## BRS Coronavirus News Update 28th May 2020

Peter Wilkins the Chairman of the British Residents' Society published very important news on 28th May 2020 with the latest information provided through their ongoing liaison with the TRNC authorities about the Coronavirus Regulations which we are sharing for other readers who are seeking the latest facts and information.

### UPDATE – 28th MAY 2020

Following an initial meeting between members of the Foreign Residents Association and the Undersecretary of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs Gunes Onar today together with the Deputy Chairman, Mike Diplock, we met with him to discuss the return to the TRNC of those UK citizens with a home here.

He explained that there had been a meeting between the Deputy Prime Minister Kudret Ozersay and Ersin Tatar the Prime Minister to discuss

this issue. They agreed that once TRNC citizens with permanent residency had been 'repatriated' they would look to assist Foreign residents to return. Dr Ozersay then joined the meeting and confirmed the discussion and further explained that they would be seeking agreement at the Council of Ministers meeting tomorrow (29/05/2020) to begin the process.

We later met with the Prime Minister, Ersin Tatar who expressed his desire to see all foreign residents returned to the TRNC. He stated that they would speak with Turkish Airlines to arrange charter flights towards the end of June to achieve this. He further confirmed that everyone returning to the TRNC this way would be required to complete a 14-day quarantine period.

He asked people to understand the situation regarding the delay in allowing the re-entry of foreign residents to their homes but that by

taking the steps that they had, it ensured they could come back to a safe environment.

More details will be provided in due course in relation to flights, cost of the quarantine contribution and the projected dates of the flights.

The Government will also release details of how people need to

'register' for these flights once they have received the relevant information.

## TRNC deserves equal status by removal of flight embargoes

When I returned to Northern Cyprus after living in exile in the UK due to attempts on my life by Greek Cypriot extremists, I was very fortunate to have been very successful in business and on my return to my homeland in the 1970s, after many issues, I was able to build the Celebrity Hotel which was the first Turkish Cypriot hotel to be built in Northern Cyprus - see link shown below.

Following this, I built the Chateau Lambousa Hotel and Aphrodite Villas which created a fantastic centre for bringing tourists to the Lapta area, and then I started to promote North Cyprus tourism both from the UK and Northern Cyprus but the main problem holding back tourism was flight embargoes that the Greek Cypriot administration have convinced the world is necessary as they do not want the Turkish

Republic of Northern Cyprus to be successful.

So there we have it, time has moved on and with the COVID-19 pandemic and the UK Brexit the Greek Cypriot administration is slowly squeezing the door shut to prevent people from North Cyprus travelling from Larnaca or Paphos to their chosen destination, but why should they want to go that route?

Before the border between north and south Cyprus was opened because of the embargo, the only way people could reach Northern Cyprus was by a number of scheduled flights going via Turkey and I championed for many years for a low cost shuttle service to be set up between Istanbul and Ercan airports but of course whilst this may reduce airfares it does not reduce the excessive flight times, via Turkey, when compared to flight times into south Cyprus for those wanting to come from the UK.

Now over the past months I have been following the plight of many people who wish to leave or return to the TRNC but are prevented from doing so by COVID-19 controls but some have been able to depart via Turkey and south Cyprus.

What beggars belief is that we have a

perfectly good airport in Northern Cyprus that the UK government has pretended they could not see due to ongoing pressure from a Greek Cypriot administration whose only wish is to rule the whole island again. The passage of time is such that the most sensible solution for the TRNC and RoC is to accept each other as equal states and move forward with the cooperation that will maximise tourism and trading terms for both parts of the island.

Life is for living and people's lives should not be suppressed by political dreams to reverse history which cannot be achieved and now is the time for the UK to act. They once ruled the island and gave it to the Turks and Greeks to rule together but this failed and governing was usurped because of other dreams of Enosis - Union with Greece.

