksoy mentioned that the Greek Cypriot Administration cannot take such a legal action based on a so-called national law, for a unilaterally claimed maritime area which is not delimited in accordance with international law. This is also incompatible with international law.

Aksoy continued: "Consequently, we will initiate the necessary counter-legal actions, together with our relevant authorities. The methods of the Greek Cypriot Administration in a vain effort to stop our activities within our continental shelf will not yield any result.

Turkey will continue to resolutely conduct its oil and natural gas exploration/drilling activities as planned, with a view to protecting its rights in its continental shelf, as well as the rights of the Turkish Cypriots as a co-owner of the island."



## Greek Cypriots not sole owners

Pointing out that Cyprus is located in an important geographical position and there are two equal communities in the island and the Greek Cypriots are not the sole owners of this island, Prime Minister Ersin Tatar stated that Turkey is one of the most powerful countries in the Eastern Mediterranean with a population of 80 million. It is in an important position and we must keep up this position.

In his speech during a meeting, Tatar said: "Up to this time our ancestors and Turkey have protected our rights and interests in the best way. We have established a state with Turkey's support and we have been, and still are, working to ensure the prosperity of our people".



Tatar noted that the eyes of the great powers are on Cyprus and he continued: "This is an important geographical location and it is said that it contains massive riches. The Greek Cypriots are not the only owners of this island. There are two separate and equal communities. We have declared our own independence in the north. We have agreements with Turkey and the research by Fatih and Yavuz vessels is very important for us".

Tatar also emphasized that it is necessary to produce in order to be able to strengthen economically, and in this respect the most important thing is that they support the producer and the nation.

Stating that they will not allow anyone to create dissension to our unity and togetherness, Tatar criticised the attitude of the EU mechanisms which see Cyprus as a part of the EU and support the exit of Turkey from the island, adding that Turkish Cypriots will not accept such games and that the main thing was the existence of Turkey and its full and effective guarantee.

## Özgöçmen murder suspect from Greek side through UN

Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay, has declared that they have received the Pakistani National suspect of the murder of artist Hasan Işık Özgöçmen from the Greek side through the UN as the result of long dialogues.

Özersay also indicated that Georgian suspects who committed murder in South Cyprus and were arrested in the TRNC have been handed over to the Greek side similarly through the UN.



Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay made the said declarations from his social media account.

Özersay said: "This is an improvement which has made a cooperation between the two sides possible through a dialogue as a practical arrangement"

Özersay also emphasised: "We attach importance to this in the objective of crimes not to remain unpunished no matter on which side of the island they have been committed. I thank everyone who has helped in this respect.

Özgöçmen, was found dead on 30 September 2018 early in the morning at the forest area between Long Beach Hotel and Ötüken Junction in İskele. It was detected that 53 year old Hasan Işık Özgöçmen, who was residing in Çayönü, was murdered by smothering.

It was declared that the wanted person related to the Özgöçmen murder was caught in Limassol in October 2018.

## The Greek Cypriot side tries to usurp our rights

Prime Minister Tatar: “Greek Cypriot side tries to usurp our rights and exclude Turkey and TRNC from the Eastern Mediterranean”

Prime Minister and the Leader of the National Unity Party (UBP) Ersin Tatar stated that no one can ignore the rights of the Turkish Cypriot people and Turkey in the Eastern Mediterranean and force them and Turkey to step back from their rights.

Evaluating the Greek Cypriot Administration issuing a warrant for the arrest of Fatih drill ship workers and officials of companies

which cooperate with the Turkish Petroleum Corporation, Prime Minister Tatar said that if there is someone who is acting unlawfully and unfairly it is the Greek Cypriot side which signs agreements by ignoring our proposals and rights.

In his statement, Tatar stressed that the Greek Cypriot Administration and those who cooperate with them for their own interests try to exclude Turkey and the TRNC from the Eastern Mediterranean and usurp our rights. Tatar added “It should be known very well that it is the Greek Cypriot side which makes agreements by ignoring the rights of the Turkish Cypriots.

I make a call to the Greek Cypriot side which issued a warrant for the arrest of 25 workers of the Fatih drill ship to avoid such steps, and come to an agreement with us”.

“We warn the United Nations and

the third parties that we will not be responsible for the results which may arise due to the Greek Cypriot side refusing our proposals on the issue continuously and their steps which increase the tension” Tatar stressed.