So let's all give up dreaming and get

on with life while we can and the UK should make a start by declaring Force Majeure and start sending direct flights to North Cyprus where there is such tremendous tourist potential and on the back of that success the TRNC will be able to re-write history and guide its people on a path towards financial independence by encouraging foreign investment and partnerships, including the foreigners who have decided they wish to live here, and in turn this benefit can be shared with the south of Cyprus.

We need to let go of the past and start working in cooperation for the future.

## North Cyprus gymnasiums opened 27th May

In the TRNC, where positive cases have not been observed for more than a month, COVID-19 measures are being gradually abolished. Accordingly, gymnasiums will be opened today 27th May.

Many sectors have remained closed for about two months, and the first step in the opening was taken on May 11 with the start of the takeaway service of the restaurants.

Restaurants, cafeterias, patisseries, internet cafes, coffee, bars, hairdressers, barbershops and beauty salons were opened on May 20, and playgrounds on May 22.

The ban on collective worship was lifted with the prayer performed on the first day of Eid al-Fitr.

Casinos, hotels, betting offices, and

tattoo parlours will open as of June 1st. Culture and art events can also be held from this date.

As of June 1, individual sports

branches can be started. Day nurseries will be launched on the same day.

If the conditions continue like this, the wedding halls will be opened as of July 1.

It is still forbidden to go out to the street from 00.00am to 06.00am in the middle of the night. Those who go out on the streets during the daytime are also required to wear masks.

## TRNC & TR signed Economic & Financial Cooperation Agreement

An Economic and Financial Cooperation Agreement was signed between the TRNC and Turkey. The agreement, which includes 2 billion 288 million 976 thousand TL grants and loans, aims to heal the wounds caused by the COVID-19 outbreak in the TRNC economy.

Prime Minister Tatar signed the agreement by negotiating in the teleconference system with Turkey Vice President Fuat Oktay, with the system established in the Prime Ministerial Council Hall.

In his speech prior to signing, Prime Minister Ersin Tatar thanked those who contributed to the protocol, stressing that the agreement they made with teleconferences was beneficial on such a Bayram Feast day.

Stating that it is a program that has been continuing for a long time and has been complicated due to the Coronavirus pandemic, Tatar said, "By turning all the important work and sacrifices made into an opportunity during the Coronavirus situation, the structure of the TRNC is reaching a safer future and prosperity.

Stating that this has an economic and financial dimension and a financial transfer of approximately 2.3 billion TL, Tatar said that after the 750 million TL program signed on 20 July 2019 when they first came to government, a transfer of 3 billion TL was in question in this period, for strengthening the infrastructure and competitiveness of the TRNC.

Tatar said that the important thing is to strengthen the sectors in which the TRNC is comparatively advantageous by strengthening the real sector and infrastructure,

achieving success in tourism and higher education and foreign sales in the field of housing, and making agricultural work sustainable. Tatar said that he believes that these efforts are very important for the sustainable competitiveness structure of the TRNC by completing the water project, making progress in natural gas and electricity by cable, and bringing the energy costs in the TRNC to the desired target.

Tatar thanked Oktay for the support of Turkey and noted that as a result of the TRNC public's compliance with the decisions and regulations made by the government on time, success was shown during the Coronavirus epidemic period. As a result of this, Tatar stated that TRNC has successfully overcome the Coronavirus epidemic, from which world countries still continue to suffer, and creates hope for the future of the TRNC.

Tatar expressed that TRNC tourism and higher education increases the high grade value in the island and it will contribute to a stronger status, and noted that Turkey has become more meaningful with support in this environment.

Reminding that tourism and higher education caused losses in economic income as a result of the precautions taken by putting health first in this process, Prime Minister Tatar said that they will make it easier with financial support, with the efforts and measures being taken during the normalisation process.

Ersin Tatar stated Turkey's support of the TRNC and Eastern Mediterranean has strengthened the TRNC economy to ensure prosperity and will continue to work to ensure a healthy life after the coronavirus epidemic and the struggle for existence.

Republic of Turkey Vice President Fuat Oktay said "Turkey and the TRNC Economic and Financial Cooperation Agreement" was designed with a strong future projection to support the damage caused by the new type of Coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak.