## Turkey never bowed to threat

In his statement, Turkish Energy and Natural Resources Minister Fatih Dönmez stated that Turkey has never bowed down to any threat and will never do so. He stressed that the necessary legal and political measures had been taken in order to prevent efforts to ignore Turkey’s sovereign rights and that they would continue to take measures.

Underlining that the rights of the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus and Turkish Cypriots will not be allowed to be usurped, Dönmez said: “We shall continue our efforts to ensure that the wealth of Cyprus and the Mediterranean will be shared fairly within the principle of justice. Our comprehensive and long term exploration and drilling activities within our licensed areas will continue without making any concessions from our legitimate rights. Our second drilling ship, the Yavuz, will commence its activities in the area once our

preparations are completed.”

Indicating that the Greek Cypriot Administration continued their negative stance and behaviour towards Turkey’s drilling operations, which comply with international law, in the Eastern Mediterranean, Dönmez added that Turkey’s activities would continue against the arrest warrant issued by the Greek Cypriot Administration for the crew of drilling ship Fatih. Turkey has never bowed down to any threat and will never do so.



## Turkey/Turkish Cypriot rights

Erdoğan: “We would not allow steps in Mediterranean which will not assure the benefits of Turkish Cypriots and Turkey”

President of the Turkish Republic Recep Tayyip Erdoğan stated that they would not allow any steps in Mediterranean which will not assure the rights and benefits of Turkish Cypriots and Turkey.

Erdoğan also underlined that Turkey now has four ships for hydrocarbon drilling activities in the Eastern Mediterranean, which is the first in Turkey’s history, and noted that the drilling activities have been continuing with the presence of the Turkish Naval Forces while providing the security in the area.

## Reaction from Turkey to Greek Cypriot Administration

Reaction from Turkey to Greek Cypriot Administration regarding agreement on natural gas revenue sharing

Spokesman of the Turkish Foreign Ministry, Hami Aksoy, stated that the natural gas revenue sharing agreement signed between the Greek Cypriot Administration and some international companies in the Eastern Mediterranean cannot be accepted. Aksoy stressed that the so-called agreement usurps the rights of the Turkish Cypriots on the island.

In his written answer regarding the issue, Aksoy noted that they support the statements of the TRNC authorities on the issue. The

agreement does not refer to the Turkish Cypriots and does not give any share to the Turkish Cypriots. This is not acceptable both for Turkey and the Turkish Cypriots. Stressing that the international companies which work with the Greek Cypriot Administration cannot disregard the equal rights of

the Turkish Cypriots over petrol and natural gas resources, Aksoy underlined that Turkey will continue its principled and determined stance on the issue to protect the rights of the Turkish Cypriots and will take the necessary steps.

Furthermore, Aksoy pointed out that as long as the Greek Cypriot Administration continues their unilateral activities and does not include the Turkish Cypriots in revenue sharing, Turkey will continue to protect the continental shelf rights of the Turkish Cypriots. Adding that in this context, drilling vessels Fatih and Yavuz will start drilling in a short time in accordance with the licence given by the TRNC to the Turkish Petroleum Company in 2011, Aksoy reminded once more that it is the Greek Cypriot Administration which disregards the rights of the Turkish Cypriots on natural resources and continue their unilateral steps, whilst ignoring the warnings.



### “We do not approve this approach of the Greek Cypriot side”

In his speech during yesterday's session (10th June) of the TRNC Assembly, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs Kudret Özersay pointed out the action of the Greek Cypriot Administration regarding issuing a warrant for the arrest of personnel of the Fatih drill ship and said “We do not approve this approach of the Greek Cypriot side”.

Furthermore, Özersay stressed “The sides have some claims at the disputed areas but this should be resolved by peaceful methods. If this issue continues, some precautions will be taken.

We are following the issue closely. We are in cooperation with Turkey”.



### Greek Cypriot mistreatment from the Greek Cypriot Police



It was stated that Greek Cypriot citizens who were passing through to the North were mistreated and bullied by the Greek Cypriot policemen who work at the border gates of TRNC-South Cyprus and they still continued to do so despite complaints.

According to the Greek Cypriot daily Alithia, the Greek Cypriot policemen at the crossing points

continued to intimidate the Greek Cypriot people with their attitude to prevent the Greek Cypriots from crossing to the TRNC despite repeated complaints.

In the news, it has been pointed out that the Greek Cypriot Police General Directorate could not find a way to prevent the policemen from behaving in this way of aggressively applying their

ideological policies at a sensitive point.

The news also stressed that these people are against free and uninterrupted passage of people through the border points due to their political and ideological stances.”

## Protecting rights of Turkish Cypriots in Northern Cyprus

Responding to journalists' questions on the agenda Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan stressed that the Greek Cypriot administration is said to have made agreements with some American companies with regard to oil in the Eastern Mediterranean.

Upon a question regarding what is Turkey's attitude on this issue, Erdoğan stressed that currently in the economic regions, Turkey is determined to fully protect especially the rights of Turkish collaterals.

For this, Erdoğan said that the newly-purchased oil drilling and exploration ships are in the region.

He continued: "In respect of all resources of the region that will emerge, our Turkish kin in Northern Cyprus are entitled to the same rights as the people in Southern Cyprus according to the international law.

We are dedicated to protecting the rights of our Turkish kin in

Northern Cyprus. We have the exclusive economic region. diplomatic relations.

Apart from diplomatic relations, there are areas that belong to us in We are working in these places in the same way."



## FIFA 69th General Assembly

The TRNC Assembly and the Cyprus Turkish Football Federation delegations met with FIFA officials in Paris within the framework of the 69th General Assembly of the International Association of Football Federations (FIFA).

The delegation made contacts with the senior officials of FIFA and

other football organisations in order to remove the embargo and restrictions imposed on the Turkish Cypriot people in the sport of football and they also made a presentation including the political and legal dimensions of the possible developments.



## Tatlısu - 5th TRNC Municipality

Tatlısu Municipality has won the title of the 5th Cittaslow (calm city) municipality of TRNC.

Following the Municipalities of Yeni Boğaziçi, Lefke, Mehmetçik and Geçitkale, confirmation of Tatlısu's membership was informed via an e-mail sent by the Secretary-General of the Cittaslow Association Pier Giorgio Olivetti.

Tatlısu Mayor Hayri Orçan, who made evaluations regarding membership, said that Tatlısu's acceptance to membership of Cittaslow was honourable on behalf of the Tatlısu people and the country.

Orçan stressed that they aimed to further expand Tatlısu's tourism potential through different tourism models.

## I still cannot forget the taste of that first Ice Cream

Last weekend we were sitting at home, before television time, and from somewhere the idea of eating ice cream was suggested.

The weather was quite hot, and ice cream was the obvious choice for all of us. However, none of us wanted to go out to the market to get the ice creams, so what choice did we have?

There were two choices, go to the market, buy ice cream and eat it at home, or go out to eat ice cream somewhere. Interestingly none of us wanted to go out, we all wanted to eat ice cream while watching television at home but none of us wanted to go to the market either.

In the end my daughter went out, drove to the market and brought home ice cream, which we all enjoyed eating.

This particular family event, however, took me back to the 1960s. I remember eating ice cream for the first time, when I was about 6 or 7 years old. The year must have been 1961 or 1962, and we were living in a small locality in Karachi city, Pakistan. As I remember, one day my father brought home an ice cream making machine, which he had borrowed from one of his friends.

Ice cream must have been very rare in those days in that area, as I remember that our close relatives, living in the same locality, were also invited to the ice cream party by my father. That was the first time when I had not only eaten ice cream, but had also watched it being made.

I remember it was a bucket made up of hardwood, with a tin capped can in the middle. This can was filled with milk and put in the middle of the bucket. The area between the can and the walls of the bucket were filled with crushed ice. There was some salt also spread over the ice. Then an apparatus, as can be seen in the attached photo, was put to revolve the tin repeatedly. I do not know how many times the tin

was to be rotated, but ultimately with the below freezing temperature of the bucket, the milk inside the tin took the form of liquid ice cream. Ultimately, the tin was opened and the ice cream was distributed to all of us in small cups. We all enjoyed eating the ice cream. That was the first time I remember eating ice cream. It was simply made up of milk and sugar. But I liked it very much.

However, even though more than half a century has passed, I still remember the taste of the ice cream that I ate that particular day. It was really fantastic and of course unforgettable.

As time passed, the ice cream also became an industry, and during the late 1960s I remember visiting shops where ice cream was sold and eating it.

It used to be a routine of a once a month family visit to the ice cream shop, throughout the summer. However at all those shops the ice cream used to be manufactured in the same wooden buckets.

After sometime, ice cream machines were introduced, and more shops were opened. I remember my father used to offer me a fresh ice cream cone, from a particular shop, whenever we went to that area.