In his speech during the video conference, "Turkey and the TRNC Economic and Financial Cooperation Agreement Signing Ceremony" Oktay stressed the

importance of continuing to comply with the measures in the fight against COVID-19, and pointed out that many developed countries are experiencing serious problems in the fight against COVID-19, where economy, production and trade relations are affected.

Oktay also said, "While the world was going through such a difficult test, the TRNC showed an example of a totally admirable struggle by its government and its citizens."

Oktay, stated that the determined attitude of the TRNC government has revealed an important success story with the support of the Turkish Cypriot people, and noted that there had been no positive case in TRNC for more than a month.

## TRNC &amp; TR Agreement

Oktay stated that thanks to early and effective crisis management measures taken under the leadership of President Recep Tayyip Erdogan, the spread of the epidemic in Turkey has been largely eliminated and normalisation steps are being taken, and said the following:

"Turkey did not forget to extend its hand with help in this process with access to health care supplies, particularly where serious difficulties were experienced in friendly countries. We sent medical equipment and masks to 82 countries, including 21 NATO countries. Above all, we have been with the TRNC primarily and as a requirement of our brotherhood, we have wholeheartedly mobilised our opportunities for the needs of Turkish Cypriots. Masks, disinfectant, protective clothing and food package support were provided by our Ministry of Health and Red Crescent. We also facilitated the delivery of medical supplies to the TRNC."

Recalling that they sent 3 fire fighting helicopters to respond to forest fires in the TRNC last week, Oktay underlined that they will continue to be with the TRNC and Turkish Cypriot people regardless of the circumstances. He also announced that they had put one of the firefighting helicopters at the nearest point to TRNC against a future new fire risk.

Oktay said that the measures taken against the COVID-19 outbreak has affected the economy of TRNC as well as many other countries. "The epidemic process once again demonstrated the importance of the reforms that should be made in the economy

management of the TRNC."

Oktay said:

"At this time when recovery and normalisation has started in many regions and the tourism season is reopening, I strongly believe that all parts of Northern Cyprus will support the new breakthrough process and will turn this crisis period into an opportunity for the TRNC. When preparing the new normalisation structure, following the effects of the epidemic, Turkey, as in the past, will continue to be with the TRNC.

For the welfare of the Turkish Cypriot people, we are determined to take the necessary steps together seriously and without losing time to bring the TRNC to a sustainable economy. We will continue to carry out new projects shoulder to shoulder by completing concrete projects such as roads, water networks and hospitals, which were launched last year and with previous agreements."

Oktay stated that the agreement they will sign is the concrete engagement of President Erdoğan's support for the Turkish Cypriot people.

Oktay said: "After months of meticulous work the result was the 'ARMA model' as we call 'Turkey-TRNC Infrastructure and Corporate Sector for Financial Collaboration Tool', and together we aim to carry out the project processes in the TRNC more efficiently and thus increase the added value of the projects. Thanks to the 'ARMA Model' that we will implement with the support of the TRNC government, we aim to keep pace with the changing world in the TRNC faster and to gain qualified

projects that will directly contribute to economic growth and development in the TRNC."

Stating that the financial resources will be transferred to TRNC, Oktay said, "With the agreement, we transfer the financial resources amounting to 2 billion 288 million 976 thousand TL in the form of grants and loans. In addition the expenditures of the agreement includes, defense, infrastructure and real sector investments, the Tourism COVID-19 Outbreak Support Program, Rural Development and Social Work Project, Agricultural Investment Support and Agricultural Credit Program, and the Credit Program for Industrialists and Small Tradesmen.

Pointing out that there will be new opportunities for the TRNC economy after the epidemic process, Oktay said, "The Economic and Financial Cooperation Agreement in 2020 will be the rising ground of the TRNC and our brotherhood, which has been prepared strongly for the new normalisation. The post COVID-19 era offers opportunities, opening opportunities and new channels for cooperation in the TRNC. As a result the TRNC will be directed to a strategic breakthrough and with the support of the existing potential in Turkey will be much more clear and bright."

Fuat Oktay expressed his sincere belief that by acting with the awareness of brotherhood, they can make the TRNC more economically sound, prosperous and competitive.

"As long as Turkey and the Turkish Cypriot community is of

one heart, as it has always been, in this region, there can be no other factor to have an effect on our legal system. While we protect our legitimate rights and interests arising from international law in the Eastern Mediterranean, we draw our strength from our unity, solidarity and brotherhood. At this point, we continue our efforts and support on the basis of international legitimacy in seeking solutions to all conflicts that may cause permanent instability in the region."

Stressing that the international community should persuade the Greek Cypriot Administration to fair sharing and dialogue with the Turkish Cypriot side for the solution of the hydrocarbon resources issue in the region, Oktay concluded his speech as follows:

"The solution of the Cyprus issue cannot be overcome without political equality between the parties on the Island. With our belief in the national cause, we will continue the struggle for rights and equity until the legitimate rights of the Turkish Cypriot people have been delivered and our Turkish Cypriot brothers have achieved political equality on the Island. We will continue to do our best as the motherland and guarantor country so that Turkish Cypriots can continue to live in peace, tranquility and prosperity by looking to the future with confidence. Those who think otherwise are doomed to be disappointed, as always."

## I have a Dream of Freedom of Movement

What I mean here is a right to go around the world, to travel and to see the whole world.

I find that humans do not have a right of free travelling. Indeed they can travel freely inside the boundaries of their own country. But does their country represent the whole world? Unfortunately not.

For example I want to go out and see the whole world. There are too many people like me, who dream like I do. However most of us, cannot make our dreams a reality.

The first hindrance is money. Abundance of money is the prime requisite to travel. Not all of us have sufficient financial means to pay for the transportation, to pay for the hotels to stay, and to pay for

the food. So what could be the answer?

The next problem is to get a visa for other countries. The residents of some countries are lucky enough to go and visit other countries without visa, but not all are so lucky. Most of us have been given a long list of documents by the Embassies of a number of countries, to be submitted, as a pre-condition to apply for a visa. Most of us fail to present and get approved all these required documents. Usually Embassies call the visa seeker for personal interview, which frequently comes as a last hindrance which most of us fail to cross.

Looking at the above two basic problems, that stops me and others like me from going and seeing the

world, I believe that these are not too difficult to be sorted out. I understand the reason why different countries exercise visa restrictions, and do find them justified in most of the cases.

But still I believe in a visa free world. I believe that we all can go out and see the whole world. It is not a big issue, and can be solved easily.

Firstly all humans should tour the world just to see it, and not to look for better living and earning. If all humans start thinking this way, the countries would not impose visa conditions, as practically each and every person would be entering into and going out of all the countries in the world.

Secondly, all travellers, who do not have sufficient funds, should travel on foot or by hitchhiking. It is not a big issue. All that we need is fitness, determination and mutual trust.

Thirdly, everyone in the world would make it a point to feed the travellers and provide them with a place to sleep for the night. This

too is not a big problem, because each of us would be providing board and lodging facilities to others, and at the same time we also would be getting the same facility from others.

At the same time I understand that it is almost impossible to fulfill the above three basic conditions. It is impossible for all of us to be honest, trustworthy, cooperative and helpful.

Keeping in mind the fact that all that I had written above is just a dream, and will still remain a dream, I believe that I have a right to go around the world and see the nature. Am I wrong? I believe that I am right, just like John Lennon had imagined. See video link below.

This is very important for those wanting to relocate to UK (and EU) as it takes a minimum 4 months to prepare pets for the UK/EU.



We also have several pets waiting (patiently!) to come into the TRNC and begin their new "life in the sun" - so if you are thinking of bringing your pet here then, again, please get in touch to see what you need to do to make them "TRNC ready"



## BRS Coronavirus News Update 24th May 2020

The British Residents' Society published very important news 24th May 2020 with the latest information provided through their ongoing liaison with the TRNC authorities about the Coronavirus Regulations which we are sharing for other readers who are seeking the latest facts and information.