I remember the phase when brand names of ice cream came into the market. Different ice cream manufacturing units emerged in the market, and different brand names and tastes of ice cream were introduced. In the same period the different forms and shapes of ice cream were introduced.

Ice cream had started in the forms of packed cones, with different packing materials.

Now I see each of my children preferring different brands and flavours of ice cream, but my favourite is still plain white coloured ice cream. I usually do not go for flavours. I am still a very straightforward person when the question of selecting the ice cream comes up.

However, as I write the above lines, I still feel the taste of the ice cream that I had eaten for the first time, made by my father, over 50 years ago.

## World Oceans Day at Merit Crystal Cove Hotel

On Saturday 8th June 2019 on World Oceans Day we went to the Merit Crystal Cove Hotel, Alsancak to visit the Meritta Sea Turtle Rehabilitation Centre.

Chris Elliott stayed at Merit Crystal Cove Hotel many years ago and was amazed at the fabulous garden area and we will take time soon to go back and explore and enjoy it.

Set alongside the garden area is the Meritta Sea Turtle Rehabilitation Centre where rescued sick and injured sea turtles are brought for treatment before they are returned to their natural habitat in the sea. Those turtles, which cannot be returned to the sea remain in the centre and receive continued care.

We met with two lovely Turkish ladies – Silem Kara, the Project Manager of the Centre and Sude Çelik, who works with her, and they were very helpful explaining about the centre and the work they do there. We had no idea that this rehabilitation centre existed and were very impressed with what we saw.

Congratulations to the Merit Group for setting up this wonderful project at a time when sea pollution is causing severe problems for marine life.

Sea turtles have been in existence for over 100 million years as one of the oldest animal groups in the world. It is one of the creatures that lived in the same period with dinosaurs and managed to reach the present day with very few changes. The largest species of sea turtle, the skin-backed tortoise (*Dermochelys coriacea*), weighs more than 500 kg. They are among the largest reptiles known, with their lengths reaching 3 meters.

A garden wall, which was built without permission in the river bed, known as the continuation of Gelin Stream, has been demolished.


Girne Municipality and Girne District Kaymakamlığı intervened in the unauthorized construction of a garden wall made in the river bed in the Girne Region, Ozankoy, Sht Mustafa Yavas Street, known as the continuation of the Gelin Stream.

Girne Kaymakam Sinan Güneş said in a statement on the issue, they have started joint work with the Girne Municipality to eliminate the problems caused by the violations to the river bed. Sinan Güneş stated that they started to eliminate the violations that were detected in cooperation with Girne Municipality and they continued the same studies and sensitivity with other municipalities.

Inviting other relevant institutions to abolish violations, Güneş said he also wanted the citizens to show sensitivity in order not to experience again the sad events which occurred in December 2018. Güneş thanked the Mayor of Girne Nidai Güngördü who mobilised the employees of the Municipality for the abolition of the violations, and said that the work will continue.

Girne Mayor Nidai Güngördü said that the garden wall that caused flooding in Ozanköy was demolished and the stream was re-established to provide natural water flow. Nidai Güngördü, said the Municipality had spent 75,000 Turkish Liras last year to the south of Benan Street, to create a culvert, to address the problems. A further 44,000TL was spent at another point in the vicinity, where another wall was built without permission at the river bed. The Municipality and the District Kaymakamlığı

have been taking measures in order to prevent flooding and stressed that citizens should be more sensitive in respect of interfering with river beds.



## It's A Dog's Life In The Army - By Roy Oswick – Part 1

It was hot, in fact it was very hot.

Tripolitania, June and the hottest summer for over a hundred years, or so we were told. So what was I doing walking about in the middle the night with a dog? Well as they say this where the story begins.

There were times during the early years of my Military Police career, that I did volunteer for some very stupid things. I know one is always told, in the Army, Never Volunteer For Anything. In the main I suppose that could be seen as good advice, however if I had always followed that advice I would have missed out on an awful lot of laughs and some valuable experiences.

I had volunteered to be posted to Tripolitania Provost Unit, RMP in Libya after a 3 year tour in Germany and had been looking forward to the posting as I have always enjoyed serving in the Mediterranean area.



What I had not expected was to find that the unit had two distinct roles,

1. The usual Policing Role,
2. A Guard Dog unit providing guard dog patrols to several Ordnance supply depots throughout the region.

To facilitate these roles everyone spent 6 months on dog handling duties followed by normal duties for 6 months. It has to be kept in mind that the dogs were not your average intelligent Police dogs, and neither were they supposed to be. No, these animals were almost all German Shepherds or similar, and had been selected for their aggressiveness, and suitability to be trained to be ferocious, and they were all very very fast and could cover 100 yards in about 5 seconds, much, much quicker than even the best Olympic sprinter.

Never having had a desire to be a dog handler, I approached my dog handler training with apprehension. I was not afraid of dogs but, as I entered the Kennel area for my first day of training, my heart rate increased somewhat, as I and the other dozen or so newcomers were confronted by a row of 20 or so metal and concrete dog pens in each of which was housed a guard dog. Not only was this our first day of training to be a dog handler, it was also the day on which we were to be allocated a dog that we would be working with for the next 6 months or so.

I Use The Term "Allocated A Dog" In The Very Loosest Manner. For, as ever, the Army had its own way of doing things, and this procedure was no exception. As we trooped into the kennel area, the Royal Army Veterinary Sergeant in charge of the kennels, and who was responsible

for our training described the allocation process.

"Right lads, listen in. What we are going to do now is match you up with the dog that is best suited to you. They are just like us really, they have their own personality, and they have likes and dislikes. What we will do is one at a time you will go into a kennel and the dog that does not try to bite you will be the one allocated to you"

Almost as if on cue as he finished speaking the dogs began to howl and bark in a manner that was less than comforting.

"OK then let's make a start. First off I want you to walk down the row of kennels and stop briefly at each one. Just have a quiet word with the dog inside, use his name, "But, Do Not Try To Pat Him Or Go In, Got It?" I quickly decided that this was good advice and judging by the look on the faces of the other would be dog handlers it was obvious that they were equally ill at ease.

"Right Then I Want You all To Just Calmly Walk Along The Line And Stop When I Tell You To. Off You Go"

So that is just what we did. After a few minutes the Sergeant called us

to a halt and said. "Right Then Turn And Face The Kennel Nearest To You And When I Tell You To I Want You To Open The Kennel Door And Go In"

By now my concern had generated into an almost state of alarm.

Close up these dogs were massive each weighed in at 60/80 lbs and none of it fat, just solid muscle. The first thought to enter my head was, who was going to handle who, for at that stage if a dog had said "SIT" I would have quickly obeyed.

However I turned to face the first kennel and saw that the name on the door was MARTY.

Marty was some kind of Alsatian/Doberman cross breed. Mottled black and grey coat, pointed ears with a body shaped like an exorcist missile and, RED EYES.

Marty quickly decided that the weak kneed individual standing outside his kennel and muttering something about him being a good boy, was less than man enough for the task, and he proceeded to hurl himself at the kennel door yapping, and snarling displaying two rows of very large and very sharp teeth.

Thankfully this did not happen, and we were told to move on. The procedure was repeated several times and gradually the noise of the barking dogs began to subside. After a while the Sergeant said "Right, I Have Been Watching You Lot And The Dogs And Here Is What I Think Should Happen"

He then walked along the line of kennels and as he stopped at each one he then called us forward one at a time and told us to stand outside the kennel of the dog he had selected for us and to just wait. He would tell us when to enter the kennel.

One by one that is exactly what we did, and that seemed to be the allocation of dog process complete. (Thank God I had not been selected to take on Mad Marty)

At this point I should mention that one of our new found dog handlers was a real poser, 6' plus tall, Blond haired and smooth skinned, weights lifter and body builder, a real Adonis and Macho Man. His name is unimportant however he had the ego of a Grand National winner, and never missed an opportunity to display his Mr Universe type body and was ever willing to strike a pose to impress whether this be in full uniform, on the beach, in the pool or at the bar, his whole world centred around himself and his appearance.

It came to the point of the allocation process where he had not been allocated a dog and there were but two left, one of whom was Mad Marty, and one other called Sprint. Sprint was about the biggest dog I




of that tiny plane in free fall for about 1 minute which was my greatest fear but not anymore thanks to them and Mohammad Abdallah who took so much time briefing me and making me feel relaxed until the moment he climbed out of the aircraft and watched me exit the aircraft with his colleague, Misha strapped to my back for that

downward fall at such high speed.

No worries, he made it a great experience and before very long in the rushing wind he released the parachute and then we were making that downward glide enjoying incredible views before we landed safely on Long Beach, Iskele and this thrill of a lifetime

was to raise awareness and gain support for the Famagusta Animal Rescue Centre.

It was just a stunning experience and if I can help one person to overcome their fears of making a Tandem Skydive then this will make me very happy.