### UPDATE – 24th MAY 2020

#### GREEN LINE CROSSINGS

During the past few days, we have seen news reports and statements from the administrations in the Republic of Cyprus and the TRNC in respect of reopening the crossings between the South and North.

These statements were made by the respective Presidents, Akinci and Anastadiades, but were followed almost immediately by a statement from Kudret Ozersay, on behalf of the TRNC Government stating that it will be the Government who decide on when the crossings will open, not the two presidents, and that it will depend on the health situation on both sides.

Whilst the TRNC has had no infections for days, the RoC still continue to have new cases, and the Government are uneasy about reopening the crossings until they see a period of no new cases, and with the RoC preparing to reopen its borders to 'tourists' from certain countries some see this as increasing the risks to the TRNC.

#### RESIDENCY

Last Monday the Immigration Department based at the Interior Ministry in Lefkosa, resumed as near a 'normal' level of service as is possible. This will mean that

existing residency visa applications already submitted, will continue to be processed, and appointments will be allocated for applicants to attend the Interior Ministry to finalise the issue of their residency visas, at the appropriate time. The system will operate strictly on an appointment only basis, to comply with all relevant health & safety requirements.

The situation regarding the Immigration Departments at the various regional police stations where all residency visa applications must be submitted in the first instance, is that these will remain closed until further notice.

Further information regarding the re-opening of the Immigration Departments at the regional police stations will be announced once a further decision has been taken.

We were informed that no decision had yet been made and that no-one whose residency had expired or not yet applied for will be penalised.

#### FLIGHTS INTO TRNC

Hopefully, you will have seen the letter that we circulated to our members asking those who were 'stuck' outside of the UK to provide details to be presented to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Kudret Ozersay then made a statement to BRT News stating that those Foreign Nationals with Residency or who owned property in the TRNC would be able to return post 1st June.

We have a meeting planned with the Undersecretary of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs this week to discuss the anomalies that came from Dr. Ozersay's statement.

Those being :

\*\* Persons who have applied for Residency but were unable to return to complete it,

\*\* Persons who have not yet applied for Residency

\*\* Persons who own property but are not in possession of documentation to prove this.

\*\* Persons who do not own but long-term rent.

Once we have answers for these points, we will let you know.

Also, the question of quarantine needs to be resolved although I feel that this will be the 'trade off' for being allowed to return earlier than planned.

#### FACEBOOK GROUP

The group continues to grow in the number of members who have applied to join. We have also received over 200 requests from non-members and lapsed members who wished to join the group. We will be contacting these people and 'guiding' them to clinics, to join once they reopen fully.

We made a commitment when we opened the group that the content will be for information purposes from confirmed sources, and this continues to be the case.

If you are looking for confirmation of certain information, and we do not have an answer to hand please bear in mind that the individuals or ministries that we approach for that confirmation are 'somewhat busy' with other matters at present and we sometimes have to wait for an accurate response.

We will not 'guess' at an answer so please be patient if you have to wait a few hours or a day to get the actual answer to your query.

#### CLINICS

Lambousa market has now reopened and we will be opening our clinic there from Saturday 30th May between 10am until 12noon.

We need to apply to the Girne Beledyesi before we can re-open the HUT, so once that has been authorised, we will inform you all.

Creditwest clinics at Catalkoy and Alsancak will not be able to re-open yet as Banks are restricted to the numbers allowed inside their premises. Once these restriction are lifted we will advise you all.

## St Andrews Church, Kyrenia, News

**Readers mail....  
St Andrew's Church, Kyrenia....**

**Services in St. Andrew's**

Sadly we are still unable to hold services in St. Andrew's because of the restrictions imposed due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

There may be some confusion because of the statement made recently by Deputy Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Kudret Ozersay in which he says:

“mass [i.e. public] worship will be opened in a way that enables the May 24 prayer, and that in other religions mass worship will be possible, but it will be possible within the framework of the rules to be published by the religious affairs department”

The rules published by the Religious Affairs Department can be found on the link shown below.

Although the rules refer specifically to mosques, and in particular the weekend of 23/24 May when the prayer for the end of Ramadan will be held on Sunday 24th, as noted above these rules also apply to other religions.

Some of those requirements are difficult to implement in St. Andrew's at this time, particularly, given the size of the church, the difficulty in maintaining social distancing.

Also the closure of all crossing points from the south of the island means that during this vacancy period clergy are unable to travel to conduct services. However

Steve Bishop continues to produce an ePraise service which means that those who wish to join in will be emailed a full service text including Scripture readings, a (short) talk and prayer suggestions.

The Church Council will continue to keep the matter under review and will advise when St. Andrew's is once more open for public worship.






However; upon investigation, we discovered that whilst their activity room is important to the School, due to its current condition it can only be used for less than quarter of an hour a day, if at all – this is because of the rising damp walls which results in a continual health problem for all those who use the room for any great length of time. Neither or less, this room is used to the delight of these disadvantaged children whenever they can, to see their faces when at play in this room is a joy to behold by anyone who witnesses it. These Special Children are oblivious to their health risks because all they want to do is play!

If this important room was re-decorated or if earth was removed away from around the exterior walls of the room the underlining problem would not go away, just resurface in very quick time.

For this reason our Association, after taking professional advice, has decided that drastic action needs undertaking for the sake and benefit of these Special Children who are less privileged than our own children.

We therefore have undertaken to provide the Mentally Handicapped & Special Needs Children's School in Karakum not only with an ACTIVITY ROOM that is Fit for Purpose and that they can be proud to use whenever they want but also TOILET & WASHROOM FACILITIES so that the Special Children too can have the basic facilities they deserve!

freedom, danced and had a lot of fun.... Exuberance in the positive sense was announced. Liberated musicians finally being allowed to make music in front of an audience again.



## Girne Municipality Open Market precautions for citizens



## University of Kyrenia online seminar

The University of Kyrenia recently organised a seminar regarding drowning and basic life support. Mr. Mehmet Fatih Hüseyinoğlu, the Assoc. Prof. of the Faculty of Maritime Studies of the University, other academicians and students participated in the online seminar.

Acting Dean of the Faculty of Maritime Studies Assoc.Prof. Mehmet Fatih Hüseyinoğlu, academicians and students participated in the online seminar, in which Prof. Dr. Akin Savaş

Toklu from Istanbul University Faculty of Medicine Department of Underwater Medicine and Hyperbaric Medicine participated as a speaker.

Prof. Dr. Akin Savaş Toklu, stated that drowning is a public health problem, He pointed out the stages observed in the cases and different types of drowning.

He further stated that according to the World Health Organization, the number of annual cases is 320,000, drownings are ranked as third in accident-related deaths, and 97%

are seen in the least and moderately developed countries.

Prof. Toklu provided detailed information on different topics covering stages of the drowning process and risk-enhancing items based on his personal experiences and other individuals' experiences. He further noted that 80% of drownings are preventable, and explained particularly the issues of safe rescue techniques and lifeguard, as well as the dissemination of basic life support, which the seminar describes as its purpose.

The online seminar moderated by Gökhan Tarı research assistant at the Faculty of Maritime Studies ended with the question/ answer session of the participants.



## EMU cooperating with TRNC government - Maraş buildings

The Eastern Mediterranean University (EMU) and the Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus (TRNC) Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Foreign Affairs signed a cooperation protocol. The protocol aims for the EMU Engineering Faculty to take inventory and evaluate the earthquake resistance of all the buildings in the closed Maraş region, within the scope of the

Closed Maras Inventory Studies under the responsibility of the Ministry.

According to the information released by EMU the buildings determined by a calibrated scoring system will be processed by EMU Faculty of Engineering, based on GIS evaluation as "demolished", "very bad", "bad", "medium", "good" and "very good". Factors for each building will be evaluated by determining the number of

floors, damage due to time (level of corrosion), whether there are short columns, console working

elements, soft floor, ground conditions, topographic condition, proximity to water mites, etc.


